THE INSTITUTE'S 1. MAIN OBJECTIVES

The Valencian Institute of Economic Research (Instituto Valenciano de Investigaciones Económicas, Ivie) works to promote and conduct economic research and disseminate it in Spain and abroad.

Created in 1990 by the Department of Economy and Finance of the Generalitat Valenciana (Valencian Regional Government), the Ivie is supported by Bankia, Ford Spain, the BBVA Foundation, the Caja Mediterráneo Foundation, the Cañada Blanch Foundation and Funcas (Fundación de las Cajas de Ahorros).

The Ivie has two main aims: to create stable teams of specialists capable of producing a steady output of research in certain areas of general interest; and to help build bridges between research and the decisions made by economic agents. Many of those decisions require careful analysis of the available options, taking research findings, statistical information and the experience of specialists into account. The lvie therefore also offers technical assistance in economic matters to institutions and companies that request it.

To achieve its goals, the Ivie organizes its work in lines of theoretical and applied research, with the support of various shared services. The research activity is carried out by the Institute's research associates, who have extensive academic experience, and its staff of economists and subject specialists.

To carry out its activities and execute its projects, the Ivie has built relationships with large numbers of researchers and has entered into collaboration agreements with various universities. It supports the economic research groups in carrying out and disseminating their activities and promotes the exploitation of their research efforts for the benefit of society.

The Ivie started its activities in November 1990. Throughout this period it has been sponsored by the Valencian Regional Government's Ministry of Finance, which has allowed it to foster economic research. The rest of its activities are financed through partnership agreements and contracts with various public and private sector institutions in Spain, Europe and the Americas.

2.4. Research professors



Francisco Alcalá (Center for Economic Policy Research)

Dr Alcalá is a graduate in Economics with special honors (1980), holds a Master in Economics from CIDE (Center for Research and Teaching in Economics, Mexico, 1983) and has a PhD from the Universitat de València (1985). At present he is Research Fellow at the Center for Economic Policy Research (London). He has been Full Professor at the Economic Analysis Department of the University of Murcia, Visiting Lecturer at the Pompeu Fabra University (Barcelona) and at the CIDE (Mexico) and Visiting Scholar for over a total of six years at the Universities of California (Berkeley), Harvard, New York and Columbia. He has been a member of the Board of Directors of the Spanish Economic Association and economic advisor for social and governmental institutions. His specialist fields are economic growth, international trade and industrial organization, topics on which he has directed several National R&D Plan projects and published articles in some of the most prestigious international academic journals and written a number of books and book chapters. Joaquín Aldás (Universitat de València)

Dr Aldás graduated (1993) and obtained his PhD (1998) in Economics and Business Studies from the Universitat de València, where he is Professor in Marketing and Market Research. He has been Visiting Research Fellow at the University of Glasgow. His main research fields are quantitative methods in marketing research. He has published his research in specialized journals such as European Journal of Marketing, Journal of Services Marketing, Online Information Review, Journal of Business Ethics, Journal of Interactive Marketing and Tourism Management. He is co-author of the books Análisis Multivariante Aplicado (Thomson, 2005) and Análisis Multivariante Aplicado con R (Paraninfo, 2017). Santiago Carbó (Universidad de Granada)

Dr Carbó graduated in Economics from the Universitat de València (1989) and took his PhD in Economics (1993) and Master in Banking and Finance at the University of Wales (1990). He is currently Professor of Economic Analysis at the University of Granada. In addition he is Head of the Financial Studies Division and Executive Director of the Observatory of Financial Digitalisation of the Cajas de Ahorros Foundation (Funcas). He has been Professor of Economics and Finance at CUNEF (University School for Financial Studies, Madrid) and at Bangor University (UK). He is independent advisor for Cecabank and President of its Audit Committee. He is Past-President (2017) of IBEFA (the International Banking, Economics and Finance Association). He was member of the Group of Economic Advisors of ESMA (European Securities and Market Authority) from 2014 to 2018. He has been, and still is, consultant and collaborator for public institutions such as the European Central Bank (ECB) and the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago, as well as to financial institutions and international consulting firms. He is Chief Editor of the Journal of Financial Management, markets and Institutions. He is author of more than two-hundred articles and publications on the financial system, among others, in journals such as The Review of Economics and Statistics, European Economic Review, Review of Finance, Journal of Money, Credit and Banking, Journal of Corporate Finance, Journal of International Money and Finance and Journal of Banking and Finance. He also frequently collaborates with the written press, at present being regular columnist in El País and stating his views in other Spanish national dailies (El Mundo, ABC, Cinco Dias, among others), radio and television (TVE, Cadena SER, Radio Nacional de España, etc.) in Spain, as well as in foreign newspapers (Financial Times, BBC, Business Week, International Herald Tribune, among others). José García-Montalvo (Pompeu Fabra University)

Dr García-Montalvo is Professor of Applied Economics at the Pompeu Fabra University (UPF). He graduated in Economics from the Universitat de València in 1987 with special honors. He received the First National Graduation Prize (1988, Ministry of Education and Science), followed by a PhD in Economics from Harvard University (1993). In 2008 and 2013 he was awarded the ICREA Acadèmia distinction prize for his research work. In 2010 he received the Knowledge Transfer Award of the Board of Trustees of the UPF and in 2013 the Rector of the UPF awarded him the Medal of the Pompeu Fabra University. In 2018 he was awarded the 'Premio Catalunya Economía' and in 2019 the King Jaume I Prize in Economics. He was former Director of the Department of Economics and Business of the UPF and currently is Vice-Rector of Science Strategy at the same university. He is consultant to OECD, World Bank, European Union and Inter-American Development Bank. His research is concentrated on the areas of econometrics, economic development, the labor market for youth and the economy of the housing market. He was Guest Lecturer at the Department of Economics at Harvard (1996) and worked for one year as a researcher in the Technology and Economic Policy Program of the Kennedy School of Government (1995). He has published 17 books and more than 140 articles in American Economic Review, Review of Economics and Statistics, Economic Journal, Journal of Business and Economic Statistics, Journal of Development Economics, Journal of Economic Growth and Applied Psychology, among others. Francisco J. Goerlich (Universitat de València)

Dr Goerlich graduated and obtained a PhD in Economics from the Universitat de València. He also holds a M.Sc. in Economics from the London School of Economics & Political Science (University of London). At present, he is a Professor at the Department of Economic Analysis at the Universitat de València. His research fields are macroeconomics, income distribution, demographics, regional economics and applied econometrics. He is co-author of several books, among which worth mentioning are those for the BBVA Foundation, Una grid de densidad de población para España, Zonas de morfología urbana: Coberturas del suelo y demografía, Cambios en la estructura y localización de la población, Distribución de la renta, crisis económica y políticas redistributivas and Delimitación de áreas rurales y urbanas a nivel local: Demografía, coberturas del suelo y accesibilidad. He has published his work in specialized journals such as Applied Economics, Econometric Theory, Economics Letters, International Journal of Geographical Information Science, Social Indicators Research, Empirical Economics, Regional Studies and Review of Income and Wealth, among others. He has participated in various national and international congresses, both on his own initiative and as a guest. He has taken part in the SPINTAN research project on smart public intangibles funded by the EU 7th Framework Programme. He currently participates in DICTA (Data for European ICT Industries Analysis), a study commissioned by the European Commission's Joint Research Centre, Directorate B. Carmen Herrero (University of Alicante)

Awarded with an honorary degree from the University of Granada, Dr Herrero graduated from the Complutense University of Madrid and obtained her PhD in Mathematics from the Universitat de València. She is Professor Emeritus at the University of Alicante. Her latest research focuses on the application of axiomatic techniques to the analysis of distributive problems, particularly justice and equity issues related to health. She was awarded with the 2017 King Jaume I Prize in Economics. She is Past-President of ASSET (Association of Southern-European Economic Theorists), and of the Spanish Economic Association. She has been Visiting Lecturer at the Universities of Vienna, LUISS Guido Carli (Rome), California (Davis) and Rochester and at the Institute for Economic Analysis (IAE, Barcelona), and Visiting Resident at IMéRA Institute for Advanced Study of Aix-Marseille University (AMU). She has taught courses at the Barcelona Graduate School of Economics, the University of Paris X (Nanterre) and at the Institute of Advanced Studies in Vienna. She has been member of the Council of the Game Theory Society and of ArbolMat ('The Math Tree'), a joint initiative of the Spanish Royal Mathematical Society and Universia. She has also been a member of the Editorial Board of the Social Choice and Welfare review and the Managers Board of the Spanish Science and Technology Foundation. She has also been a consultant to the Scientific Policy Secretary General of the Spanish Ministry of Education and Science, Spanish coordinator of the TMR Network Cooperation and Information (FMRX-CT96-0055), as well as the Spanish representative for the EC Marie Curie Project PMD-CT-2000-00010 Topics on Quantitative Economics. Among her more than 70 articles, recent ones have appeared in European Journal of Operational Research, Applied Energy, Social Indicators Research, Journal of Informetrics, Economics of Education Review, Health Economics, Journal of Health Economics, Journal of Human Development and Capabilities, PLOS ONE and Social Choice and Welfare. Matilde Mas (Universitat de València)

Dr Mas, Director of International Projects of the Ivie, graduated and took a PhD in Economics at the Universitat de València, where she is Professor of Economic Analysis. Currently, she has obtained five six-year periods (sexennials) of research activity and one of knowledge transfer. Her specialized fields are the knowledge economy, analysis of public capital, new technologies and intangible assets. She is currently Director of the DIGITES (Digital Technologies Segment Data) Project commissioned by the European Commission's Joint Research Centre, Directorate B. She has been coordinator of the SPINTAN (Smart Public Intangibles) Project funded by the 7th Framework Programme of the European Union and has participated in other EU projects (EU KLEMS, INDICSER, ICTNET, DICTA and PREDICT). Also, she has been advisor to the LA KLEMS Project for Latin America. She is co-author of 81 books and book chapters, co-editor of Industrial Productivity in Europe. Growth and Crisis (Edward Elgar, 2011) and has published more than 80 articles in specialist journals such as Journal of Productivity Analysis, NBER, Journal of Regional Science, Regional Studies and Review of Income and Wealth, among others. She is member of the Editorial Board of the journal Hacienda Pública Española, member of the Advisory Board of Ekonomiaz and member of the Scientific Board of Cuadernos Económicos of ICE. In 2020 she was awarded by the General Council of Economists of Spain with the Grand Cross of Merit in Service to the Economy. In July of that same year, she was appointed Member of the Advisory Council for Economic Affairs of the Spanish Ministry of Economic Affairs and Digital Transformation. She regularly discusses economic issues in the news media and is member of Cotec's Top 100 Experts. Also, she has been appointed expert advisor to the Economic and Social Council (CES) of Spain. Joaquín Maudos (*Universitat de València and CUNEF*)

Dr Maudos graduated (1989) and obtained his PhD (with special honors) in Economics from the Universitat de València (1995), where he is currently Professor in Economic Analysis. He is also Research Deputy Director of the Ivie and collaborator at the CUNEF. His specialist fields are banking and regional economics. He was Visiting Researcher in 1995-96 at the Florida State University Finance Department, at the College of Business at Bangor University (UK) in 2008-2009, and at the School of Business of the University of Glasgow, in addition to being consultant to the European Commission, the European Investment Bank and the United Nations. He has jointly published 30 books and 140 articles in specialized journals, both national and international (Annals of Regional Science, Growth and Change, Economics Letters, Entrepreneurship and Regional Development, International Journal of Transport Economics, Journal of Banking and Finance, Journal of Business Economics and Management, Journal of Comparative Economics, Journal of Financial Services Research, Journal of International Financial Markets, Institutions and Money, Journal of International Money and Finance, Regional Studies, Review of Income and Wealth and Transportation Research, among others), and has also taken part in various joint works. He is Director of competitive projects (Spanish Ministry of Education and Science, BBVA Foundation, etc.), as well as of projects with firms and government agencies. José Manuel Pastor (Universitat de València)

