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1. THE INSTITUTE'S MAIN OBJECTIVES

The Valencian Institute of Economic Research (Instituto Valenciano de Investigaciones Económicas, **lvie**) works to promote and conduct economic research and disseminate it in Spain and abroad.

Created in 1990 by the Department of Economy and Finance of the Generalitat Valenciana (Valencian Regional Government), the **lvie** is supported by CaixaBank, Ford Spain, BBVA Foundation, Mediterráneo Foundation, Cañada Blanch Foundation and Ceca Foundation of commercial and savings banks (Fundación de las Cajas de Ahorros).

The **lvie** has two main aims: to create stable teams of specialists capable of producing a steady output of research in certain areas of general interest; and to help build bridges between research and the decisions made by economic agents. Many of those decisions require careful analysis of the available options, taking research findings, statistical information and the experience of specialists into account. The **lvie** therefore also offers technical assistance in economic matters to institutions and companies that request it.

To achieve its goals, the **lvie** organizes its work in lines of theoretical and applied research, with the support of various shared services. The research activity is carried out by the Institute's research associates, who have extensive academic experience, and its staff of economists and subject specialists.

To carry out its activities and execute its projects, the **lvie** has built relationships with large numbers of researchers and has entered into collaboration agreements with various universities. It supports the economic research groups in carrying out and disseminating their activities and promotes the exploitation of their research efforts for the benefit of society.

The **lvie** started its activities in November 1990. Throughout this period it has been sponsored by the Valencian Regional Government's Ministry of Finance, which has allowed it to foster economic research. The rest of its activities are financed through partnership agreements and contracts with various public and private sector institutions in Spain, Europe and the Americas.

Francisco Alcalá (*Center for Economic Policy Research*)

Dr Alcalá is a graduate in Economics with special honors (1980), holds a Master in Economics from CIDE (Center for Research and Teaching in Economics, Mexico, 1983) and has a PhD from the Universitat de València (1985). At present he is Research Fellow at the Center for Economic Policy Research (London) and member of the Advisory Board of the Ministry of Transport, Mobility and Urban Agenda. Ángel Soler (*Universitat de València*)





The **lvie** is annually controlled by independent auditors with the aim of receiving opinions regarding the quality of the financial data which the Administration Board develops.

In 2011, the **lvie** created the **lvie** Foundation of the Valencian Community to increase the development of economic research and education activities of general interest and to strengthen the collaboration with other institutions in this area. Since 2013, the **lvie** is a research center associated to the Universitat de València, registered in the Spanish Registry of Universities, Centres and Qualifications (RUCT).

En este sentido, no hemos prestado servicios distintos a los de la auditoría de cuentas ni han concurrido situaciones o circunstancias que, de acuerdo con lo establecido en la citada normativa reguladora, hayan afectado a la necesaria independencia de modo que se haya visto comprometida.

Consideramos que la evidencia de auditoría que hemos obtenido proporciona una base suficiente y adecuada para nuestra opinión.

Aspectos más relevantes de la auditoría

Los aspectos más relevantes de la auditoría son aquellos que, según nuestro juicio profesional, han sido considerados como los riesgos de incorrección material más significativos en nuestra auditoría de las cuentas anuales abreviadas del período actual. Estos riesgos han sido tratados en el contexto de nuestra auditoría de las cuentas anuales abreviadas en su conjunto, y en la formación de nuestra opinión sobre éstas, y no expresamos una opinión por separado sobre esos riesgos.

Reconocimiento de ingresos

Descripción El importe de la cifra de negocios corresponde a los ingresos por prestaciones de servicios en concepto de proyectos de investigación económica a escala nacional e internacional, cuya duración, en determinados casos, puede ser superior al ejercicio. El reconocimiento de ingresos y los resultados de estos proyectos requiere, por tanto, un elevado grado de juicio y control de las estimaciones realizadas y de las desviaciones que se pudieran producir a lo largo de la duración de los mismos. Las estimaciones tienen en cuenta todos los ingresos y costes relacionados con los proyectos. Debido a la incertidumbre asociada a las citadas estimaciones y a que cambios en las mismas podrían dar lugar a diferencias en los ingresos registrados, se ha considerado este asunto como un aspecto relevante de la auditoría.

Nuestra respuesta Nuestros procedimientos de auditoría han consistido en evaluar los procedimientos y criterios empleados por la Sociedad para el reconocimiento de los ingresos y costes asociados a los proyectos. Seleccionamos una muestra representativa de los proyectos para evaluar las estimaciones más significativas llevadas a cabo en el reconocimiento de ingresos. Asimismo, hemos obtenido confirmaciones externas para una muestra de clientes pendientes de cobro y realizando, en su caso, procedimientos de comprobación alternativos mediante justificantes de cobro posteriores o documentación soporte justificativa de la prestación del servicio. Por último, hemos evaluado la idoneidad de la información revelada en las cuentas anuales abreviadas de acuerdo con los requerimientos del marco normativo de información financiera.

Responsabilidad de los administradores en relación con las cuentas anuales abreviadas

Los administradores son responsables de formular las cuentas anuales abreviadas adjuntas, de forma que expresen la imagen fiel del patrimonio, de la situación financiera y de los resultados de la Sociedad, de conformidad con el marco normativo de información financiera aplicable a la Entidad en España, y del control interno que consideren necesario para permitir la preparación de cuentas anuales abreviadas libres de incorrección material, debida a fraude o error.

En la preparación de las cuentas anuales abreviadas, los administradores son responsables de la valoración de la capacidad de la Sociedad para continuar como empresa en funcionamiento, revelando, según corresponda, las cuestiones relacionadas con la empresa en funcionamiento y utilizando el principio contable de empresa en funcionamiento excepto si los administradores tienen la intención de liquidar la Sociedad o de cesar sus operaciones, o bien no exista otra alternativa realista.

Responsabilidades del auditor en relación con la auditoría de las cuentas anuales abreviadas

Nuestros objetivos son obtener una seguridad razonable de que las cuentas anuales abreviadas en su conjunto están libres de incorrección material, debida a fraude o error, y emitir un informe de auditoría que contiene nuestra opinión.

Seguridad razonable es un alto grado de seguridad pero no garantiza que una auditoría realizada de conformidad con la normativa reguladora de la actividad de auditoría de cuentas vigente en España siempre detecte una incorrección material cuando existe. Las incorrecciones pueden deberse a fraude o error y se consideran materiales si, individualmente o de forma agregada, puede preverse razonablemente que influyan en las decisiones económicas que los usuarios toman basándose en las cuentas anuales abreviadas.

Como parte de una auditoría de conformidad con la normativa reguladora de la actividad de auditoría de cuentas vigente en España, aplicamos nuestro juicio profesional y mantenemos una actitud de escepticismo profesional durante toda la auditoría. También:

- Identificamos y valoramos los riesgos de incorrección material en las cuentas anuales abreviadas, debida a fraude o error, diseñamos y aplicamos procedimientos de auditoría para responder a dichos riesgos y obtenemos evidencia de auditoría suficiente y adecuada para proporcionar una base para nuestra opinión. El riesgo de no detectar una incorrección material debida a fraude es más elevado que en el caso de una incorrección material debida a error, ya que el fraude puede implicar colusión, falsificación, omisiones deliberadas, manifestaciones intencionadamente erróneas, o la elusión del control interno.
- Obtenemos conocimiento del control interno relevante para la auditoría con el fin de diseñar procedimientos de auditoría que sean adecuados en función de las circunstancias, y no con la finalidad de expresar una opinión sobre la eficacia del control interno de la Entidad.
- Evaluamos si las políticas contables aplicadas son adecuadas y la razonabilidad de las estimaciones contables y la correspondiente información revelada por los administradores.
- Concluimos sobre si es adecuada la utilización, por los administradores, del principio contable de empresa en funcionamiento y, basándonos en la evidencia de auditoría obtenida, concluimos sobre si existe o no una incertidumbre material relacionada con hechos o con condiciones que pueden generar dudas significativas sobre la capacidad de la Sociedad para continuar como empresa en funcionamiento. Si concluimos que existe una incertidumbre material, se requiere que llamemos la atención en nuestro informe de auditoría sobre la correspondiente información revelada en las cuentas anuales abreviadas o, si dichas revelaciones no son adecuadas, que expresemos una opinión modificada. Nuestras conclusiones se basan en la evidencia de auditoría obtenida hasta la fecha de nuestro informe de auditoría. Sin embargo, los hechos o condiciones futuros pueden ser la causa de que la Sociedad deje de ser una empresa en funcionamiento.
- Evaluamos la presentación global, la estructura y el contenido de las cuentas anuales abreviadas, incluida la información revelada, y si las cuentas anuales abreviadas representan las transacciones y hechos subyacentes de un modo que logran expresar la imagen fiel.

Nos comunicamos con los administradores de la Entidad en relación con, entre otras cuestiones, el alcance y el momento de realización de la auditoría planificados y los hallazgos significativos de la auditoría, así como cualquier deficiencia significativa del control interno que identifiquemos en el transcurso de la auditoría.

Entre los riesgos significativos que han sido objeto de comunicación a los administradores de la Entidad, determinamos los que han sido de la mayor significatividad en la auditoría de las cuentas anuales abreviadas del período actual y que son, en consecuencia, los riesgos considerados más significativos.

Describimos esos riesgos en nuestro informe de auditoría salvo que las disposiciones legales o reglamentarias prohíban revelar públicamente la cuestión.

Esta comunicación se realiza para el conocimiento y uso de los administradores, y por consiguiente no debe utilizarse para ninguna otra finalidad.




Gráfico 3.


7.1. Contracts with other institutions

BBVA FOUNDATION-IVIE RESEARCH PROGRAM

The BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** have been regularly pursuing various joint lines of research since 1995. The current program is designed to continue this partnership, consolidating priority research areas, and taking into account the strengths of accumulated experience and the new challenges facing Spanish society. Currently, its core lines are *Development, Productivity and Competitiveness in the Digital Age*, *Well-being and Sustainability*, and *Business, Institutions and Policy Evaluation*.

In 2022, the following projects were developed for the BBVA Foundation:

Capital stock in Spain and its regions (1964-2022) (2021-2022)

The document, developed jointly by BBVA Foundation and **Ivie** in 2022, presents the key results of investment and capital endowments for the Spanish economy.

The updated database covers the period 1964-2022 and is broken down by regions and provinces, tangible and intangible assets and industry sectors. The data on investment and capital stock has been updated until 2022 using nowcasting techniques, which is a significant new feature of this edition and enables the analysis of the effects of COVID-19 on capital accumulation in Spain, as well as the trajectory of the subsequent recovery. The richness of the databank allows us to examine the trajectory of capitalization from a variety of angles, making it an essential tool to determine the sources of growth in Spain which has been used in over 1,000 research studies.

The document describes the methodologies utilized for the construction of the databank and the evolution of investment patterns and capital stock since 1995, both at the national and regional levels. It also highlights the most significant changes brought on by the pandemic and their effects on growth.

U-Ranking 2022. Synthetic indicators of Spanish universities (2022)

The aim of the ISSUE (Indicadores Sintéticos del Sistema Universitario Español – Synthetic Indicators of the Spanish University System) project, jointly developed by the Ivie and the BBVA Foundation, is to analyze the performance of Spanish universities and to offer comparable and synthetic images of these higher education institutions. As a result of this work, each year U-Ranking is published, based on the analysis of the teaching, research and innovation and technological development activities of the universities. The 2022 edition also includes an analysis of postgraduate education in Spain: master's and doctoral degrees..

Present and outlook for Spanish youths (2021-2022)

The aim of this study is to take an in-depth look at the current situation and outlook of Spain's younger generations, based on the extensive empirical evidence available. The main part of the analysis will focus on the employment and economic aspects that most affect the condition in which people live. The large amount of data and statistics available make it possible to study the differences between youths and mature adults, and the differences among young people of the same generation. The project aims to assess the significant differences among generations, after eliminating factors that differentiate people of the same

generation. The results may aid in the design of public policies to support the social and labor integration of young people.

Collective response to the COVID-19 pandemic (2021-2022)

The objective of this study is to take an in-depth look from a broad perspective and with a multidisciplinary approach at the collective response from public and private agents to the problems created by the COVID-19 pandemic. The study will consider the capacity of response and coordination of governments and also of other public and private agents, i.e., firms, education system, health system, productive sectors, the world of knowledge, population in general. The analysis of the changes in behavior over the duration of the crisis will make it possible to examine the collective learning capacity and resilience (resistance and reinvention) of the Spanish society as a whole.

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The value of knowledge in the response of the health system to COVID-19 (2021-2022)

The objective of this project is to analyze the value of knowledge in responding to problems as critical as the one the world is facing with the pandemic. This interesting case study allows us to appreciate not only the importance of having knowledge (discoveries of biomedicine) and applying it (production of treatments and vaccines); but it also allows us to examine how a country, particularly Spain, responds to important problems and the ability to cope of their public health care system (e.g. human resources, technological equipment/infrastructure, organization, management, etc.). An important aspect of this knowledge involves the impact on health and on the economy of the measures implemented to control de spread and avoid

the collapse of hospitals. During the last year, much progress was made in the modeling of public health care non-pharmacological interventions and their impact, and in the creation and global sharing of large epidemiological databases.

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The digitization of the business fabric in Spain: productive transformation and competition (2021-2022)

One of the key issues that will determine the future of the productive sectors is their rate of digital penetration, as it will define their capacity to grow, compete and adapt. This study will analyze the pace at which the digital transformation of the productive fabric is taking place, whether the Spanish economy is flexible enough to meet the challenge of digital transformation, and the intensity of competition in the productive sectors, comparing whether it is greater or lesser in the sectors most affected by digitalization.

The study will combine an aggregate view of the productive sectors of the Spanish economy with a micro analysis that uses firms as the main unit. The aggregate sectoral perspective will make it possible to evaluate, to the extent that the available indicators allow, the impact of the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic on the progress of digitalization. While the microeconomic firm data will enrich the analyses by allowing the study of intra-industry dynamics and market power situations, although, due to the time lag with which this information is available, they will not yet allow to determine the effects of COVID-19.