Dr Pastor graduated in Economics in 1990 and received his PhD with special honors from the Universitat de València in 1996, where he is Professor of Economic Analysis. Former Vice-Dean for Internships, Business and Economy Relations and Vice-Dean for Communication and Business Relations at the Universitat de València, where he is currently Dean of the Faculty of Economics. He is consultant for the Children and Youth Observatory (València City Council) and member of the cross-departmental committee of Valencia's Youth Programme and of the Board of Administration of Universitat de València's Language Center. He is also member of the Chair of Business Culture and of the General Foundation of the Universitat de València. In addition he is Director of the Chair for a Sustainable Economic Model of València and its Surroundings sponsored by València City Council. His fields of research are economics of education, regional economics and banking. He has been a visiting researcher at Florida State University (USA) and at the College of Business, Law, Education and Social Sciences of Bangor University (UK), as well as an external consultant to the World Bank. He has published more than 50 books in collaboration and 75 articles in specialized journals (Journal of International Financial Markets, Institutions and Money, Regional Studies, Scientometrics, Transportation, etc.). He has been the main researcher of various competitive projects, as well as of projects with firms, government agencies, and several European projects within the 7th Framework Program of the EU. José María Peiró (Universitat de València)

Dr José María Peiró graduated (1975) and took his PhD (1977) in Philosophy and the Arts at the Universitat de València. He also graduated in Psychology at the Complutense University of Madrid (1976). He was awarded with an honorary degree from Maastricht University (2020), Miguel Hernández University (2017) and Universidade Metodista de São Paulo (2010). He was Professor of Organizational and Social Psychology at the Universitat de València until September 2020. Currently, he is Professor Emeritus at the Universitat de València, as well as Research Professor at the Ivie. He was Past-President of the International Association of Applied Psychology and former Director of the Research Institute of Psychology of Human Resources of Organizational Development and Quality of Working Life. He was awarded by Psicofundación with the 2016 José Luis Pinillos Prize for Excellency and Innovation in Psychology "Psychologist of the Year". He was awarded the 2015 Aristotle Prize by the European Federation of Psychologists' Associations (EFPA), honored with the European Association of Work and Organizational Psychologists (EAWOP) Lifetime Contribution Award for his scientific and professional career (2013), granted the Advanced International Research Service and Fukuhara Award of the International Council of Psychologists (ICP) (2013) and received the Gold Medal from the General Council for Industrial Relations and Work Sciences (2010). He was director of the PhD Program of Human Resources and coordinator of the European Master Erasmus Mundus of Work, Organizational and Personnel Psychology of the Universitat de València. He was Director of the Observatory for Employment Access and Vocational Guidance of the Universitat de València (2003-2009). Author of more than 50 books and book chapters and 200 articles published in Computers in Human Behavior, European Journal of Work and Organizational Psychology, International Journal of Hospitality Management, Journal of Applied Psychology, Journal of Occupational Health Psychology, Social Science & Medicine and Work & Stress, among others. His research fields are transition of youth to the labor market, the prevention of psychosocial risks, human and social capital, quality of service, climate and culture in organizations, work teams, psychosocial aspects of ICT, management and development of the human resources. Francisco Pérez (*Universitat de València*)

Dr Pérez graduated (1973, with special honors and National Graduation Award) and obtained his PhD in Economics at the Universitat de València (1977). He has been Professor of Economic Analysis at the Universitat de València (1986-2020) and is currently Professor Emeritus at the same university and Research Director of the Ivie (since 1990). He has carried out and directed various studies on economic growth and international integration, competitiveness, regional economics, public finance, economics of education (mainly associated with universities and their results). He is author or co-author of 85 books and over 200 book chapters and articles in international and Spanish specialized journals. He has obtained six research sexennials and his research has been quoted more than 5,800 times, reaching an H-index of 36. He has directed ten PhD theses and has participated in over one hundred research projects for public and private institutions. He is a regular lecturer at many institutions and has participated in scientific meetings at over 50 different universities and research centers in Spain, Europe and North and South America. He is member of the Spanish Economic Association, the Spanish Association of Regional Science, the Wolpertinger Club, the European Economic Association as well as member of the boards of trustees and scientific councils of various institutions and foundations dedicated to promoting research and its diffusion. He is Eisenhower Fellow USA since 1998. In 2010 he was awarded the 8th Societat Catalana d'Economia Prize and in 2016 he received the Francesc de Vinatea distinction, the highest recognition from the Valencian Parliament. Javier Quesada (Universitat de València)

Dr Quesada graduated in Economics from the Universitat de València and took his PhD in Economics at the University of Cincinnati (Ohio). He is currently a Professor of Economic Analysis at the Universitat de València. He was Director General of the Economy (1995-98) and Director of the Science and Technology Office of the Valencian Regional Government (1999-2003). His fields of research are financial and monetary economics, economic growth, new technologies, intangible assets and retention and attraction of talent. He has jointly published 13 books — Infraestructuras, inversión privada e intangibles (CAM, 2009), BBVA Foundation-Ivie Reports on Growth and Competitiveness (2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014), Activos intangibles: Una inversión necesaria para el crecimiento económico en España (Ariel and Telefónica Foundation 2014), among others— and articles in E. Gardener et al. (eds.) Banking in the New Europe (Palgrave Macmillan 2003), in J.R. Cuadrado (ed.) Regional policy, economic growth and convergence: Lessons from the Spanish case (Springer 2009) and in F. Fiordelisi et al. (eds.) New Issues in Financial and Credit Markets (Palgrave Macmillan, 2010), as well as in specialized journals such as Applied Economics, European Journal of Finance, European Journal of Operational Research, Journal of International Financial Markets and Institutions and Money. He was Visiting Scholar at Harvard University (1985-86). He is General Director of the Valencian Foundation for Advanced Studies, Executive President of the King Jaume I Awards, member of the European Academy of Science and Arts and member of the advisory council of the Príncipe Felipe Science Museum. José Ramos (Universitat de València)

Dr Ramos graduated (1988) and obtained his PhD in Psychology (1993) from the Universitat de València where he is currently Professor in Organizational Psychology. He is also member of IDOCAL (Research Institute of Personnel Psychology, Organizational Development and Quality of Working Life). From 2006 to 2012, he was Dean of the Faculty of Psychology and member of the Executive Committee of the European Association of Work and Organizational Psychologists (EAWOP) from 2015 to 2019. He is coordinator of the National Referee Committee that awards the European Qualification for Psychologists (Europsy) of the European Federation of Psychologists Associations (EFPA). His specialist fields are the organizational climate and the psychological contract, analysis of managerial work, service quality, occupational stress, and employment, unemployment, psychological well-being and barriers to women's access to management positions. He has directed National R&D Plan projects and has also taken part in projects for the European Union. He has attended numerous national and international congresses, and has published over fifty works in national and international journals such as Applied Psychology: An International Review, European Journal of Work and Organizational Psychology, International Journal of Stress Management, Psychological Reports, Psicothema, Total Quality Management & Business Excellence, Stress & Health and Work & Stress. He has directed 10 PhD theses and is coauthor of 20 books and book chapters, among which worth mentioning are Productividad y gestión de recursos humanos en las Administraciones Públicas (Funcas, 2010), Psicología de las Organizaciones (Editorial Síntesis, 2015) and Creativity and Innovation in Organizations: Current Research and Recent Trends in Management (Routledge, 2017).



Ernest Reig (Universitat de València)

Dr Reig graduated and obtained his PhD in Economics from the Universitat de València, where he is Professor of Applied Economics. He is specialized in regional and agricultural economics and in the analysis of efficiency and productivity. At present, he is studying the calculation of sustainability indexes and eco-efficiency. He has published several books and reports, among them La multifuncionalidad de la agricultura en España (Ministry of Agriculture-EUDEMA 2007), La sostenibilidad del crecimiento económico en España (Funcas 2011), La sostenibilidad de la agricultura en España (Cajamar 2013), Delimitación de áreas rurales y urbanas a nivel local: Demografía, coberturas del suelo y accesibilidad (BBVA Foundation 2016) and Las áreas urbanas funcionales en España. Economía y calidad de vida (BBVA Foundation 2020). He is author of over 40 articles in various specialized journals such as Agricultural Economics, Applied Economics, Economic Modelling, Environmental and Resources Economics, Investigaciones Económicas, Journal of Productivity Analysis, Land Use Policy, Resource and Energy Economics, Revista de Economía Aplicada and Social Indicators Research. He was Research Scholar at the London School of Economics (1983-84), Director of the Instituto Valenciano de Economía (1986-1991) and Director General of the Economy of the Valencian Regional Government (1991-95). He has been main researcher of several National R&D Plan projects, the most recent one titled Indicadores sintéticos de sostenibilidad para la mejora de la gobernanza del sector agrario (AGL2010-17560-C02-02). Lorenzo Serrano (Universitat de València)

Dr Serrano is Professor at the Universitat de València where he graduated in Economics in 1991 (with special honors) and received his PhD in 1998 (with special honors). He also obtained a degree in Monetary Economics at the Centre of Financial and Monetary Studies in Madrid (1993). His work covers topics such as growth, human capital and regional economics. He has had scholarships from the Bank of Spain (1991-1993) and the Council of Education of the Valencian Regional Government (2001). 

INSTITUTIONAL 5. **INFORMATION**

The Ivie has had the institutional structure of a public limited company since it was established. Although considered a public firm during its first few years, the Ivie has been a mercantile company subject to private law following the incorporation of its shareholders in 1995.

Throughout the years, the Ivie has always complied with current legislation so as to ensure the good of the public and private resources entrusted by different institutions for the development of its activities. In addition, the **Ivie** provides the required accounting information in the Mercantile Register.

The Ivie is annually controlled by independent auditors with the aim of receiving opinions regarding the quality of the financial data which the Administration Board develops.

In 2011, the Ivie created the Ivie Foundation of the Valencian Community to increase the development of economic research and education activities of general interest and to strengthen the collaboration with other institutions in this area. Since 2013, the Ivie is a research center associated to the Universitat de València, registered in the Spanish Registry of Universities, Centres and Qualifications (RUCT).



INFORME DE AUDITORÍA DE CUENTAS ANUALES ABREVIADAS EMITIDO POR UN AUDITOR INDEPENDIENTE

Opinión

Hemos auditado las cuentas anuales abreviadas del Instituto Valenciano de Investigaciones Económicas, S.A. (la Sociedad), que comprenden el balance abreviado a 31 de diciembre de 2020, la cuenta de pérdidas y ganancias abreviada, el estado abreviado de cambios en el patrimonio neto y la memoria abreviada correspondientes al ejercicio terminado en dicha fecha.

En nuestra opinión, las cuentas anuales abreviadas adjuntas expresan, en todos los aspectos significativos, la imagen fiel del patrimonio y de la situación financiera de la Sociedad a 31 de diciembre de 2020, así como de sus resultados correspondientes al ejercicio terminado en dicha fecha, de conformidad con el marco normativo de información financiera que resulta de aplicación (que se identifica en la nota 2 de la memoria abreviada) y, en particular, con los principios y criterios contables contenidos en el mismo.

Fundamento de la opinión

Hemos llevado a cabo nuestra auditoría de conformidad con la normativa reguladora de la actividad de auditoría de cuentas vigente en España. Nuestras responsabilidades de acuerdo con dichas normas se describen más adelante en la sección *Responsabilidades del auditor en relación con la auditoría de las cuentas anuales abreviadas* de nuestro informe.

Somos independientes de la Sociedad de conformidad con los requerimientos de ética, incluidos los de independencia, que son aplicables a nuestra auditoría de las cuentas anuales abreviadas en España según lo exigido por la normativa reguladora de la actividad de auditoría de cuentas. En este sentido, no hemos prestado servicios distintos a los de la auditoría de cuentas ni han concurrido situaciones o circunstancias que, de acuerdo con lo establecido en la citada normativa reguladora, hayan afectado a la necesaria independencia de modo que se haya visto comprometida.

Consideramos que la evidencia de auditoría que hemos obtenido proporciona una base suficiente y adecuada para nuestra opinión.

Aspectos más relevantes de la auditoría

Los aspectos más relevantes de la auditoría son aquellos que, según nuestro juicio profesional, han sido considerados como los riesgos de incorrección material más significativos en nuestra auditoría de las cuentas anuales abreviadas del período actual. Estos riesgos han sido tratados en el contexto de nuestra auditoría de las cuentas anuales abreviadas en su conjunto, y en la formación de nuestra opinión sobre éstas, y no expresamos una opinión por separado sobre esos riesgos.





Reconocimiento de ingresos

Descripción El importe de la cifra de negocios corresponde a los ingresos por prestaciones de servicios en concepto de proyectos de investigación económica a escala nacional e internacional, cuya duración, en determinados casos, puede ser superior al ejercicio. El reconocimiento de ingresos y los resultados de estos proyectos requiere, por tanto, un elevado grado de juicio y control de las estimaciones realizadas y de las desviaciones que se pudieran producir a lo largo de la duración de los mismos. Las estimaciones tienen en cuenta todos los ingresos y costes relacionados con los proyectos. Debido a la incertidumbre asociada a las citadas estimaciones y a que cambios en las mismas podrían dar lugar a diferencias en los ingresos registrados, se ha considerado este asunto como un aspecto relevante de la auditoría.