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Productivity in Spain, before and after COVID-19 (2022-)

Compared to other countries, the trajectory of Spain's productivity during most of the 21st century is a matter of concern. This is reflected both in the irregular and weak progress of its labor productivity -per employee or per hour worked- and, even more so, in the decline of its total factor productivity, which indicates a negative evolution of efficiency and a poor use of the economy's capitalization effort. The result is a weakening of Spain's international competitiveness and capacity to generate value and sustain the relative welfare of its inhabitants in comparison with other countries. Although the problem has been known for years and noted by specialists, the attention paid to it in the design of public and private policies is inadequate.

For this reason, the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** have envisaged the construction of a productivity observatory in Spain to generate data on a regular basis and carry out detailed analyses of the problem in the current circumstances. Through a rigorous selection of indicators, the Productivity and Competitiveness Observatory (Observatorio PROCOMP Fundación BBVA-Ivie) will generate systematic information on the productivity and competitiveness of the Spanish economy. The Observatory will have an international perspective and will provide an updated monitoring of these problems in Spain, reinforced by an in-depth analysis of different topics.

This report will offer an overview of the annual figures and main novelties of the new database on the System of Indicators of National and International Productivity, and will provide a specific analysis of the evolution of productivity in Spain before and after COVID-19.

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Digitalization and human resources: the transformation of professions (2022-)

The aim of this study is to analyze the role of human resources in the digitalization of companies and institutions, focusing on the transformation of tasks, activities, processes and jobs, and their redefinition. With this in mind, the report will discuss issues raised by the identification and development of digital competencies in the digitization processes of organizations, as well as the role of human resources management and development, and occupational health and safety.

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Spain in the face of recent impacts on global value chains (2022-)

The aim of this report is to empirically analyze from the Spanish perspective, three issues related to the functioning of global value chains and their disruptions:

1. The development of these chains over the last two decades and the position Spain's economy occupies in them
2. The evolution of the degree of international connection between economies as a result of these chains, and the intensity and geographical bias of Spanish connections.
3. The extent of recent shocks on value chains and the degree of connection, as well as the capacity to adapt to shocks, with special reference to the EU and Spain.

The analysis will be carried out at national and international level, with special emphasis on the Spanish economy and its competitive situation in international trade networks, its evolution in recent years and the degree to which it has been affected by recent shocks, such as the pandemic and the war in Ukraine. Attention will also be paid to the differences between trade in goods and services, both affected differently by the pandemic and the war, as well as to some sectoral differences between sectors in which global value chains have had different levels of development.

The adaptation of the Spanish industry to the energy scenario and digital transition (2022-)

This report aims to carry out a diagnosis of the Spanish industry to identify strengths and weaknesses, as well as threats and opportunities for industrial sectors in the face of a future framed by three vectors: the risks posed by accelerated globalization; the need to address digital transformation as a lever to gain competitiveness; and the reinforcement of respect for the environment, which requires improving energy efficiency and at the same time provides an opportunity for Spain to invest advantageously in sectors producing renewable energies with new technologies.

Within the framework of the opportunity provided by the European recovery funds associated with the NextGenerationEU, this diagnosis should identify the industrial productive branches in which Spain has competitive advantages in the current international context, the factors that limit its productivity gains and those that can contribute to defining a new growth model which is more typical of an advanced society, in which knowledge-based activities increase in importance.

In 2018, the **Ivie**, in collaboration with the Valencian Regional Government, started the Laboratory for the Analysis and Evaluation of Public Policy (IvieLAB) to study the action of governments and government agencies in different areas. IvieLAB serves to promote a debate, design of new methodologies and development of tools (such as databases and indicators) to foster knowledge and awareness of the state of public policy in Spain. In 2022, through the IvieLAB program, two sessions of the 5th Valencian Economic Congress were organized in which a diagnosis of the Valencian economy was made, analyzing both its trajectory over the last 40 years and its future challenges. The first session was held on 28 June in Alicante, and the second took place on 28 and 29 November in Valencia. In addition, 10 projects have been developed resulting in reports and dissemination documents that address issues such as the use of Next Generation funds, foreign investment in the Valencian Community and the place of women in the ownership and corporate governance of Valencian companies. The Price-Monitoring Observatory of the Valencian Region has also been developed in which the **Ivie** also collaborates.

The Valencian economy... 40 years after the 1982 Statute of Autonomy was approved (2022)

The Valencian economy in 2022 is very different from that of 1982, when the Statute of Autonomy was approved. Since then, it has doubled its production volume and has undergone many other relevant changes, derived from the evolution and transformation experienced within and outside the Region. This report describes what has been achieved in these 40 years since the Statute of Autonomy was approved, but also the challenges that still remain.

Current situation and challenges facing the Valencian economy (2022)

The first two decades of the 21st century have witnessed an accumulation of technological, geopolitical and economic changes that have profoundly changed the conditions in which firms and territories must compete and societies can prosper. The 2008 financial crisis, the 2020 pandemic and the current war conflict in European territory, following Russia's aggression on Ukraine, have led to some very intense upheavals on the economic scene, adding changes to those long driven by powerful currents such as digitalization, globalization and growing concern about climate change.

Responding to so many challenges at once is not easy, but not facing them increases the risks of failure, even for the Comunitat Valenciana. This project develops a synthetic and objective diagnosis of the Valencian economy based on recent available information that marks the starting point of the current situation and the future challenges facing the Valencian Region.

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Analysis of the presence of women in management positions in Valencian companies (2022)

The study aims to make a first assessment of the situation of women in management positions in firms in the Valencian Community. The project will examine the degree of participation of women in capital structures, corporate governance and management in different types of firms and in different scenarios.

The project includes data on firms of all sectors, sizes and characteristics. The analysis of the similarities and differences across sectors, provinces and industries is an important step to establish policies that reduce inequalities and improve the governance and competitiveness of Valencian companies. The study will allow to identify advanced contexts in the search for gender equality and to investigate possible barriers or facilitators, suggesting possible public policy levers that contribute to gender equality in Valencian companies.

The project will be developed with secondary data from the SABI database with information on more than 315,000 Valencian companies.

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Observatory of digital transformation in the Valencian Region (2022)

This Observatory will allow to compare the degree of digitalization of the Valencian Region with the national average and that of other regions, as well as analyzing the evolution in recent years. For this, a wide range of indicators will be used to cover the digitization of the different economic agents (companies, households and public administrations), combining the information that appears in various reports and databases. In this way, it will be possible to make a diagnosis of the digitization of the Valencian Community, detecting the main weaknesses and areas in which public policies must have an impact.

In addition, the Observatory will offer a quantification of the digital economy in the Valencian Region in terms of contribution to GDP and employment, using the methodological approaches of the OECD and the European Commission, which offer a classification of productive branches according to their degree of digitization. The Observatory includes a system of indicators and a brief report.

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Observatory on the productive specialization of the Valencian Community (2022)

The objective of this report is to create an observatory that allows a detailed analysis of the productive areas of the Valencian economy, in order to provide up to date information with the highest breakdown possible. The disaggregation is possible at a level of 61 industries for the national comparison and 41 at regional level. With this sectorial detail, the report analyzes the position of the Valencian Region in terms of specialization and productivity, as well as other indicators of interest such as business demographics, economic-financial indicators and indicators of financial vulnerability of the companies belonging to each area of economic activity.

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Indicators of price effects in the Valencian economy. Price-monitoring Observatory of the Valencian Community (2022-)

The Ivie has developed through the IviLAB project, a Price-monitoring Observatory of the Valencian Community, an initiative promoted by the Valencian Regional Government, whose objective is to monitor the effects of the evolution of prices in the economy of the Valencian Community in comparison with Spain and other Spanish regions.

The Observatory aims to provide the tools to build a public system of information and provide a continuous price monitoring of products, goods and services that affect consumer impact the most.

The project includes a database with a system of indicators based on the detailed information of the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which is completed with other price indexes in different areas such as industrial, housing, urban land, trade and tourism. It contains data which is updated on a monthly basis for the Valencian Community, the rest of the Spanish regions and Spain.

Data from Spanish official statistical sources will be used, especially the monthly data provided by Spain's National Statistics Institute (INE). Special attention will be placed on price indicators for products, with a detailed analysis of those that may be increasing excessively and of the underlying inflation that will reveal in greater detail the situation of the Valencian economy.

In addition to the database, the project will include a set of monthly reports showing a quantitative and qualitative analysis of the monthly price evolution in the Valencian Community.

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Evaluation of the participation of Valencian companies in recovery funds (2022)

Ivie's 2020 IvieLAB report on the effects of centralizing government services in Madrid, Spain's capital city, and the 2021 report on the presence of Valencian companies in public procurement procedures of the state public sector (SPE) have shown the existence of a shift towards companies that have their headquarters in Madrid: 60% of the SPE tenders of the contracting bodies located in the capital city awarded to Spanish companies have their headquarters in Madrid, raising the percentage to 65% if the amount of the contracts is considered. On the other hand, the 2021 report shows that the tenders of Valencian companies in public procurement markets are less than what the productive fabric of the region would allow.

These results make it advisable to monitor this issue also for the specific case of tenders financed with European recovery funds, due to the opportunity they represent. With this objective in mind, the report will analyze the following issues: the weight of companies from the Valencian Region in the awards made in the public procurement of Spanish public administrations, in terms of number of tenders and amount of the contract; disaggregated information by size of the company, branches of activity and provinces; type of contract; characteristics of the awarded companies; comparison of the weight of Valencian companies with the rest of the Spanish regions in national tenders , etc.

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Evaluation of the implementation of the European Funds (2022)

The objective of this study is to monitor the specific case of the Valencian Region in the implementation of the European funds, both those assigned to the autonomous communities and those of which the local city councils are responsible for, providing a comparative view with other Spanish regions and with the General State Administration.

The information analyzed includes tenders for contracts and subsidies. In both cases, the Government of Spain provides information on its website on the distribution of funds (with the lists of tenders for contracts and subsidies), which is the reference information for monitoring the degree of implementation. In the case

of tenders, information is provided by the Public Sector Procurement Platform. In the case of subsidies, the Government of Spain offers a database with information on all the calls for proposals financed by the Recovery, Transformation and Resilience Plan, which allows monitoring, focusing attention on those called in the Valencian Community. Detailed information on each subsidy can be obtained from the National System of Information on Subsidies and Public Aids. For the specific case of the Comunitat Valenciana, it is possible to analyze other issues of interest, such as the degree of implementation, differentiating by ministries, companies and other public bodies dependent on the regional administration and local councils.

The project will consider the balances/imbances derived from the relationship between under-funding and economic growth and the evolution of tax collection prior to the 2008 crisis and its subsequent collapse, considering the following aspects of the problem:

- analysis of the differences in regional patterns of convergence and growth prior to and after the 2008 crisis
- relationship with demographic and economic dynamics
- connection-correlation between the favorable pre-crisis prospects and the unfavorable regional funding distribution in 2002 and 2009
- analysis of the evolution of the normative and effective tax collection in the different regions prior to and after the 2008 crisis and its causes
- analysis of the elasticity of tax collection with respect to the GDP of the different assigned taxes
- prospects for the long-term evolution of the collection of assigned taxes as a function of expected economic growth, their composition and the elasticities of collection with respect to economic growth
- possible fiscal and redistributive compensation mechanisms: advantages and disadvantages in terms of reinforcing or slowing down the country's overall economic growth
- the advisability of contemplating a special regime, federal district, in the financial, administrative and political spheres, which would prevent tax competition with the other territories.

El informe abarcará todas las empresas valencianas presentes en dicha base de datos, que actualmente cuenta, en el ámbito nacional, con más de 2,5 millones de empresas. El objetivo es poder responder a preguntas como las siguientes: ¿A qué sectores se dirige principalmente la inversión extranjera? ¿Cómo ha cambiado el patrón en los últimos años? ¿A qué tipo de empresas se dirige la inversión extranjera? ¿A las más rentables? ¿A las más grandes? ¿Más eficientes o más solventes? ¿Qué países son los que más apetito inversor tienen en la Comunitat Valenciana? ¿Qué características tienen las empresas valencianas que tienen filiales en el extranjero? ¿Qué sectores valencianos son los más activos invirtiendo?

HUMAN CAPITAL, EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT

The quality of employment in Spain and its regions (2021-2022)

This report aims to evaluate the quality of employment in Spain and its regions. Until the outbreak of the coronavirus, the employed population in Spain had increased steadily since 2014, from 16.95 million employed at the beginning of that year to 19.67 million at the end of 2019. Despite falling short of recovering the employment peaks recorded at the end of 2007 (20.75 million), the levels substantially increased over the 2014-2019 period. Although initially the coronavirus had a profound impact on the labor market, it is difficult to predict the intensity and duration of the long-term negative effects.

A proper assessment of the labor market should combine the analysis of quantitative aspects of employment (number of employed people) with the quality of employment. To accomplish this, the study aims to address various aspects related to the qualitative side of employment, for example, relevant job characteristics such as salary, type of contract (permanent, temporary or self-employed), job position, schedule (full- or part-time), number of working hours, possibilities of teleworking, exposure to health risks, etc. All of these factors have an effect on the quality of employment, making a job more or less attractive in terms of pay, stability and satisfaction. Another factor that will be addressed is the degree of match between job characteristics and workers' preferences (e.g. whether educational level corresponds with job requirements; satisfaction with type of contract in the case of part-time, etc.). In addition, the analysis will include data on gender differences and the study of specific groups of interest, such as, young people, elderly people, workers with basic education and immigrants.

Resiliency and equal educational opportunities at the regional level (2022-)

The project aims to identify factors that improve equal educational opportunities at regional level and the policies needed to achieve it. The term "resiliency" is relatively new in this area but has recently gained popularity. Based on this approach, a student is considered resilient if, despite growing up in an unfavorable socioeconomic environment, he or she has overcome obstacles to achieve above average educational results. The socioeconomic environment of origin is formed by the social, economic and cultural context in which each student has developed. Since the socioeconomic environment of origin is less of a determining factor in the educational performance of a student, the greater the percentage of these types of students, the greater the equality of opportunities in the educational system and the more inclusive the system will be.