Nuestra respuesta

Nuestros procedimientos de auditoría han consistido en evaluar los procedimientos y criterios empleados por la Sociedad para el reconocimiento de los ingresos y costes asociados a los proyectos. Seleccionamos una muestra representativa de los proyectos para evaluar las estimaciones más significativas llevadas a cabo en el reconocimiento de ingresos. Asimismo, hemos obtenido confirmaciones externas para una muestra de clientes pendientes de cobro y realizando, en su caso, procedimientos de comprobación alternativos mediante justificantes de cobro posteriores o documentación soporte justificativa de la prestación del servicio. Por último, hemos evaluado la idoneidad de la información revelada en las cuentas anuales abreviadas de acuerdo con los requerimientos del marco normativo de información financiera.

Otras cuestiones

Las cuentas anuales abreviadas de la Entidad correspondientes al ejercicio finalizado el 31 de diciembre de 2019 fueron auditadas por otro auditor que expresó una opinión favorable sobre las mismas el 27 de marzo de 2020.

Responsabilidad de los administradores en relación con las cuentas anuales abreviadas

Los administradores son responsables de formular las cuentas anuales abreviadas adjuntas, de forma que expresen la imagen fiel del patrimonio, de la situación financiera y de los resultados de la Sociedad, de conformidad con el marco normativo de información financiera aplicable a la Entidad en España, y del control interno que consideren necesario para permitir la preparación de cuentas anuales abreviadas libres de incorrección material, debida a fraude o error.

En la preparación de las cuentas anuales abreviadas, los administradores son responsables de la valoración de la capacidad de la Sociedad para continuar como empresa en funcionamiento, revelando, según corresponda, las cuestiones relacionadas con la empresa en funcionamiento y utilizando el principio contable de empresa en funcionamiento excepto si los administradores tienen la intención de liquidar la Sociedad o de cesar sus operaciones, o bien no exista otra alternativa realista.





Responsabilidades del auditor en relación con la auditoría de las cuentas anuales abreviadas

Nuestros objetivos son obtener una seguridad razonable de que las cuentas anuales abreviadas en su conjunto están libres de incorrección material, debida a fraude o error, y emitir un informe de auditoría que contiene nuestra opinión. Seguridad razonable es un alto grado de seguridad pero no garantiza que una auditoría realizada de conformidad con la normativa reguladora de la actividad de auditoría de cuentas vigente en España siempre detecte una incorrección material cuando existe. Las incorrecciones pueden deberse a fraude o error y se consideran materiales si, individualmente o de forma agregada, puede preverse razonablemente que influyan en las decisiones económicas que los usuarios toman basándose en las cuentas anuales abreviadas.

Como parte de una auditoría de conformidad con la normativa reguladora de la actividad de auditoría de cuentas vigente en España, aplicamos nuestro juicio profesional y mantenemos una actitud de escepticismo profesional durante toda la auditoría. También:

- Identificamos y valoramos los riesgos de incorrección material en las cuentas anuales abreviadas, debida a fraude o error, diseñamos y aplicamos procedimientos de auditoría para responder a dichos riesgos y obtenemos evidencia de auditoría suficiente y adecuada para proporcionar una base para nuestra opinión. El riesgo de no detectar una incorrección material debida a fraude es más elevado que en el caso de una incorrección material debida a error, ya que el fraude puede implicar colusión, falsificación, omisiones deliberadas, manifestaciones intencionadamente erróneas, o la elusión del control interno.

6. PUBLICATIONS

One of the Institute's aims is to foster the dissemination of quality economic research. Since it was founded, the **Ivie** has been publishing two series of working papers which are first submitted to an evaluation process, where highly qualified anonymous referees evaluate the papers before they are accepted for publication. 





During 2020 the following studies were carried out under this Program:

Productive capital stock and investment in Spain and its autonomous communities and regions (1964-2018) (2019-2020)

New update of the capital stock and investment series for Spain that is revised annually. This database, developed jointly with the BBVA Foundation, includes data up to 2018. This edition

analyzes the evolution of public investment and capital stock at national level since the onset of the crisis. Although the sharp decline in public investment has significantly reduced public deficit, it has also reduced infrastructure stock and increased its aging. The study analyzes to which extent public infrastructure services have been adequately provided according to the evolution of their demand, as well as the consequences that a long-continued severe adjustment of investments would have during the next decade. Based on this information, the project carries out an in-depth analysis of public capital stock and investment in Spain and its effect on deficit reduction.

Household equipment and capital stock in the 21st century (2019-2020)

This project aims to construct an investment and capital stock database of Spanish household equipment for the 21st century for each of the autonomous regions of Spain. Based on the database, the monograph will analyze the following aspects of household equipment:

- Historical evolution in household equipment (based on indicators available since the mid-20th century) in terms of penetration of major household appliances and transport goods.
- Evolution in household digital equipment, differentiating between main goods and comparing their penetration rates with non-digital goods.
- Breakdown and valuation of household equipment assets for the period 2000-2017.
- Equipment differences according to household socio-economic status.
- Determinants of household equipment by autonomous region.

Socioeconomic determinants of educational results and cognitive skills in Spain. Opportunities for personal development and productive use (2020-)

The exceptional situation experienced to stop the spread of COVID-19 through social distancing and confinement measures has required an effort in the use of digitalization to avoid a complete interruption of the learning process in schools. But it has also revealed inequality gaps in the access to education, as attendance at educational centers, at all levels, has been disrupted and virtual learning options have been much more intensely implemented. In this situation, the level of digital equipment in homes -large but unequal among families of different levels of income and education- has proved decisive for taking advantage of these alternatives. The "digital qualification" of family members and the capacity of schools and teachers to offer tools and support for distance-learning is another relevant issue that is influenced by regional policies and the type of ownership of schools.

This project takes an in-depth look at the socioeconomic determinants of educational results and cognitive skills and analyzes their consequences for opportunities for personal development and productive use of knowledge. The research is proposed bearing in mind three coordinates: the acceleration of the processes of knowledge accumulation, the digital transformation, and the risk of generating digital gaps.

As a result of this work, each year U-Ranking is published, based on the analysis of the teaching, research and innovation and technological development activities of the universities. The 2020 edition includes a detailed study of graduate employability and labor market results by areas of study and university.

Activities related to the economic impact of aging (2019-2020)

The term "ageingnomics" refers to the economic impact of longevity. An aging population poses challenges for the welfare state in its current form, but also offers opportunities for the development of specific economic activities and also for the growth of regions featured by a greater incidence of aging or especially attractive to the elderly.

This monograph will analyze these issues, in particular considering the following:

 Characteristics of older households: size, habitat, income (salaries and pensions), wealth, education level, equipment, time use.

- Consumption and expenditure breakdown for older households by age group (55-64, 65-74 and 75 years and older), per person and by consumption-equivalent unit.
- Private consumption by older individuals: direct and indirect impact on aggregate income and employment and main sectoral and occupational effects.
- Revenue and employment impact of public spending on services for the older population.
- Intensity of demand for public health and social protection services by the older population.

Analysis of material flows and natural capital stock (2020-)

This report includes a new objective for the BBVA Foundation-**Nie** Research Program: to establish bridges between, first, the extensive information and analysis accumulated by the Program on the evolution of human and material assets on which income generation and welfare are based, and, second, the stocks and flows that reflect the relationship between human activities and nature. The speed with which natural resources are currently being depleted, and the impact that human activities have on the environment, such as water and soil pollution, deforestation, erosion, atmospheric emissions, etc., are damaging the capacity of nature to regenerate. For this reason, the need to reduce the negative environmental impacts derived from the massive use of natural resources and to economize their use has been stressed for years, especially within the European Union

The aim of this report is to provide data that allows to analyze the relationship between the behaviour of the Spanish economy and the use of the resources that it demands from the natural environment. For this purpose, work will be done in two directions: the analysis of material flows and the construction of a monetary valuation of the stock of natural capital that complements those that have been developed for years through the BBVA Foundation-lvie collaboration regarding the stock of public, private and human capital.

Consumer behavior after COVID-19 (2020-)

The end of the current crisis caused by the COVID-19 pandemic is yet unknown, thus, making it difficult to have an overview of how it is changing and will further change consumer behavior. However, some of the questions that this document seeks to answer are: How are consumers responding to the situation created by the pandemic? Will the changes that are taking place in the way consumers purchase products and services remain? How are changes in consumer behavior affecting some critical sectors that have been severely affected by the pandemic, such as retail trade or tourism? How are these sectors adapting to changes in consumer behavior in a context of social distancing, are they changing the design of their services or are they making them more accessible?

The methodology will combine a conceptual and an empirical approach, focusing mainly on Spain, although a comparative analyses will be carried out when necessary based on statistics from sources such as, the European Union or the World Tourism Organization (UNWTO), among others.

Spanish National Health System: spending, decentralization and quality (2020-)

The COVID-19 crisis has put the health system under extraordinary stress, raising questions on the amount of equipment and supplies available, as well as the organization of health and social care to meet the needs of hospitalization and intensive care units and their capacity to face emergencies of this dimension. In this context, the objectives of this project are, first, to analyze the determinants of the trajectory of healthcare spending in Spain during the recent decades. Second, to analyze the differences in health expenditure regarding primary care, specialized care, pharmacy, etc. among regions, and within the health areas of each region. And third, to study the causes and effects of regional differences on the quality of the services offered and the equality of access to them. In these three areas, the study will assess the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, particularly with regard to the capacity of the health system to resist strong stress situations resulting from specific increases in the demand for services.

IVIELAB (LABORATORY FOR THE ANALYSIS AND EVALUATION OF PUBLIC POLICY) RESEARCH PROGRAM

In 2018, the **Ivie**, in collaboration with the Valencian Regional Governemt, started the Laboratory for the Analysis and Evaluation of Public Policy (IvieLAB) to study the action of governments and government agencies in different areas. IvieLAB serves to promote a debate, design of new methodologies and development of tools (such as databases and indicators) to foster knowledge and awareness of the state of public policy in Spain. In 2020, through the IvieLAB program, various seminars and conferences were held, methodological working papers were produced, and eight reports on diverse subjects were prepared, as detailed below.

Economic impact of the development of AI (artificial intelligence) in the Valencian Community: Scenario analysis (2020)

The objective of the report is to study the economic impact of AI (artificial intelligence) in the Valencian Community by means of two different approaches. The first procedure is carried out through the elaboration of a Delphi study in which a group of experts of the Valencian AI ecosystem evaluate the possible impact of AI on the Valencian productive sectors. Through this technique, the objective is to identify the scenarios that, according to the experts, are most likely to emerge in the future in relation to the implementation of AI in the Valencian Community, as well as the main obstacles to overcome and top policies needed. This technique is based on a constant, anonymous interaction by the experts through a structured questionnaire in which they transmit information and knowledge in order to reasonably predict future trends.

In second place, given the absence of indicators that allow to approximate the implementation of artificial intelligence in firms, the development of a methodology is necessary to identify the firms in the Valencian Community that specialize in artificial intelligence. The creation of an indicator is proposed to measure the number of firms, turnover, financial structure, etc., of companies in the Valencian Community with AI as their main activity. The SABI database will be used to obtain economic and financial information on firms. In addtion, a dictionary of related terms will have to be created to facilitate the search, as well as semantic search algorithms to perform the search. The data obtained will allow to study AI firms in the Valencian Community by analyzing their characteristics and comparing them with the rest of Spain.

Economic impact of the health emergency crisis (COVID-19) (2020)

The consequences of the emergency health crisis caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and the measures taken by the Government of Spain in declaring the state of emergency to protect the

population's health and safety, contain the spread and sustain the public health system are evident in both the Spanish and Valencian economy, while future impacts are also expected. Therefore, detailed studies of the impact of the COVID-19 crisis are necessary in the following areas: employment and GDP, business activity and viability, measures to support the productive fabric and people, the importance of technological opportunities and the effects on inequality. To carry out these analyses, the **Ivie** has formed a multidisciplinary group of experts to support the Presidency Office of the Valencian Regional Government through the development of several research lines.