The use of the concept of resiliency to measure equality of opportunity has the advantage of focusing on those who need it most and, thus, giving greater importance of equal educational opportunities. The PISA survey will be used in all its available waves, which could be used to exploit the variations equality of opportunity among Spanish regions and even across countries.

Digital economy of the Spanish Regions (2021-2022)

The objective of this project is to assess and compare the degree of progress of the Spanish regions in digitalization, highlighting the greatest differences among them. The proposed approach consists of analyzing how digitalization penetrates the sectors through two fundamental channels that generate value: investments in digital assets and the structure of occupations with different degrees of digitalization. In this way, the impact of digitalization can be quantified by estimating its contribution to value added/GDP. To develop this approach, the project will rely on an innovative methodology and the creation of its own database.

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Talent attraction and retention capacity of Spanish autonomous communities. Third Report (2022)

This study has two main objectives. First, it proposes to draw up the 2022 Talent Ranking Map of Spain, as a continuation of the previous editions (2019, 2021) prepared jointly by the Cotec Foundation and **Ivie**. This index follows the methodology used by INSEAD in the Global Talent Competitiveness Index (GTCI), a report that is already in its eighth edition and is currently available for more than 130 countries (134 in the 2021 edition), covering around 701 variables related to the ability to attract and retain talent. In its latest edition, several changes have been made adapting it to the times of COVID-19.

This first objective involves updating the existing database, based on available information from different institutions that produce data on a regular basis (such as Eurostat, Spanish Statistics Institute [INE], European Commission, among others), always assuming they are available at regional level. The availability of this information will allow to analyze the impact of talent attraction and retention capability on growth in Spain and its 17 regions. Additionally, it will help identify strengths and areas in which to improve, and analyze changes in the ranking with respect to the previous study.

The second objective of the proposal refers to the construction of a revised, or more complete, version of the Talent Map of Spain, including aspects that have not been covered in the INSEAD Index, such as the availability of airport connections, hotel infrastructure development, healthcare management quality, cultural offers, existing multinational companies or even the weather or climate, among others, which are undoubtedly of particular relevance in the ability of the regions to attract or retain talent, and also in a time marked by the impact of COVID-19. It will also make it possible to place Spanish regions in an international context, comparing them with other developed countries (mainly in Europe).

The objective of this study is to develop a map of talent for Portugal in 2021, following the methodology used for Spain and its regions. The Cotec-**Ivie** Index considers the characteristics of developed countries, along with their strengths and weaknesses in facing the challenges in a post-COVID-19 scenario. In order to accomplish this, the following variables representing the major challenges posed by the pandemic have been considered: 1) resources available in the healthcare system; 2) vulnerability of businesses and workers; 3) level of digitalization of the economy; and 4) ability to address equality problems (gender, income and qualification). The Cotec-**Ivie** Index includes these variables that analyze the capability of different countries or regions to attract, grow, retain and enable talent.

Study to submit a proposal to apply for the declaration of an area of Valencia as an urban technological enclave location (2022)

The aim of this project is to develop a technical report to offer advice and support to the City Council of València as they initiate the application process to declare certain areas of Valencia as urban technological enclave locations with the Regional Ministry of Industry in accordance with Law 14/2018 dated June 5 "Gestión, Modernización y Promoción de las Áreas Industriales de la Comunitat Valenciana (Management, Modernization and Promotion of Industrial Areas of the Valencian Community)" and the Decree 258/2019 of the Consell dated December 13 that regulates regional registry and procedures in relation to industrial areas of the Valencian Community.

The City Council of València intends to request that an area of València (La Marina, El Puerto, the Universitat de València, the Universitat Politècnica de València, the Harinera, the Naves and the Polígono de Vara de Quart) be classified as an urban technological enclave location.

This study will provide information to initiate the application procedure and, when needed, offer advice to the Civil Council for the preparation of additional data. In particular, it will provide detailed information demonstrating that the area requested constitutes an environment for the generation and transfer of knowledge. Indicators will be constructed from official sources and objective data to analyze the suitability of the areas initially proposed to integrate the urban technological enclave, in accordance with the regulations. The system of indicators constructed will be compiled in the form of a database. Likewise, the base information will be largely georeferenced, so that it can be representation graphically with choropleth maps.

Economic and fiscal impact of Mercadona and its supply chain in 2021 (2022)

The objective of the study is to estimate the total economic impact generated by Mercadona during 2021 in terms of employment and income (value added), distinguishing among direct, indirect and induced impacts. The economic impact of Mercadona is generated both through its activity or operations (sale of its products) and its investments.

The report estimates the impacts at an aggregate level as well as by sectors. In this way, in addition to Mercadona's total contribution to the Spanish economy's GDP and employment, results will also be provided by sector of activity. Thus it will be possible to identify and quantify the sectors or productive branches in which Mercadona (and its supply chain) has the greatest economic impact.

In summary, the report estimates the total impact of Mercadona and its contribution to GDP and employment of the Spanish economy. The report will also estimate the tax return obtained by the Public Administration as a result of Mercadona's activity. For this purpose, the tax revenues obtained by the public sector through the different taxes associated with production, trade or the generation of income are also quantified.

Economic impact of Grupo Cooperativo Cajamar (2022)

The project consists in the development of two reports on the economic impact of Grupo Cooperativo Cajamar (GCC) during 2020, one with aggregate data and the other consists of a final comprehensive report. The project will estimate the impact that GCC activity generates in Spain in terms of value added (GDP), employment and fiscal return. The methodology used to estimate the impact is based on the input-output analysis on the total economic impact (direct, indirect and induced) derived from the increase in demand generated by GCC activity.

The reports will estimate the impacts generated through two channels. On the one hand, the impacts derived from financial intermediation activity and, on the other hand, those generated from the demand of consumption and investment financed by GCC through loans granted to both companies and individuals.

A feasibility study of the economic impact of traditional festivities in the Valencian Community (2022-)

The celebration of traditional holidays in the Valencian Community involves a great rise in demand in various current expenditures and investments that are made by several agents involved in organizing and sharing in these holidays, including visitors, organizers, media, sponsors, etc. The Valencian Community experiences an economic impact in income generation and job creation as a consequence of this rise in demand.

However, the visitor's net impact on the Valencian economy only takes into account spending incurred by non-residents, since in the case of residents it is assumed that they would have made the same expenditure regardless of whether the celebration took place or not. As a result, the economic impact of many popular holidays that are of local nature and whose participants are locals or residents of nearby municipalities, would be null because they involve a transfer of costs within the Valencian Community.

Therefore, the aim of this study is to collect information to determine which traditional holidays are relevant to carry out an economic impact report. This analysis is done for both the internationally significant traditional festivals observed within the Valencian Community and those that have been designated as National Tourist Attractions, such as, Fallas, Sant Joan Bonfires, Magdalena, Misteri d'Elx, Moors and Christians, Tomatina of Buñol or Bous a la Mar of Dénia. The list is made up of 14 international holidays and 25 national ones.

Technical assistance to AIReF for the development of the study on active employment policies in Extremadura (2022-)

The purpose of this project is to provide technical assistance to the AIReF with their study on Active Employment Policies (AEP) in the Spanish region of Extremadura. AEPs play a fundamental role in improving the employability of workers, increasing employment opportunities and contributing to a better match between job vacancies and potential workers.

Criteria to determine the location of state public sector headquarters (2022)

The objective of this project is to collaborate with the Advisory Commission of the Ministry of Territorial Policy in charge of establishing the procedure for the determination of the physical headquarters of the entities belonging to the state institutional public sector. The purpose of this project is to define the following:

- A theoretical framework that justifies the idea that the location of the physical headquarters of a public entity is positive for a city or a region.
- The general criteria that the Commission should take into consideration when determining the headquarters of a public entity.

In order to respond to this need, the **Ivie** is committed to developing a study that analyzes relevant aspects in the location of the headquarters of the state institutional public sector, based on the premise that the territorial deconcentration of the General State Administration plays a structuring role in the territory.

The work will analyze general socioeconomic aspects such as the creation of direct and indirect jobs, public procurement contracts, strengthening of communications, citizen participation and equal opportunities, and the fight against depopulation, among others. As a result of the work, a list will be defined of the

criteria to be taken into account on the location and the arguments that in each case may guide the Commission to make a decision in this sense.

Estimation of unit costs associated with the development of GIS (Geographic Information System) measures under the 2021-2027 CAP (Common Agricultural Policy) Strategic Plan (2022)

The objective of this project is to revise the information sources and update the indicators to calculate the unit costs associated with the development of different GIS (Geographic Information System) measures within the framework of the New 2021-2027 CAP (Common Agricultural Policy) Strategic Plan. A cost study to justify the amounts of the premiums, which also calculates the additional costs and the loss of income as a consequence of agreements made, as well as the amount of transaction costs, etc., is needed to carry out an adequate implementation of the EU regulations for the new CAP Strategic Plan.

First of all, this work includes the analysis and estimation of the maximum amounts destined to the main eligible investments funded by the European agricultural fund for rural development (EAFRD) of the Directorate General of the CAP: Conservation of rice cultivation in wetlands; Conservation and improvement of native sheep (Guirra); Conservation of organic farming practices; Maintenance of organic farming; and Beekeeping as a method to conserve biodiversity.

In addition, it includes the analysis of the information and the corresponding estimate of unfavorable compensation payments in Natura 2000 Network areas to improve the conservation of steppe birds linked to arable land surface and the loss of income derived from their implementation: Conservation and Development of Natura 2000 Network and start-up grants for young farmers from the Directorate General for Agriculture.

Report on financial inclusion in Spain (2022)

The objective of this project is to study the concentration of the population in Spain that do not have physical access to banking services in their municipality, thus, quantifying the percentage of “financially excluded” municipalities over the total. This information allows to draw the map of financial exclusion in Spain at municipal level, which is needed to quantify the problem and implement possible solutions.

In addition to calculating the percentage of population with no access to banking services in their town or village, it is of interest to estimate, for these municipalities, the distance a person needs to travel and the time it would take them to access bank services in a nearby town. Access time is a variable that is frequently used as an indicator of accessibility. The report also takes into account other forms of access to banking services, such as ATM machines, financial agents and post offices. In this way, it is possible to quantify both access to banking services and access to withdrawing or depositing cash, through ATMs, for example. The idea is to show how the percentage of the financially “excluded” population and the distance and average access times decrease when other forms of financial services, besides actual banks, are considered.

Data for the analysis of the European ICT industry (PREDICT). Fourth phase. The twin green & digital transition (2022)

The study aims to update the report developed for the European Commission's Joint Research Center, through the PREDICT project, which covers not only the ICT sector and its R&D investment, but also the Content and Media and Online and Catalogue Retail sectors. In addition, it assesses the intensive use of ICT in European industries and the EU's position in the global value chain of technological products.

In this fourth phase of the project, the Ivie will also provide data on the progress made by European Union countries in the digital and green transition, especially after receiving the Next Generation EU funds. The expanded database includes digital transformation indicators as well as environmental protection and resource management activities not only for ICT and related sectors, but for all industries.

System of indicators on the Valencian economy 2022 (2022)

The objective of this proposal is to expand the work plan defined in the 2021 project developed for AVE on the design and creation of a system of indicators to regularly monitor the activity of the Valencian economy. The system was made up of 61 indicators that were grouped into different fields, allowing to compare the Valencian Region on a national level, with some indicators also offering a European comparison.

- This year's collaboration with AVE has a double objective. On the one hand, to provide updated information on a regular basis and, on the other hand, to have a more detailed analysis of the main economic changes reflected by the indicators. In this sense, the collaboration will include the following products:
- System of conjunctural indicators with monthly periodicity. A group of 25 indicators are selected and updated every month and will be grouped into the main thematic areas: production, labor market, foreign sector, activity sectors, competitiveness, prices, business

- demographics. A summary will be offered with a comparison of the Valencian Community and Spain.
- o System of short-term economic indicators with quarterly periodicity. It will consist of 61 indicators grouped in the same areas as in the previous collaboration: production, labor market, foreign sector, economic sectors, productivity/competitiveness, prices, business demographics, public finances, technological indicators/digitization, among others. In addition to a summary sheet with information for each indicator for a broad period and for all the regions.
 - o Brief quarterly economic report to highlight the main messages of the evolution of the economy of the Valencian Community in the national context.

Comprehensive view of private investment in R&D&I in the Valencian Community. Weaknesses and proposed solutions (2021-2022)

From a regional perspective, the objective of this project is to examine the specific case of the Valencian Community regarding its different policies to support business investment in knowledge-based assets and their role in helping regions grow. The analysis will be carried out by carefully evaluating the characteristics, strategies and actions carried out by benchmark regions.

The Valencian Community is not a region that stands out for its investments in R&D&I. According to the latest data available from the Spanish National Statistics Institute (INE), two-thirds of the total Spanish R&D investment in 2019 was concentrated mainly in five regions: Madrid, Catalonia, the Valencian Community, the Basque Country and Navarre. However, of these regions, the Valencian Community is the only one with a low R&D expenditure intensity in comparison to its economic size.

The Valencian Community's trajectory in the last decades regarding income and productivity reveals a gap with the most advanced regions. Thus, it is reasonable to study, both from a short- and long-term perspective, how a region and its businesses are affected when the R&D&I investment rate is below that of dynamic economies.

The Valencian region has been affected by various factors, such as, not only a limited impact of public actions within regional R&D&I plans, but also a general non-favorable evolution of the economy, along with the weak investment strategies deployed by its private sector. All of these issues have slowed down the process of reconciling its income per capita and productivity with the Spanish and EU average. The project will consist of examining benchmark regions, by considering closely their active R&D&I, technological development and entrepreneurship policies, in addition to other factors that may also be relevant in contributing to their success, such as, geographical location, productive specialization, internationalization, endogenous business growth problems, the

role of family businesses, institutional development, the role of banking, and political and business leadership, among others.