On the one hand, the **Ivie** prepares brief documents with rigorous data on each of the topics that are relevant to diagnose problems and to guide in the design of public policies in a timely manner. On the other hand, the group of experts works on defining methodologies and data systems that help analyze and interpret information obtained from various sources. In addition, the **Ivie** strives to respond to people's concerns in the face of these uncertain and unprecedented circumstances by means of periodic short documents aimed at society in general.

The Valencian Community's audiovisual industry in the regional context (2020)

This report offers an update of the information available in the IvieLAB report: "Evaluation of Economic contribution of the Valencian Community's audiovisual industry".

The report reveals the significant weaknesses of the audiovisual industry in the Valencian Community, with low productivity levels that restrain it from reaching higher profitability levels. The reduced average size of its firms may be a consequence of the sector's low competitiveness. The fact that it suffered from the 2008 crisis to a higher degree than the national industry explains why it lost relative weight in the national total. Thus, its levels are currently much smaller, both in terms of income and employment, than before the 2008 crisis with half the sales volume and 25% less employment.

Overcoming the COVID-19 crisis in the Valencian Community (2020)

The health emergency crisis caused by COVID-19 has affected most countries worldwide, including Spain and the Valencian Community, forcing them into quarantine and virtually shutting down economic activity. After two months of restrictions, now is the time to assess the impact on people, society and the economy in order to repair the damages and face the road to recovery. In this regard, the Valencian Regional Government has requested from the **Ivie** a report on the COVID-19 crisis that will serve as a basis to design a recovery strategy for the region.

The rebuilding strategy aims not only to obtain a fast recovery of the pre-crisis wellbeing levels, but also to reduce the weaknesses the Valencian Community had in comparison to the country as a whole prior to the outbreak of the pandemic, for example, 12% less GDP per capita than the national average.

The report includes a roadmap that considers three time horizons. In the short term, the main objective is to save lives by flattening the contagion curve, maintain employment and the productive fabric, protect the income level of those most affected by the crisis and the Valencian public administration's ability to pay. In the medium term, income must be generated and public debt should not reach unsustainable levels. In order to achieve these goals, it is necessary to increase firm competitiveness by including knowledge which, in turn, improves productivity. In addition, steps need to be taken to protect the overall health system and the elderly in nursing homes and to adapt the education system to the limitations imposed by the risk of infection.

Finally, in the long run, the report highlights actions that can be taken in the private sphere to boost R&D investment and promote firm growth and professionalization, while taking advantage of the opportunities presented by the "new normal". In the public sphere, the document proposes actions aimed at modernizing the public administration system, streamlining the regulatory framework, strengthening public investment and eliminating the financial discrimination against the Valencian Community.

This report analyzes the trajectory of Madrid as Spain's capital city and how this status has influenced its economic dynamism. The research shows how the State public sector and Madrid's Regional Government have contributed with their policies to the continuous increase of its population, income and wealth, strengthening the powerful mechanisms of agglomeration generated by private activity.

The report is divided in six chapters. The first four chapters focus on Madrid's present-day economy, the bases of its dynamism as an international center of knowledge-intensive activities and of highly qualified occupations, and its power to attract human capital, firms and population. While, the last two chapters analyze the role played in the capital's current dynamics by the State public sector, through the large number of public decision-making institutions and public sector employees located in Madrid, and by Madrid's Regional Governemt, through its tax reduction policies.

Observatory on the productive specialization and productivity level of the Valencian Community in the regional context (2020)

The objective of this observatory is to analyze the productive specialization and the productivity level of the Valencian economy within the regional context, offering data at a high level of disaggregation (62 productive branches). The observatory will include, in addition to a system of indicators, a descriptive card for each of the 62 productive branches containing information on the position of the Valencian Community in relation to the rest of the Spanish regions (and the national aggregate) for the following variables:

- 1. Relative weight of the productive branch in total Gross Value Added (GVA) and employment of each region;
- 2. Specialization index of each Spanish region in relation to Spain (GVA and employment);
- 3. Percentage distribution of GVA/employment in Spain by region;
- 4. Productivity per employed person of each regional and comparison with the national average;
- 5. Average size of each firm (in terms of GVA and employment).

The system of indicators/data cards allows to identify the productive branches in which the Valencian Community is more/less specialized and has a greater/lesser productivity level, in order to quantify the potential increase in the GVA of the Valencian economy associated with: a) productivity gain; b) changes in productive specialization.

The report will be based on data from 2018 published by the Spanish National Statistics Institute (INE) in June 2020.

The quality of employment generated and wages in the Valencian Community (2020)

This report aims to assess the characteristics of employment generated in the Valencian Community. The employed population has increased steadily from 1.75 million at the beginning of 2014 to more than 2.1 million at the end of 2019. Nevertheless, although the maximum employment figures recorded at the start of 2008 (2.26 million) have not yet been reached; the accumulated increase over the last five years has been important. However, a proper assessment of the Valencian Community's labor market performance requires, in addition to quantitative data (number of employed persons), an analysis of the quality of employment.

Therefore, this report will analyze the relevant characteristics of employment, such as, salary, contract (indefinite, temporary or self-employment), schedule (full- or part-time), occupation, etc., all of which affect the quality and attractiveness of employment in terms of remuneration, stability and desirability. The degree of adjustment of the jobs carried out with respect to the characteristics of the people employed will also be considered (correspondence between educational level and job requirements; schedule preference in the case of part-time employment, etc.). In addition, the report will analyze data on specific groups of particular interest (young people, over 54 years of age, women, etc.). The study will be developed with the use of statistical information from various sources that offer labor market data at regional level, such as microdata from the Labour Force Survey and the Wage Structure Survey.

Although the study will focus on the aggregate behavior of the Valencian Community during the period 2014-2019, it will also include a comparison at national level and with data from benchmark regions. Finally, the study will include a chapter on the effects of COVID-19 on employment and job quality.

Impact of digitalization on the future of employment in the Valencian Community (2020)

First, the report will carry out an analysis of the labor market in the Valencian Community, paying special attention to digitalization and related jobs and educational training. Second, it will analyze the labor risks associated with automation and employment prospects in the Valencian Community.

Given the information available at regional level, to empirically assess the impact of automation in the workplace, jobs are valued according to their estimated risk of automation, previously assessed by international specialists in Machine Learning techniques. These risks will be evaluated taking into account the socio-demographic characteristics of employees (gender, age, nationality, educational level, field of study, continuous training), as well as employment characteristics

(employment or unemployment, length of service in the company, tele-work, employment situation, sector of activity, size of company, occupational groups, salary level).

Based on these results, the influence of the Valencian productive and occupational structure on the risks and opportunities (creation/transformation) that digitalization presents will be evaluated from an aggregate perspective, in comparison with the national average and with other developed regions.

Talent attraction and retention capacity of Spanish autonomous communities (2020)

This study has two main objectives: to update the Talent Index for Spain and its regions (INSEAD Talent Competitiveness Index) provided in the study published by the Cotec Foundation "Mapa del talento en España 2019. Cómo lo generan, atraen y retienen las comunidades autónomas"; and to offer an alternative indicator to measure the talent attraction and retention capacity of the Spanish regions (Cotec-Ivie Talent Index). Although both indicators use the methodology proposed by INSEAD as reference, they are based on different indicators and variables.

The two main reasons that led to the revision of the INSEAD indicator are: first, the original index was designed to compare a very large number of countries, with different degrees of development, that largely conditioned the selection of the variables analyzed; and, second, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the order of priorities in multiple dimensions changed, now focusing more on variables related to health and the environment, digitalization and resilience of companies and workers, all of which are contemplated in the new indicator.

Economic impact of the 39th Valencia Trinidad Alfonso Marathon Race (2019-2020)

The objective of this study, commissioned by the Sports Club Correcaminos of Valencia —in coordination with Trinidad Alfonso Foundation and Valencia's Sports Foundation— is to (i) quantify the economic impact of the celebration of the 39th Valencia Trinidad Alfonso EDP Marathon, which took place in 2019, in terms of production, income (value added) and employment of the Valencian economy; and (ii) to analyze the runners' satisfaction with this sport event. In relation to the first aim, the expenditure required to host the event as well as the tourist expenditure made by the participants during their stay in Valencia have been estimated. Once the full direct costs associated to the marathon are computed, the overall impact is estimated using the input-output methodology. With respect to the second objective of the study, fieldwork was carried out, including a satisfaction survey of runners who took part in the race.

Economic impact of the Trinidad Alfonso Foundation's program to support sports competitions in the Valencian Community. Fourth edition (2019-2020)

The Trinidad Alfonso Foundation has presented the rules governing its Competition Support Program, which is aimed at promoting and supporting the organization of official sports competitions in the Valencian Community. To be eligible for support, sports events must be official competitions (national or international), and funding recipients must be Spanish federations or universities that organize official sports competitions hosted in the region. In addition to raising the national and international profile of the Valencian Community, the aim is to encourage wealth creation in the regional economy, given that it is the spending by participants from outside the region that is most significant when it comes to generating economic impacts.

In this context, the study estimates the economic impact in terms of income (GDP) and employment associated with the Competition Support Program, taking into consideration all the competitions that will be funded during the period covered by the program. The estimated impacts are generated both by tourist spending (by participants from outside the Valencian Community) and expenditure on the organization of events. Two reports have already been carried out and a third is being developed on the economic impact of the competitions held between 1 July 2019 and 30 June 2020. As in other economic impact studies, an input-output model will be used, and the corresponding table will be constructed for the Valencian Community.

Economic impact of Feria Valencia (Valencia Trade Fair) during 2019 and main characteristics of its exhibitors (2020)

This study offers an update of the previous economic impact reports carried out by the **Ivie** with 2019 data. This edition will analyze the information in three different areas. The Spanish food and agriculture sector in the European context. 2019 Report (2020)

The third report on the Spanish food and agriculture sector in the European context (*Observatorio sobre el sector agroalimentario español en el contexto europeo. Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory (GECE observatory) (2017-)

The aim of the Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness (GECE) Observatory, in the Valencian Community is to study levels of competitiveness in Valencian firms, and the factors and internal criteria that facilitate it. The agreement between the **lvie** and Bankia to create the observatory also stipulates the publication of quarterly reports on its main conclusions, together with a collection of short informative notes (Keys to competitiveness) and descriptions of successful firms in the Valencian Community that can serve as a benchmark for other companies.

NETWORKS

The **Ivie** participates in eight international networks, Competitiveness, ICTNET, World KLEMS, LA KLEMS, EU KLEMS, Wolpertinger, INDICSER and PREDICT, and two other national ones: REDEV and the network established University Carlos III of Madrid (UC3M), through the Research Institute for Higher Education and Science (INAECU).

In 2020, Afi, ISEAK, **Ivie** and KSNET formed the Network for Good Practices in Evaluation (REDEV), a joint project to promote public and private policy evaluation in Spain. With this new alliance,

they aim to unite their experience to support public and private institutions in their decision-making process, based on the premise that this process must be backed up by objective data and rigorous analysis. RedEV promotes a comprehensive approach to evaluation that encompasses all the essential phases to contribute to informed and evidence-based decision making, starting from the soundness of the diagnosis and reaching the final phase of evaluation of results and impacts.

The second national collaboration network is the one established, since 2013, with the Carlos III University of Madrid (UC3M), Research Institute for Higher Education and Science (INAECU), for the study and evaluation of the production and use of information in science and technology by scientific communities. UC3M is a competent contact to provide bibliometric information on the scientific activity of Spanish universities that the **Ivie** uses in its projects on the Spanish university system such as U-Ranking.

International networks

One of the networks, SPINTAN, is a project coordinated by **Ivie**, with support of 12 research institutes and European universities. Promoted and financed by the 7th Framework Programme of the European Commission, this project aims to analyze the impact of public sector intangibles on innovation, well-being and "smart" growth (including the role of education, R&D and innovation, and the construction of a digital society).

The **Ivie** participates in the European project in charge of conducting studies that lay the basis for the Annual European Report on Competitiveness. Promoting public debate on aspects related to competitiveness and making recommendations related to the Lisbon strategy and future business policies are some of the objectives of this report. Some of the projects developed by the **Ivie** along this line of collaboration are *Competitiveness of the European cement and lime sectors* and *Study on total factor productivity growth: drivers, components and frontiers firms*.

The **Ivie** is also one of the 31 European institutes that participated in the ICTNET project (European Network for the Research on the Economic Impact of ICTs), a research funded by the European Commission through DG CONNECT (Directorate General for Communications Networks, Content & Technology) which aim was to coordinate research in ICT economics in Europe increasing the relevance of the research on this topic.