The Spanish agri-food sector in the European context. 2021 Report (2022)

The aim of this project is to build an observatory based on a system of indicators that will be used to develop a report on the Spanish agri-food sector. The analysis of the sector is enhanced by focusing on international comparisons. In addition, the report considers the entire value chain of the sector, which includes primary sector, processing industry and distribution (both wholesale and retail distribution).

The study also included detailed information sheets for the most relevant agri-food goods producing sectors. The period covered for the international comparison will be 2008-2020, but includes the year 2021 for Spain. This is the 5th edition of the report, which jointly quantifies the different productive branches that define the agri-food sector and examines its characteristics from six points of view: size, growth and composition; employment; productivity and competitiveness; the shopping basket; inflation and prices; foreign trade, investment effort in R&D; and main subsectors. This year's edition includes an analysis of the business fabric, R&D projects and an expansion of environmental indicators in the agri-food industry.

Assessment of the net creation of aerospace companies in Spain and Galicia: Growth, expansion, consolidation and internationalization (2022)

The project examines the main and unique characteristics of the aeronautical and space sector in Spain and Galicia, defining the group of companies entirely dedicated to the aeronautical and space activity which make up the “aerospace cluster”. By doing so, the quantitative and qualitative importance of the sector as a whole can be assessed fairly. In addition, the study will analyze the recent evolution of the total group of aeronautical companies in Galicia in comparison to Spain as a whole.

The report will not only review the net growth of companies in the sector, but also the importance of the “aeronautical cluster” in terms of GVA, employment and amount and type of companies that comprise it. This will take into account information from various sources such as INE’s Central Business Register or Regional Accounts.

The report will also analyze the competitiveness of the sector, comparing the volume of companies by level of competitiveness in Galicia with that of Spain. Likewise, since competitiveness affects business results, indicators such as productivity per worker and per asset, profitability, liquidity, long-term solvency, indebtedness or internationalization will also be considered.

The aim is to analyze, among other aspects, whether the growth of the sector in Galicia and Spain has been based on the creation of new companies or due to the consolidation and growth of existing companies. In both cases, the reason behind the growth should be analyzed, assessing whether it is a consolidation process based on the strengthening of national markets or, if it is based on an increase in internationalization.

CORPORATE COMPETITIVENESS

Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory in the Valencian Community (GECE) (2017-)

The Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory in the Valencian Community (GECE) was created in 2017 with the objective of studying the levels of competitiveness of Valencian firms, as well as the factors and internal causes that contribute to making businesses more competitive. The agreement, initially signed with Bankia, has been renewed in 2021 with CaixaBank and includes the development of quarterly reports which highlight aspects in three areas (corporate governance, strategy and competitiveness), as well as a collection of short informative notes (Keys to competitiveness) and specific success cases of Valencian firms that can serve as a benchmark for other companies.

The GECE Observatory will combine macroeconomic (sectoral breakdown) information with new available databases that provide detailed information on firms regarding financial statements, shareholders, capital and organizational structure, etc. The project has its own website www.observatoriergece.es. In addition, a group of participating firms, for which customized reports are prepared, collaborate by providing first-hand information that improves the analysis carried out by the observatory on business competitiveness and strategy.

NETWORKS

The **lvie** participates in eight international networks, Competitiveness, ICTNET, World KLEMS, LA KLEMS, EU KLEMS, Wolpertinger, INDICSER and PREDICT, and two other national ones: REDEV and the network established University Carlos III of Madrid (UC3M), through the Research Institute for Higher Education and Science (INAECU).

The objective of the Network for Good Practices in Evaluation (REDEV), in which AFI, **lvie** and KSNET participate, is to promote public and private policy evaluation in Spain. This alliance is working on joint projects such as the Evaluation Study on Active Employment Policies in Castilla y León or offering technical assistance to AIReF for the study of active employment policies in Extremadura.

RedEV promotes a comprehensive approach to evaluation that encompasses all the essential phases to contribute to informed and evidence-based decision making, starting from the soundness of the diagnosis and reaching the final phase of evaluation of results and impacts.

The second national collaboration network is the one established, since 2013, with the Carlos III University of Madrid (UC3M), Research Institute for Higher Education and Science (INAECU), for the study and evaluation of the production and use of information in science and technology by scientific communities. UC3M is a competent contact to provide bibliometric information on the scientific activity of Spanish universities that the **lvie** uses in its projects on the Spanish university system such as U-Ranking.

International networks

One of the networks, SPINTAN, is a project coordinated by **lvie**, with support of 12 research institutes and European universities. Promoted and financed by the 7th Framework Programme of the European Commission, this project aims to analyze the impact of public sector intangibles on innovation, well-being and “smart” growth (including the role of education, R&D and innovation, and the construction of a digital society).

The **lvie** participates in the European project in charge of conducting studies that lay the basis for the Annual European Report on Competitiveness. Promoting public debate on aspects related to competitiveness and making recommendations related to the Lisbon strategy and future business policies are some of the objectives of this report. Some of the projects developed by the **lvie** along this line of collaboration are *Competitiveness of the European cement and lime sectors* and *Study on total factor productivity growth: drivers, components and frontiers firms*.

The **lvie** is also one of the 31 European institutes that participated in the ICTNET project (European Network for the Research on the Economic Impact of ICTs), a research funded by the European Commission through DG CONNECT (Directorate General for Communications Networks, Content & Technology) which aim was to coordinate research in ICT economics in Europe increasing the relevance of the research on this topic.

The KLEMS (Kapital Labour Energy Material Services) international network aims to promote and facilitate the analysis of growth patterns and the evolution of productivity around the world, based on a growth accounting framework. At the heart of the initiative is the creation of new databases

with the necessary variables to carry out these analyses. Through harmonizing concepts, common standards and classifications, the data is comparable across countries. **Ivie** has participated in this project since its beginning, with the setting up of EU KLEMS, which gathers information about the EU countries, the United States, Canada, South Korea, Australia and Japan. The **Ivie** has also supported the creation and development of LA KLEMS, which is the extension of this study of productivity to several Latin American countries and the launch of ASIA KLEMS, which includes Asian countries. One of the latest initiatives of this global network is BALTIC KLEMS, whose objective is to develop a methodology adapted to the Baltic countries to analyze the growth patterns and evolution of their productivity. The **Ivie** has actively participated in this new project through a Marie Skłodowska-Curie grant, which has enabled the integration of a researcher to launch this new database. In the same way, the **Ivie** participates actively in the development of World KLEMS that frames the rest of projects and regional KLEMS databases.

The Institute also participates in PREDICT (Prospective Insights on R&D in ICT), a project jointly funded by the European Commission's DG Communications Networks, Content and Technology (DG CONNECT) and the Joint Research Center (JRC). The objective of this project is to analyze the importance of ICT, its productivity and R&D spending in the European Union (EU) and 12 relevant countries within the global ICT market.

Finally, several **Ivie** Researchers are members of the 'Wolpertinger Club', an association of university academics with a common interest in the economics of financial systems and financial institutions. They meet once a year to discuss their research, exchange ideas and develop ways to cooperate in the research and teaching of banking, financial institutions and the economics of financial systems.