The KLEMS (Kapital Labour Energy Material Services) international network aims to promote and facilitate the analysis of growth patterns and the evolution of productivity around the world, based on a growth accounting framework. At the heart of the initiative is the creation of new databases with the necessary variables to carry out these analyses. Through harmonizing concepts, common standards and classifications, the data is comparable across countries. **Ivie** has participated in this project since its beginning, with the setting up of EU KLEMS, which gathers information about the EU countries, the United States, Canada, South Korea, Australia and Japan. The **Ivie** has also supported the creation and development of LA KLEMS, which is the extension of this study of productivity to several Latin American countries and the launch of ASIA KLEMS, which includes Asian countries. The latest initiative of this global network is BALTIC KLEMS, whose objective is to develop a methodology adapted to the Baltic countries to analyze the growth patterns and evolution of their productivity. The **Ivie** has actively participated in this new project through a

Marie Sklodowska-Curie grant, which has enabled the integration of a researcher to launch this new database. In the same way, the **lvie** participates actively in the development of World KLEMS that frames the rest of projects and regional KLEMS databases.

The Institute also participates in PREDICT (Prospective Insights on R&D in ICT), a project jointly funded by the European Commission's DG Communications Networks, Content and Technology (DG CONNECT) and the Joint Research Center (JRC). The objective of this project is to analyze the importance of ICT, its productivity and R&D spending in the European Union (EU) and 12 relevant countries within the global ICT market.

Finally, several **Ivie** Researchers are members of the 'Wolpertinger Club', an association of university academics with a common interest in the economics of financial systems and financial institutions. They meet once a year to discuss their research, exchange ideas and develop ways to cooperate in the research and teaching of banking, financial institutions and the economics of financial systems.

8. DATABASES AND INDICATOR SYSTEMS³

Several **Ivie** projects have generated databases or indicator systems of interest to economic research that also facilitates decision making based on objective and up-to-date information. The **Ivie** website provides easy access to the Institute's 27 databases and indicator systems that are classified into eight areas: growth and capitalization, human capital and human development, socio-economic, globalization, international, public sector, universities, and knowledge economy. A new database was created in 2020: COVID-19 Severity and Impact Indicators (ISIC-19).

8.1. Growth and capitalization

Capital stock in housing in Spain and its territorial distribution (1990-2010)

The database *Capital stock in housing in Spain and its territorial distribution (1990-2010)* offers data on the capital stock in housing series from 1990 until 2010, land value included. Information is also provided on the changes of total stock in housing and its prices.

Data is broken down by autonomous community, province and population status, distinguishing between municipalities according to the number of inhabitants and whether they are on the coast or inland.

Among the results provided are house prices and total land area of the housing stock, as well as their changes over time. Data are also included on the value of housing stock and land capital stock. The results are classified by industry and region, with the latest information published in 2015.

Stock and capital services in Spain and its territorial distribution (1964-2017)

Since 1995, the **Ivie** and the BBVA Foundation have been conducting a research program on capital stock which includes a database with information on capital accumulation in Spain over the last five decades. Specifically, this database examines the series at national level for the period 1964 to 2017 and until 2016 for the Spanish regions and provinces. In addition, the database updates the contribution of productive capital and offers information of the assets invested in, including R&D expenditure. For this purpose, net capital stock (wealth) and capital services (productive capital) are measured.

³ The maintenance and updating process of **Ivie**'s databases is funded by the Valencian Regional Government's Ministry for Finance and the Economic Model, through a cooperation agreement signed between both institutions to promote and consolidate the **Ivie**'s basic and applied economic research activities.

At national level, the 31 industries considered are disaggregated into 19 types of assets, according to the NACE Rev. 2 classification. The classification distinguishes between tangible and intangible assets, including R&D expenditure for the first time. In addition, this classification includes three information and communication technology (ICT) assets (software, hardware and communications) and offers a great asset breakdown in public infrastructure which is a distinctive characteristic of the BBVA Foundation-lvie series.

The extensive database, that **Ivie** and BBVA Foundation have made public, is accompanied by numerous dynamic graphs that facilitate the analysis of the evolution and composition of capital endowments in Spain and its regions. As of December 2020, over 925 published specialized works have been written based on this information.

Historical series on public capital in Spain and its territorial distribution (1900-2012)

Since 1995, the **Ivie** and BBVA Foundation have developed a broad research program on Spanish economic growth. One of the fundamental parts of the program is the development of databases on capital stock in Spain which are updated regularly. One of the main characteristics of this series is the importance given to public capital endowments. The continuous analysis of public sector investment carried out by the **Ivie** and BBVA Foundation has enabled the development of this database covering more than a century.

The study measures investment in the public sector from a long-term perspective with a detailed look at distribution by autonomous communities and provinces, thus allowing the territorial evolution of public capital to be analyzed for more than a century. In addition, the study facilitates both a better evaluation of public policies, as well as an analysis of the impact of public capital on regional or provincial growth and convergence.

The database spans more than a century of Spain's history and is detailed according to autonomous community and province, thus facilitating the analysis of the impact of public capital on growth and convergence among regions. Detailed information is also provided on the public sector's investment strategy in areas key to growth and welfare, such as infrastructures, health, and education.

Intangible assets: national database (1995-2011)

Given the growing importance of activities based on knowledge in the economic development of the most advanced countries, investment in intangibles assets (ICT), research and development (R&D), innovation, design, creativity, image and brand, organization and specific human capital training) are assets in which investment is needed to modernize and strengthen the productive structure of a country.

This project developed for the Telefonica Foundation follows the methodology accepted worldwide (Corrado, Hulten and Siches [2005] *Measuring Capital and Technology: An Expanded Framework*) which is in line with the INTAN-Invest project (www.intan-invest.net) that measures intangible investments for a group of European countries.

The database offers the first annual database of the value of investment in intangible assets and its capitalization for the period 1995-2011 for the whole Spanish economy with a wide level of sectoral disaggregation (24 sectors, NACE Rev. 2 classification). The intangible assets used in the database are: computerized information, innovative property (R&D, mineral exploration and spending on the production of entertainment and artistic originals, new products/systems in financial services, design and other new products/systems) and economic competencies (advertising, market research, employer-provided training, organizational capital).

Intangible assets: database for Spain and its autonomous communities (1995-2016)

The database *Inversión en activos intangibles más allá del PIB en España y sus regiones*, developed by the **Ivie** in collaboration with the Cotec Foundation for Innovation, offers information on the gross fixed capital formation (GFCF) in intangible assets in Spain and its autonomous communities by sectors. Data is available for the period 1995-2016, in both current and constant euros for 2010. The database offers a sectoral breakdown of 27 sectors according to the NACE 2009.

The intangible assets are organized into two main groups: those already included in GDP (considered investment by the European System of Accounts, ESA, 2010), referred to as AIPIB, and those not yet included in the national accounts which are grouped under the name AIMAPIB (intangible assets "beyond GDP"). These two major groups are classified in nine individual intangible assets.

8.2. Human capital and human development

Human capital in Spain and its regional distribution

The results obtained from the Human Capital Project undertaken by the **Ivie** in collaboration with the Bancaja Foundation improve the statistical information already available on human capital and have enabled the **Ivie** to create a database that contains abundant information on the evolution of the Spanish population's educational levels.

The period covered in the database is from 1964 until 2013. The series are structured by educational levels, population groups, regions, provinces and sectors and can be accessed through **lvie**'s website: www.**lvie**.es.

Human development in Spain

The Human Development Index is an indicator that measures a country's degree of economic development and combines health, education and income measures. It was first published in 1990, as part of the United Nations Development Program, and quickly became more popular than the simple comparison by per capita income, it being a more informative indicator.

Within the Human Capital research framework developed by Bancaja and the **lvie** since 2000, a data series on human development for Spain and its autonomous communities has been built according to the methodology proposed by the UN. Furthermore, an alternative methodology is proposed to correct the major deficiencies of the UN index. The data currently covers the period 1980-2010.

The database contains the Human Development Index and the New Human Development Index, which both have health, education and income components.

Observatory of young people's transition to the labor market

The Observatory of the Transition of Young People to the labor market is a data bank developed through the Human Capital Project sponsored by the Bancaja Foundation, which was updated every three years. The data from the Observatory's six surveys, 1996, 1999, 2002, 2005, 2008 and 2011 have been homogenized and categorized, the following factors being taken into account:

- Basic data on survey participants: age, level of education, gender, work experience, employment situation, nationality; motive for job search, employment search methods; information on academic history.
- Data on family background (education level of parents, socio-professional position of parents, household income).
- Psychosocial data which include attitudes, behavior and experiences of young people in the labor market: initiative, passivity, self-effectiveness, different elements of employment stress, centrality, satisfaction with life, one's economic situation and employment, extrinsic, intrinsic and social aspects of employment, and "justice at work".
- Data on the educational background, work and life experience of those polled, time spent studying, at what age they begin looking for work, left the house, formed their first relationship and had their first child.
- Employment: duration, type of contract, commitment, salary, type of employer and sector, reasons for leaving the job and contractual flexibility.
- Aspects related to the health and the general well-being of the young people.

8.3. Socio-economic regional differences

Access to banking services

The restructuring of the Spanish banking industry has led to a drastic cutback in installed capacity, which is reflected in the closure of more than 40% of the branches that were operating in 2008, before the onset of the financial crisis. This drastic cutback has affected people's access to banking services, resulting in an increase in the percentage of the population living in towns and villages where there is no bank branch.

The aim of this database is to present the indicators of access to banking services by calculating the number and population of municipalities that do not have a bank branch. This analysis, with data from 2017, is being performed for all the regions of Spain (disaggregated at municipal level), so as to obtain a comparative picture of financial accessibility in the provinces and autonomous communities. The observatory's findings will help the Valencian Regional Government detect and remedy financial exclusion.

The database is available for download in Excel format on the lvie website: http://www.lvie.es.

Inequality in Spain, its regions and its provinces

Sponsored by Caixa Galicia Foundation, the aim of this study is to analyze the evolution of household consumption and income distribution in Spain from both a territorial and temporal perspective.

The database covers the period 1973/74-2005, with annual intervals from 1998 to 2005. Among the data provided is in-depth information on autonomous communities regarding their total expenditure per person and per household, according to the social class or studies of the main breadwinner. The expenditure is detailed in a total of twelve groups (education, housing, health, and leisure, among others).

Basic data were used from the Household Budget Surveys for the periods 1973/74, 1980/81 and 1990/91, and the Continuous Household Budget Surveys, published by the INE, for the period 1998 to 2005, with autonomous community disaggregation.

The data are available on **Ivie**'s website (https://www.**Ivie**.es/es_ES/bases-de-datos/diferencias-economicas-y-sociales-de-los-territorios/desigualdad/) and are also incorporated in the World Bank and United Nations University (WIDER) databases.

Education accounts

The BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**, within its cooperation framework program, have developed several studies on important topics such as educational training, employment and innovation. From this collaboration arises the database Spanish Education Accounts (Cuentas de la Educación en España) which addresses several key issues related to the Spanish educational system: What is

its size and how is it structured? How much is spent on education? Who are the producers of educational services and who are the beneficiaries?

The education accounts (EA) database 2000-2016 is structured into six large areas. The first (A.1) and second (A.2) areas are devoted to public and private education accounts, respectively. The third (A.3) offers information on total spending on education, while the fourth (A.4) and fifth (A.5) contain data on public and household expenditure on education. Finally, the sixth area (A.6) contains the student series.

The database is available for download in Excel format on the BBVA Foundation website: www.fbbva.es/

Homogeneous population series

For over a decade already, the BBVA Foundation and the **lvie**, under their cooperation framework agreement, have put the focus on demographic analysis, from a more aggregate level to municipal or lower scale. The information offered by the population censuses available and comparable since the end of the 19th century has made it possible to build the Homogenous population series.

The homogenization process of the de jure resident population, taking into account the changes in municipalities' borders for more than one century, has been very strenuous. The disappearance of municipalities, their creation, division, merging or changes of name have been tracked for each one of the more than 8,000 municipalities during the eleven censuses taken.

This Spanish population database is based on the municipal structure of the 2011 Census. Reference data is the de jure population and is dated for each one of the twelve censuses prepared by INE since the beginning of the 20th century, allowing a detailed analysis of the changes in location of population patterns during the period 1900-2011.

The database is accessible on the BBVA Foundation website, www.fbbva.es, and contains information for the 8,116 Spanish municipalities existing in 2011. The series are classified in accordance with the code associated with each municipal area and grouped by the 52 Spanish provinces, also offering the area in square miles of each municipality.

Social capital

Social capital is a concept that for over a decade has attracted the attention of all social sciences and international institutions because of its outstanding potential in the processes of development. The term social capital highlights the role of cooperation and trust in achieving collective or economic results. The **lvie** carries out a joint project with the BBVA Foundation for the study of social capital. During 2013, the social capital database, built within the framework of this project, was updated. The international database, which includes OECD countries, covers from 1970 until 2011, and the series for Spain (with territorial breakdown by regions and provinces) until the year 2013.

The database was published by the BBVA Foundation on 11 November 2015. Information and/or data series to date can be requested to publicaciones@lvie.es.

Life tables for Spain and its regions

Life tables are fundamental in providing a numerical representation of the status changes occurring within a population over time. **Ivie** Researcher Francisco J. Goerlich and Rafael Pinilla have calculated the classic biometric functions of the Life Tables for Spain and its regions, covering the period 1975-2018. The data bank also contains four demographic indicators for each year and geographic area: average age of population, average-age life expectancy, life potential and life potential per capita.

The database contains period life tables with annual periods for Spain (complete and abridged by five-year groups up to a final open interval of 110 and over), its autonomous communities (abridged to a final open interval of 100 and over), and provinces (abridged to a final open interval of 85 years and older).

For the population data tables, information from the Spanish National Statistics Institute is used. Data on deaths are from the Vital Statistics on the natural movement of population (MNP). The microdata can be downloaded from INE's website, and is classified by age, period, generation (Lexis triangles) and groups of cause-of-death. The latest available figures correspond to 2018.

Three aspects distinguish **Ivie**'s Life Table database from INE's: data is homogenous since 1975; it is disaggregated by large groups of cause-of-death; and includes an additional demographic indicator: life potential.

The data is available to researchers and interested public via the **lvie** website (www.**lvie**.es), with the possibility of obtaining the information in map format.

Migration in the Valencia region

The Examination of Migration in the Valencia Region, is undertaken by the **Ivie** for the Bancaja Foundation (previously included in the Observatory on Immigration in the Valencian Region of the CeiMigra Foundation, sponsored by Bancaja). Its objective is two-fold: first, to provide a comprehensive view of the immigration phenomenon with its many social and economic profiles, through the compilation and systematization of available information, while also detecting gaps in this information. Second, to provide access to adequate statistical material for subsequent detailed analysis of the various aspects of immigration.

The last edition, dated December 2011, includes comparative data on the situation of emigration and immigration in OECD countries, and also information on the remittances sent and received from the immigrants of nationalities most represented in Spain, the employment situation of immigrants in their country of origin or the reason for their moving to Spain.

The data of Migration in the Valencia Region are available on Ivie's website: www.Ivie.es.

8.4. Globalization

INTEGRA

The INTEGRA data bank is framed within **lvie**'s research program with the BBVA Foundation and under the International economic integration research area, and consists of a wide range of indicators to measure the evolution of economies' integration on a worldwide scale.

The INTEGRA database has three different indicators (degree of openness, connection and integration) which have been developed with a broad level of geographical and temporal disaggregation. A total of eighty-five countries are covered (representing 97% of world GDP in 2007), spanning the period 1985-2007. It also provides indicators of total trade in goods, indicators corrected by the distance between countries and indicators disaggregated by industries according to the ISIC-3 classification (Revision 2), with a distinction between the two directions of trade flows: exports and imports.

8.5. International

EU KLEMS

KLEMS (Kapital Labour Energy Material Services) international network aims to promote and facilitate the analysis of growth patterns and the evolution of productivity around the world, based on a growth accounting framework. At the heart of the initiative is the creation of new databases with the necessary variables to carry out these analyses. Through harmonizing concepts, common standards and classifications, the data is comparable across countries. Some of the variables included are value added, capital stock, employment and human capital.

The **Ivie** has participated in this project since its beginning, with the setting up of EU KLEMS, which gathers information about the EU countries, the United States, Canada, South Korea, Australia and Japan. The Conference Board is responsible for coordinating the work of the consortium and updating the database.

The **Ivie** has also supported the creation and development of LA KLEMS, which is the extension of this study of productivity to several Latin American countries. The latest initiative of this global network is ASIA KLEMS, which includes the Asian countries. In the same way, the **Ivie** participates actively in the development of World KLEMS that frames the rest of projects and regional KLEMS databases.

In addition to the **lvie**, more than 40 research centers and institutions from around the world participate in the KLEMS consortium. Information is available at <u>www.euklems.net</u> and can be accessed through **lvie**'s website.

SPINTAN

The SPINTAN Project (Smart Public Intangibles), directed by the **lvie** for the European Commission, aims to define the theoretical and empirical characteristics of public intangible policies. The project is carried out by academic researchers from diverse European institutes and universities.

The database contains information on public intangible assets for 22 EU countries, United States, China and Brazil covering the period 1995-2015. It provides information on the investment and the capital stock in intangible assets such as brands, design, entertainment and artistic originals, organizational capital, employer-provided training, as well as expenditure on R&D and software which are now included in the national accounts of each country.

The database, which is available on the SPINTAN website (www.spintan.net), includes information on the following industries: scientific research and development; public administration and defense; compulsory social security; education; human health and social work activities; and arts, entertainment and recreation.

This information allows us to analyze the impact of public sector intangibles on innovation, well-being and smart growth (including education, R&D and the construction of a digital society).

ICT sector and its R&D (PREDICT)

The **Ivie** has developed for the European Commission a wide database on the Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) and Audiovisual Content sectors, within the framework of the Prospective Insights on (R&D) in ICT (PREDICT) Project. The PREDICT project, jointly funded by the European Commission's DG Communications Networks, Content and Technology (DG CONNECT) and the Joint Research Center (JRC-UnitB6), analyzes the importance of ICT, its productivity and R&D spending in the European Union (EU) and 12 relevant countries within the global ICT market. This database is one of the tools used by the European Commission to monitor the progress of the Digital Single Market, one of its key strategic areas.

The databank offers information for 12 variables; value added, employment (hours worked and number of employed persons), productivity, labor productivity, Business Enterprise R&D expenditures (BERD), number of personnel and of researchers, ICT R&D public funding, as well as its deflators, PPP and currency exchange rates. The data is available for the ICT sector, following the OECD classification (2007) of ICT industries, which comprises 12 ICT manufacturing and services sub-sectors and some selected non-ICT producing high-tech sectors.

The data is available for the EU and all its member states, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, India, United States, South Korea, Japan, Norway, Russia, Switzerland and Taiwan. Data on ICT R&D public funding is offered at the aggregate level, by NABS (NABS – Nomenclature for the Analysis and Comparison of Scientific Programmes and Budgets) and by industry sector (NACE Rev. 2) for the EU, United States and Japan. In addition to ICT sector data, the PREDICT 2017 database includes information from official sources (Eurostat, OECD, and National Statistics Institutes, among others) on the following sectors: Media and content (publishing of books and journals,

audiovisual and broadcasting activities and news agency activities) and Retail sale via mail order houses or via internet.

Currently, the database, regularly updated by the **Ivie**, covers the period 1995 to 2017 (last year with official data). Provisional estimates on the evolution of the main ICT sectors and the Media and content and Retail sale via mail order houses or via internet sectors are available for 2018 and 2019. The PREDICT initiative aims to compare the evolution of the EU ICT sector with its R&D and its major competitors. To this end, in addition to the database, annual reports are drawn up that analyze the available information and synthesize the main trends in the ICT sector of the countries included in the database.

Also, together with the JRC, meetings in Brussels aimed at policy makers and international experts are organized to present the results of the project. The main conclusions of the research carried out are summarized in Policy Briefs, which include economic policy recommendations.

8.6. Public sector

COVID-19 Severity and Impact Indicators (ISIC-19)

The COVID-19 pandemic has put every country in the world on high alert. The rapid spread of the pandemic, its consequences on the health system and the strict confinement measures that disrupt economic activities have put at risk the globalized world as we know it. To assess the effects of the pandemic on population health and to try to control the negative economic effects associated with it, tools are needed to monitor its evolution in different territories. To accomplish this, the **lvie** has developed three synthetic indicators, known as COVID-19 Severity and Impact Indicators (ISIC-19), that focus on the severe cases and allow to assess the severity and impact of the pandemic and to study its evolution, giving a regional comparison of the situation.

The *scope* index measures the amount of severely affected people over total population, which can be expressed as a gross index (ratio between the cumulative number of severely affected people and the total population) and as a net index (ratio between the number of severely affected people minus recovered patients and total population). The *severity* index measures to what degree this part of the population is seriously affected based on the Balanced Worth methodology developed by Herrero and Villar (2013, 2018). The *impact* index is the result of these two components, scope and severity, which measures how many people are severely affected and to what degree, in relation to the total population.

The methodology used to construct the indicators is detailed on the **Ivie** website, along with the algorithm developed by Rodrigo Aragón and Héctor García (**Ivie**) that facilitates the calculation of the Balanced Worth.

This index is based on data provided daily by the Spanish Ministry of Health on the number of deaths, and hospitalized and recovered patients, for Spain as a whole and for each of the Spanish regions. The data is available from 19 March 2020 onwards.

Basic public services expenditure in Spain and its regions

Education, health and social protection, known as basic public services (BPS), are particularly relevant activities of the public sector: due to the importance of the resources allocated to them and the activities carried out. In fact, they represent more than half of public spending and are needed to reach the equity goals pursued by public interventions, especially the principle of equal opportunities.

This database includes information on public sector activities related to the provision and management of services: health (primary, specialist and hospital care, public health, clinical research); education (pre-school, primary, secondary, post-secondary and higher, scholarships, education services); and social services (retirements, disease and disability, advanced age, family protection, unemployment, housing, social exclusion).

The study examines the trajectory of BPS expenditure in Spain and its autonomous communities over the course of the 21st century in order to provide objective data which can be referred to in assessments and decision making. The period covered allows to distinguish differences across regions before and during the crisis.

Regional differences in the Spanish public sector

The database *Regional differences in the Spanish public sector* is part of a research project carried out by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** with a double objective. First, to generate new fresh information on public-sector performance in Spain and its regions. Second, to analyze the data obtained to gain a more detailed picture of the extent of its performance, the reasons underlying regional differences and their effect on inter-territorial solidarity and economic efficiency.

The database, available at the BBVA Foundation website (www.fbbva.es), contains regionalized data for the period 2000-2008 and covers information on the size of the public sector in each region and its territorial distribution by levels of government, by functions and by revenue and expenditure items.

Public health expenditure in Spain

The *Public Health Expenditure in Spain* database contains statistical information on public health spending in Spain by regions for the 1991-2010 period.

It is a homogeneous territorial database that supplements those offered by the Public Healthcare Expenditure Statistics (EGSP), which are produced by the Spanish Ministry of Health in collaboration with the autonomous communities. In addition to starting in 1991, this database offers more detailed regional information than the EGSP, reaches 94% of total public health spending and provides information by public stakeholders. Also, a homogeneous series for the whole period has been constructed.

The databank, which is available on the BBVA Foundation website, www.fbbva.es, contains information on public health expenditure by region covering the period 1991-2010 in Spain, with

specific data on the autonomous communities. Supplementary tables are also provided on GDP deflators and prices, population projections by region and age, health expenditure profiles and health expenditure evolution.

8.7. Universities

U-Ranking

U-Ranking is a set of Synthetic Indicators of the Spanish University System (ISSUE), available at www.u-ranking.es, which offers the user two products. First, it provides a set of synthetic indicators on public and private universities in Spain, allowing them to be ranked according to their performance (U-Ranking) and their volume of results (U-Ranking Volume). U-Ranking takes into account the three missions of university activity (teaching, research, and innovation and technological development). The website offers the global synthetic indicators obtained by each university, as well as the indicators in each activity and area, thus allowing each institution to be compared from different points of view.

Furthermore, the U-Ranking website provides an accurate and easy-to-use tool, allowing the user to build their own personalized ranking with their chosen degree and make a comparison of what each university has to offer, expressing their preferences about what to study and where, as well as the importance given to different university activities. Along with the personalized listing, other information of interest is provided, such as the last cut-off mark, the price of credits and details about the university surroundings.

The 8th edition of U-Ranking, developed by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**, presents some methodological improvements that not only confirm the robustness of its results, but also allow the analysis of a larger number of private universities. Specifically, U-Ranking 2020 analyzes a total of 70 Spanish universities, 48 public and 22 private, by monitoring 20 different indicators and constructing various synthetic indexes.

SIUVP

SIUVP (Valencian Public University System of Information) is a project born in 2012 from the collaboration of the five Valencian public universities – University of Valencia, Alicante University, Polytechnic University of Valencia, Jaume I University and Miguel Hernández University at Elchewith the aim of offering a complete set of indicators on their activity and results.

SIUVP is a window to the Valencian university activity, a tool by which universities account in a transparent manner to society, for the effectiveness and efficiency achieved in their performance. Through the website, users have access to a comprehensive information system that consists of more than 60 indicators.

The information in this platform allows the user to know the situation and development of the five universities in areas related to the supply and demand of degrees, the academic performance of their students, internationalization, research activity, knowledge transfer to society and economic results of its activity.

The SIUVP database provides information on 60 indicators that are structured in seven different areas: Admission, Students, Academic results, Internationalization, Human resources, Research and tech transfer and Economic data.

The SIUVP website (www.siuvp.es) is updated twice a year to offer the latest data available.

8.8. Knowledge economy

ABACO

ABACO (Observatory of Knowledge-Based Activities) rises as a joint project of the **Ivie**, the Universitat de València and the Universitat Politècnica de València with the aim of measuring and analyzing the knowledge-based activities.

One of the pillars of ABACO is the generation of its own information system, available on the ABACO website, which facilitates the analysis and diagnosis of the current situation and recent evolution of knowledge-based activities in Spain, as well as comparison with other countries.

ABACO offers the user a powerful database which is regularly updated with over 200 indicators structured in five areas: New technologies, Human capital, Innovation system, Business environment, and Socio-economic impact.

ABACO also offers extensive detailed information on knowledge intensive GDP. The database contains information about the weight that knowledge-based factors have in the gross value added (GVA) of each of the eighteen countries studied (Australia, Austria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Netherlands, Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, South Korea, Sweden, United Kingdom, and USA). The results are also presented by sector of activity (according to the NACE Rev. 1 classification).

This information is available on the project's website: www.observatorioabaco.es.

Value of knowledge-based economic activities

The aim of this database, developed by the **Ivie** in collaboration with the Ramon Areces Foundation, is to quantify the value of knowledge-based economic activities in Spain and its autonomous communities. With this purpose, the database assesses the market value of the contributions of productive factors that add more knowledge to the production system (skilled work, ICT, intangible assets and machinery and equipment), an exercise based on the methodology of growth accounting. The database follows the methodology found in the report and provides information on the total and regional GVA in Spain, as well as its disaggregation into

two parts: GVA based on knowledge (knowledge-based activities) and GVA with no knowledge-based activities or based on productivity factors with low knowledge content.

The database, which covers the period 2000-2014 (2013 for regional data), presents a high industry-level breakdown: 27 sectors at national level and 21 at regional level, defined according to the CNAE 2009/NACE Rev. 2 classification.

The database is available since 2017 on Ivie's website.

9. SCIENTIFIC MEETINGS⁴

The Institute has taken an active part in promoting and supporting the participation of its associates in national and international meetings, and also by organizing seminars, workshops and courses in different places. Through these activities, the **lvie** hopes to make its head office, and the university departments and institutions with which it collaborates, a regular meeting point for researchers, other specialists and social institutions.

9.1. Organized by the **Ivie**

The health emergency crisis suffered worldwide in 2020 as a result of COVID-19 inevitably affected **lvie**'s agenda. The confinement measures implemented in March forced the postponement or cancellation of all in-person activities (seminars, conferences, workshops). The limitations imposed by the pandemic and the important advancements in digitalization and the use of new technologies during 2020 have changed the way these types of activities are organized and promoted.

The **lvie** adapted its calendar of events to the circumstances by making use of these technologies, allowing the **lvie** to organize seminars, dialogues, workshops and conferences in collaboration with other entities and also individually.

Ernest Lluch Foundation-Ivie Dialogues: Sports, Economy and Health: Changing the Rules of the Game


The Ernest Lluch Foundation and the **Ivie** began their collaboration in 2018 with the organization of a five part series of dialogues on INEQUALITY AND DEMOCRACY. The aim of these dialogues was to raise awareness of the problems arising from the growing inequalities in today's society. This line of collaboration continued in 2019 with a new series of dialogues entitled THE QUEST FOR PROSPERITY: CHALLENGES OF MIGRATION. Once again, ten renowned speakers contributed and shared their reflections, in this case, on migration-related problems. In 2020 this joint activity has been maintained, although adjuted to the health and safety protocols and restrictions imposed by the pandemic, with the title SPORTS, ECONOMY AND HEALTH: CHANGING THE RULES OF THE GAME, in which five dialogues were held with the participation of ten experts. Some of which had to participate remotely, via video conference, while the in-person audience capacity was reduced to one-third. All the dialogues were streamed live on the **Ivie**'s YouTube channel.

IvieLAB Conferences and Seminars

The IvieLAB (Laboratory for the Analysis and Evaluation of Public Policy) is an initiative of the **Ivie**, in collaboration with the Valencian Regional Government, with the objective to promote ideas, design methodologies and elaborate information to analyze, evaluate and improve public policies.

In 2020, through this project, the workshop Minimum income schemes: information systems and outcome evaluation was organized to analyze the usefulness of reviewing the minimum income schemes in order to improve their impact. The workshop, with participation by the ISEAK Foundation and SIIS Documentation and Studies Center of the Eguia Careaga Foundation, was aimed at those responsible for the autonomous administration.

9.2. Organized in collaboration with other institutions

Afi, ISEAK, Ivie and KSNET have joined forces to create the Network for Good Practices in Evaluation (REDEV) to promote public and private policy evaluation in Spain, both in the public and private sectors. On 23 June, REDEV was presented at an online conference that was broadcast live on Webex.

The presentation began with a speech by **Emilio Ontiveros**, President of Afi, who analyzed the foundations of the welfare state in Spain. In addition, the objectives of the agreement were explained in greater detail by representatives of the participating institutions: **Sara de la Rica**, Director of ISEAK; **Pilar Chorén**; **Ivie** Managing Director; **Elena Costas**, member of KSNET; and **César Cantalapiedra**, Managing Director of the Public Finance area of Afi. Finally, **Ivie**'s Research Director, **Francisco Pérez**, offered the closing words.

Afi, ISEAK and the **Ivie** came together to organize on 15 July a videoconference by **Miguel Gil Tertre** (Head of Unit at the European Commission's Recovery and Resilience Task Force), titled "Fondo Europeo de Recuperación: retos y oportunidades para España y las comunidades autónomas". In this webinar, targeted especially at representatives of the autonomous administration, Miguel Gil Tertre explained the characteristics of the European funds aimed at overcoming the COVID crisis.

On 22 September, FEDEA and the Olof Palme International Foundation, along with Cercle d'Economia, ESADE-EcPol, Ivie, RIFDE and the University of Oviedo, organized the conference on the reform of the Spanish regional funding system presented to the Senate. The event, which was cancelled in March due to the pandemic, was structured in two parts. First, it focused on the areas of consensus presented by the participating experts on the changes needed in the funding model, while in the second part, alternative proposals were offered to revise some of the main aspects of the funding system.

10. DISSEMINATION

10.1. Presentation of studies

During 2020, the dissemination activities carried out by the **Ivie** and collaborating institutions were affected by the health emergency crisis and restrictions on mobility imposed globally to protect people's health. As a result of this, all in person activities were reduced to a minimum, except for during the months previous to the coronavirus outbreak, January and February. From March onwards, the results of the different research projects were mainly presented online, with only a few in person activities with reduced seating capacity, such as the third series of dialogues organized with the Ernest Lluch Foundation and the Bancaja Foundation. Despite these limitations, 20 studies developed by **Ivie** Researchers and Technicians were presented during 2020:

- On 15 January, Bankia and the **Ivie** presented the GECE Observatory in Alicante, at the conference organized by the Family Business Association of the province of Alicante (AEFA), Buenas prácticas empresariales en gobierno, estrategia y competitividad. Alejandro Escribá explained the main objectives and activities of the Observatory in an event in which the Regional Minister of Finance, Vicent Soler, gave the closing words.
- On 22 January, the Trinidad Alfonso Foundation released the study Impacto económico del Programa de Apoyo a competiciones deportivas de la Comunitat Valenciana (2018-2019), carried out by Ivie Research Deputy Director, Joaquín Maudos, and Ivie technician Carlos Albert.
- On 23 January, the GECE Observatory distributed a press release with the Keys to Competitiveness document no. 5, included in the collection of brief informative documents on the competitiveness of Valencian firms and its relationship with corporate governance, management and strategy.
- The Trinidad Alfonso Foundation organized a press conference on 28 February to present the 2019 Valencia Marathon economic impact study. The results were presented by two of its authors, Ivie Researchers Joaquín Maudos and Joaquín Aldás, with participation by Paco Borao and Juan Botella, President and Manager of the Sociedad Deportiva Correcaminos, respectively; Elena Tejedor, Director of the Trinidad Alfonso Foundation; Pilar Bernabé, Valencia City Sports Councilor; and Emiliano García, Valencia City Councilor for Tourism.
- For another year running, the supermarket chain, Mercadona, presented its annual results at a press conference held on 11 March, along with data from the 2019 economic impact report prepared by the **Ivie**.
- After the state of emergency was declared on 13 March and the population was confined to their homes, the activities in which **Ivie** had planned to participate were temporarily postponed or suspended. However, in March, the **Ivie** launched within the framework of the IvieLAB project, a new series of documents titled COVID19:IvieExpress that focus on the

- effects of the coronavirus on different socioeconomic aspects within the Valencian Community. A total of 21 documents were developed by the end of July.
- Despite the confinement, the GECE Observatory presented on 6 May its *Keys to Competitiveness* document no. 6.
- On 21 May, the report La superación de la crisis del COVID-19 en la Comunitat Valenciana: una hoja de ruta de la reconstrucción de la economía, prepared for the Generalitat Valenciana through the IvieLAB collaboration program, was presented as a basis for designing the strategy for the economic recovery of the region.
- On June 23, the Red por las Buenas Prácticas en Evaluación (REDEV), an initiative launched in collaboration with Afi, ISEAK and KSNET, was presented online to promote policy evaluation in Spain, both in the public and private sectors.
- U-Ranking 2020 was presented through Zoom to the media at a press conference on 30 June. The directors of the project, Francisco Pérez and Joaquín Aldás, along with Ivie Technicians, Irene Zaera, Rodrigo Aragón and Inés Rosell, explained the main results.
- On 8 July, the Ramón Areces Foundation published the study Dinámica empresarial en España y digitalización: retos ante la nueva crisis del COVID-19, carried out by lvie Researchers, Juan Fernández de Guevara and Joaquín Maudos, along with lvie technician, Consuelo Mínguez, which examines the Spanish productive network prior to the lockdown in order to distinguish its strengths and weaknesses in the face of recovery.
- On 22 July, Cajamar presented the main results of the third edition of the Observatorio del sector agroalimentario, developed by Ivie Research Deputy Director, Joaquín Maudos, in collaboration with Ivie technician, Jimena Salamanca. In compliance with safety measures, the speakers came in person to the Cajamar headquarters in Madrid, while the press connected online.
- On 31 July, the main conclusions of one of the four areas of analysis included in the study of the 2nd phase of the Spending Review, developed by the Independent Authority for Fiscal Responsibility (AIReF) for the European Union, in which the Ivie participated, were published. Specifically, the Ivie was responsible for evaluating transport infrastructure investment in Spain between 1985 and 2018. In that period, 340,000 million euros were allocated to transport, with an investment of 7,000 million in 2018.
- On August 15, the Director of the Ciutat de les Arts i les Ciències, Enrique Vidal, offered a press conference to present the main results of the CAC economic impact report directed by Joaquín Maudos, which is available on the Ivie website.
- The third edition of the series of dialogues organized by the Ernest Lluch Foundation and the **lvie**, in collaboration with the Bancaja Foundation, Sports, Economy and Health: Changing the Rules of the Game, began on 16 September with five scheduled meetings held both face-to-face and online. The last of the dialogues took place on 26 October.

- FEDEA and the Olof Palme International Foundation, along with Cercle d'Economia, ESADE-EcPol, Ivie, RIFDE and the University of Oviedo, resumed on 22 September the workshop Jornada sobre la reforma de la financiación territorial en el Senado, to discuss the reform of the regional funding system in Spain, which was originally scheduled for March and had to be postponed due to the coronavirus. Francisco Pérez was among those in charge of presenting the areas of consensus among the participating experts on the main lines that should guide the reform of the regional funding system.
- On 23 September, Ximo Puig made public reference to the report Madrid: capitalidad, economía del conocimiento y competencia fiscal, included in the IvieLAB program. This document has had great media coverage and is available on the Ivie website.
- On 19 October, a new press release was issued with updated data from the SIUVP website on the five Valencian public universities.
- On 3 November, the Ramón Areces Foundation and the Ivie organized an online debate which focused on the results of the report Dinamismo empresarial y digitalización: retos ante la crisis del COVID-19, with participation by Ivie researcher, Juan Fernández de Guevara; Ivie Research Deputy Director, Joaquín Maudos; Professor of the Universidad Complutense, Miguel Jerez; and Professor of Applied Economics and President of AlicanTec, Andrés Pedreño.
- On 4 November, the Conexus Foundation presented the report La intensidad de las relaciones socioeconómicas entre la Comunidad de Madrid y la Comunidad Valenciana, prepared by the Ivie. The director of the study, Joaquín Maudos, Ivie Research Deputy Director, explained the main results in an online press conference.
- On 12 November, the workshop Programa de rentas mínimas: sistemas de información y evaluación de resultados, was organized online by IvieLAB and the Generalitat Valenciana, in collaboration with the Iseak Foundation and the SIIS Documentation and Studies Center of the Eguía Careaga Foundation. The conference, moderated by Ivie Managing Director, Pilar Chorén, included the participation of Sara de la Rica, Director of ISEAK; Joseba Zalakain, Director of SIIS; and Gonzalo Romero, research analyst at the ISEAK Foundation. Francisco Pérez, Ivie Research Director, offered the closing words, insisting on the need for an adequate evaluation of public policies.
- On 24 November, the Economic and Social Council of Spain (CES) presented its XXI Research Award, Cambios Tecnológicos, trabajo y actividad empresarial: el impacto socioeconómico de la economía digital, a study developed by the lvie that analyzes the impact of the digital transformation in Spain, including its main threats and opportunities. The director of the study, Francisco Pérez, along with one of its authors and also lvie Research Professor, José María Peiró, presented the main results of the study in an online workshop.
- On 9 December, the Valencian Minister of Sustainable Economy, Productive Sectors, Commerce and Labour, Rafael Climent, inaugurated the presentation of the system of indicators for the Valencian Observatory of Decent Work, in which Ivie researcher, Lorenzo

Serrano, explained the main results from the Observatory used to prepare the report on employment in the hospitality sector in the Valencian Community.

— On 17 December, despite the numerous cancellations of sports competitions included in the Program to Support Sports Competitions in the Valencian Community (PAC-CV) due to COVID-19 restrictions, the Trinidad Alfonso Foundation and the Spanish Olympic Committee released the results of the 4th edition of the program. In addition, the economic impact study of the program, once again developed by the Ivie, was released on the same day.

10.2. Brief dissemination documents

10.2.1. COVID19: IvieExpress

The health crisis caused by the COVID-19 outbreak is giving rise to present effects and future consequences for the economies of the Valencian Community, Spain and the whole world. As soon as the lockdown was ordered, the **Ivie** began to prepare a series of socioeconomic analysis documents that addressed some of these impacts. The publication of the COVID19:IvieExpress documents, within the IvieLAB project, began on 31 March with a first report on the economic impact of the coronavirus on GDP and employment in the economies of Spain and the Valencian Community. 10.2.2. Esenciales Series

Essentials] is a series of periodicals designed to disseminate the main results of the Research Program carried out by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**.

Brief, accessible and up-to-date, these periodicals examine the issues dealt with in the main areas of research conducted by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**: growth and competitiveness; human capital and knowledge; the productive structure; welfare and social capital, and regional development and demographics. Up until 2020, the documents were released almost on a monthly basis, with approximately 10 to 11 documents published a year. However, upcoming issues have temporarily been suspended since March due to the coronavirus situation. As a result, only two were published in 2020, prior to the lockdown, corresponding to the months of January and February:

10.2.3. Claves GECE

The Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory (GECE Observatory) is a project launched by Bankia, in collaboration with the **Ivie**, with the goal of analyzing the competitiveness of Valencian firms over time and its relationship with internal competitiveness drivers.

One of the GECE Observatory's initiatives is the launch of the *Claves de competitividad* ('Keys to Competitiveness'), a collection of easy to read, visually attractive summaries targeted at the general public and the media, aimed at publicizing the Observatory's empirical findings.

Each document in the *Claves de competitividad* collection gives an overview of a particular aspect of the competitiveness of Valencian firms, based on the objective analyses carried out by the GECE Observatory. The aim is to encourage companies and institutions to reflect on the issues they must address in order to improve competitiveness and ensure long-term success.

This collection supplements the Observatory's reports, which offer a more in-depth analysis of the competitive position and associated drivers of firms. In 2020, two issues were published, with a total of six in the entire series:

- No. 6/2020. Más del 30% de las empresas familiares valencianas en 4 sectores de servicios logran niveles excelentes de competitividad.
- No. 5/2020. Las empresas familiares valencianas más competitivas destacan por su elevada contribución relativa al empleo, pero se mantienen como las que más optan por sistemas de gobierno personalistas.
- No. 4/2019. Crece 1,8 puntos el porcentaje de empresas familiares valencianas que logran situarse entre las más competitivas de España.
- No. 3/2019. Las empresas familiares valencianas más longevas son las más activas en exportación, situándose 16 puntos por encima de sus equivalentes a nivel nacional.
- No. 2/2019. El uso de consejo de administración en las empresas familiares valencianas más competitivas es 14,5 puntos más alto que en las de menor competitividad.
- No. 1/2018. Las empresas de mayor tamaño y las de sectores más intensivos en tecnología logran mejores niveles de competitividad.

10.3. Websites⁵

The **Ivie** website, renewed in 2018, has continued to incease its content during 2020, including updated informated in relation to the effects of COVID-19. For example, a new subsection called *COVID-19*, has been added to the "Videos" section, in which researchers and technicians share their reflections on the coronavirus and its effects. In addition, a new subsection titled *COVID-19:IvieExpress* has been added to the "Research" section, with a total of 21 documents prepared specifically to respond to relevant questions on the effects of the pandemic in the Valencian Community and in Spain.

The "Research" section also includes publications, books, reports, dissemination documents, research articles and working papers, as well as documents developed directly in the Institute, such as those generated by **Ivie**'s team. In addition to the *COVID-19:IvieExpress* documents, this section also includes the series of informative documents titled *Essentials*, prepared for the BBVA Foundation and targeted at the media; *Regional Funding Papers*; *AVE Focus*, developed in collaboration with the Valencian Association of Entrepreneurs (AVE); and *Keys to Competitiveness*, which are informative documents produced by the Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory (GECE Observatory), a joint initiative of Bankia and the **Ivie**.

The "Database" section of the website contains information and links to the 26 databases created by the **Ivie** that are available for consultation. This section provides access to a large amount of statistical information prepared by the Institute in the form of databases, namely, *Capital Stock, Human Capital, Regional Differences in the Public Sector, Basic Public Services, Public Health Expenditure, Intangible Assets: national databases (1995-2011), EU KLEMS, ICT R&D Macro data, Access to banking services, Social Capital, Human Development, Transition to the Labor Market, Inequality, Education Accounts in Spain, Homogenous Population Series, Life Tables, Trade Integration and Migrations, Intangible assets: national and regional database (1995-2014), Economic value of knowledge.*

The "News" section, in "News & Events", includes 77 news items on information regarding new developments, publications, recognitions and activities carried out by the **Ivie**. Included in the section "Opinion Articles", are the links to 60 articles written by **Ivie** members in the national and regional media, 42% more than the previous year.

The **Ivie** website reached **105,124** visits in 2020, 31,611 more than in the previous year, an increase of 30%. Of these, 55% were users living in Spain, while the remaining 45% were from 141 countries, including Mexico, Colombia, United States, Peru and Argentina.

The **Ivie** also manages and maintains the following websites: ABACO (Observatory of Knowledge-Based Activities) at www.observatorioabaco.es, U-Ranking at www.u-ranking.es, and SIUVP (Valencian Public University System of Information) at www.siuvp.es, which offers a complete information system with more than 60 indicators for the five Valencian public universities.

10.4. Circulation in press and online⁶

The **Ivie** maintains a regular presence in the media, as a result of the attention given to publicizing its work. This year, there have been 3,698 news items in the press on the research conducted at the Institute. This represents an increase of 15% over the previous year, due in part to the information published by the **Ivie** on COVID-19. This greater dissemination has also been perceived in the 60 opinion articles published by **Ivie** Researchers and Technicians, 42% more than in 2019.

In 2020, the **Ivie** responded to more than 250 requests from the media, which rely on the Institute and its researchers and economists as a source of information to confirm or supplement their news stories for print, radio, television or digital media. This figure represents an increase of 50% compared to the previous year and shows how journalists' trust in the data, reflections and opinions provided by the **Ivie** has grown. The Institute has especially become a reference for assessing some fundamental socioeconomic aspects related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The research concluded in 2019 and its activities undertaken were publicized through 36 press releases and also through 21 *COVID19:IvieExpress* documents for the Generalitat Valenciana, 2 *Essentials* and 2 *Keys to Competitiveness* of the GECE Observatory. In addition, during 2020, 77 activities and news events by the **Ivie** Researchers were reported in the agenda and news section of the Institute's website, including the publication of articles by researchers and technicians in scientific journals, and the presentation of papers at different congresses.

Among the topics that have had the most impact in the media in 2019 are: COVID19:IvieExpress, which generated 870 press releases; the two IvieLAB reports commissioned by the Generalitat Valenciana with 524; the 8th edition of U-Ranking with 399 news items; the different economic impact studies with 140 news items (Mercadona, Program to Support Sports Competitions, CAC, Feria Valencia, etc.); the BBVA Foundation studies with 127 news items; 120 news items on Ivie's collaboration with the Generalitat Valenciana on regional financing and 77 related to Ivie's database on access to banking services. In addition, the contributions made by researchers to the media, in which they offered their expert views on certain topics, led to more than 965 press clippings.

Nearly 35% of the news items issued by the **Ivie** in 2019 were published in the regional press (Valencian Community and other autonomous communities); around 15% in the digital press, 13% in the national press and 8% in economy related newspapers. The remaining 10% consists of news items broadcast on radio and television and by news agencies, sports press, international media, blogs and internet portals.





Figure 8.News items published in the media



The newspaper *Levante*, with 207 entries, is the one that published most news items in which the **Vie** is mentioned, followed by *La Vanguardia*, with 197 reports, and *Las Provincias*, which mentioned the **Ivie** on 116 occasions. The rest of the fifteen media outlets that mentioned the **Ivie** were the Alicante newspaper *Información* (115), *El País* (107), *ABC* (93), *20 minutos* (80), *Europa Press* (79), *Valencia Plaza* (75), *El Mundo* and *Expansión* (with 74 news items each), *Cinco Días* (68), *El Periódico Mediterráneo* (65), *El Economista* (58) and *Economía 3* with 56 news items retrieved.

Social networks have also served as a platform to publicize **Ivie**'s activity. With 1,500 published tweets, the Institute's Twitter profile has more than 3,740 followers, 11% more than in 2019. Meanwhile, U-Ranking and ABACO Twitter accounts increased their followers by 10% and 8%, respectively. The **Ivie** YouTube Channel received close to 20,800 visits in 2020, almost twice the number of visits in 2019 (11,400). This year a total of 21 new videos were published in the channel, thanks to the recording of the IvieLAB's activities, COVID-19 videos, and the Ernest Lluch Foundation's dialogues, as well as the the **Ivie** video blog.

Meanwhile, the presentations shared on Slide Share were viewed 18,196 times over the course of 2020, a year in which the cancellation of some planned activities reduced the number of new presentations published on this network to 9. The **lvie**'s profile on the LinkedIn professional networking service, which is intended to strengthen relations with the academic and research world, has almost doubled the number of followers this year, with a total of 923 as of 31 December 2020.

The **Ivie** Newsletter, each issue of which includes the Institute's main news, the latest research, researchers' opinion articles and the events calendar, continued to be issued at monthly intervals. During 2020 this monthly digital newsletter was emailed to **Ivie**'s more than 2,600 contacts. A total of 101 new people subscribed to the Newsletter during 2020.

Figure 9.Number of visits to **Ivie**'s websites





Figure 10. Visits to **Ivie**'s website by geographical region in 2020