José García-Montalvo is also main researcher of the Project *The economic recovery after COVID-19: Inequality, consumption and the fate of the Spanish economy* (ERACOV19, SR20-00386), within the «Social Research Call 2020» of "La Caixa" Foundation.

8. DATABASES AND INDICATOR SYSTEMS²

Numerous **Ivie** projects have generated databases or indicator systems of interest to economic research that also facilitates decision making based on objective and up-to-date information. The **Ivie** website provides easy access to the Institute's 31 databases and indicator systems that are classified into eight areas: growth and capitalization, human capital and human development, socio-economic, globalization, international, public sector, universities, and knowledge economy. In 2022, 4 new databases were included as a result of research in 4 projects in collaboration with the BBVA Foundation. Specifically, the new databases are: Inequality based on individual consumption, Household investment and capital endowments in durable assets, Economic value of human capital and The Size of Cultural, Creative and ICT Activities in Spain.

8.1. Growth and capitalization

Capital stock in housing in Spain and its territorial distribution (1990-2010)

The database *Capital stock in housing in Spain and its territorial distribution (1990-2010)* offers data on the capital stock in housing series from 1990 until 2010, land value included. Information is also provided on the changes of total stock in housing and its prices.

Data is broken down by autonomous community, province and population status, distinguishing between municipalities according to the number of inhabitants and whether they are on the coast or inland.

Among the results provided are house prices and total land area of the housing stock, as well as their changes over time. Data are also included on the value of housing stock and land capital stock. The results are classified by industry and region, with the latest information published in 2015.

Stock and capital services in Spain and its territorial distribution (1964-2021)

Since 1995, the **Ivie** and the BBVA Foundation have developed a data base on capital stock since 1995 which includes information on capital accumulation in Spain over the last five decades. This database examines the series at national level for the period 1964 to 2022 and until 2021 for the Spanish regions and provinces. A new feature of this edition is the use of nowcasting techniques to estimate investment and capital stock by sectors and assets for the 2021 and 2022, in the national case, and 2020 and 2021, for regional information.

² The maintenance and updating process of **Ivie's** databases is funded by the Valencian Regional Government's Ministry for Finance and the Economic Model, through a cooperation agreement signed between both institutions to promote and consolidate the **Ivie's** basic and applied economic research activities.

The new edition of this database updates the contribution of productive capital and offers information of the assets invested in, including R&D expenditure. For this purpose, net capital stock (wealth) and capital services (productive capital) are measured.

At national level, the 34 industries considered are disaggregated into 19 types of assets, according to the NACE Rev. 2 classification and the 2010 European System of Accounts (ESA). The classification distinguishes between tangible and intangible assets, offering disaggregated information on public infrastructure which is a distinctive characteristic of the BBVA Foundation-**lvie** series and includes three new information and communication technology (ICT): software, hardware and communications. Also, data by autonomous communities and provinces are disaggregated into 19 types of assets, and 25 and 15 industries, respectively. This classification by asset and industry became available for the first time in the 2012 update.

The extensive database, that **lvie** and BBVA Foundation have made public, is accompanied by numerous dynamic graphs, which are now dynamic and interactive, that facilitate the analysis of the evolution and composition of capital endowments in Spain and its regions. As of January 2023, over 1,000 published specialized works have been written based on this information.

Historical series on public capital in Spain and its territorial distribution (1900-2012)

Since 1995, the **lvie** and BBVA Foundation have developed a broad research program on Spanish economic growth. One of the fundamental parts of the program is the development of databases on capital stock in Spain which are updated regularly. One of the main characteristics of this series is the importance given to public capital endowments. The continuous analysis of public sector investment carried out by the **lvie** and BBVA Foundation has enabled the development of this database covering more than a century.

The study measures investment in the public sector from a long-term perspective with a detailed look at distribution by autonomous communities and provinces, thus allowing the territorial evolution of public capital to be analyzed for more than a century. In addition, the study facilitates both a better evaluation of public policies, as well as an analysis of the impact of public capital on regional or provincial growth and convergence.

The database spans more than a century of Spain's history and is detailed according to autonomous community and province, thus facilitating the analysis of the impact of public capital on growth and convergence among regions. Detailed information is also provided on the public sector's investment strategy in areas key to growth and welfare, such as infrastructures, health, and education.

Intangible assets: national database (1995-2011)

Given the growing importance of activities based on knowledge in the economic development of the most advanced countries, investment in intangibles assets (ICT), research and development (R&D), innovation, design, creativity, image and brand, organization and specific human capital

training) are assets in which investment is needed to modernize and strengthen the productive structure of a country.

This project developed for the Telefonica Foundation follows the methodology accepted worldwide (Corrado, Hulten and Siches [2005] *Measuring Capital and Technology: An Expanded Framework*) which is in line with the INTAN-Invest project (www.intan-invest.net) that measures intangible investments for a group of European countries.

The database offers the first annual database of the value of investment in intangible assets and its capitalization for the period 1995-2011 for the whole Spanish economy with a wide level of sectoral disaggregation (24 sectors, NACE Rev. 2 classification). The intangible assets used in the database are: computerized information, innovative property (R&D, mineral exploration and spending on the production of entertainment and artistic originals, new products/systems in financial services, design and other new products/systems) and economic competencies (advertising, market research, employer-provided training, organizational capital).

The database is available in Excel and PcAxis on **Ivie's** website: www.ivie.es.

Intangible assets: database for Spain and its autonomous communities (1995-2016)

The database *Inversión en activos intangibles más allá del PIB en España y sus regiones*, developed by the **Ivie** in collaboration with the Cotec Foundation for Innovation, offers information on the gross fixed capital formation (GFCF) in intangible assets in Spain and its autonomous communities by sectors. Data is available for the period 1995-2016, in both current and constant euros for 2010. The database offers a sectoral breakdown of 27 sectors according to the NACE 2009.

The intangible assets are organized into two main groups: those already included in GDP (considered investment by the European System of Accounts, ESA, 2010), referred to as AIPIB, and those not yet included in the national accounts which are grouped under the name AIMAPIB (intangible assets "beyond GDP"). These two major groups are classified in nine individual intangible assets.

Household investment and capital endowments in durable assets

The book "El equipamiento de los hogares y las dotaciones de capital de las familias en el siglo XXI" (Household equipment and capital stock in the 21st century), developed by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** within their economic research collaboration program, offers an in-depth look at household capitalization. This work makes an economic assessment, from a national and regional perspective, of consumer durables accumulated by Spanish families over time, thus, providing a broad view of the level of household equipment and its composition. As a result of this research, the database Household investment and capital endowments in durable assets (2000-2017) has been developed.

The database is structured in two main areas:

A1. Household investment in equipment. The first area provides information on household investment in durable goods. The series of investment at current prices (A.1.1) and investment at constant 2010 prices (A.1.2) are presented, covering the period 2000-2017 for Spain and its autonomous communities. Greater detail is provided at national level for investment, which comprises a total of 33 individual goods, grouped into four broad categories: furniture and goods, appliances, vehicles and other means of personal transport, and digital equipment. At regional level, series are available for 11 consumer durables grouped in the same four broad categories as the national breakdown.

A2. Household capital in equipment. The second area includes the main series of net capital stock in durable goods of households (A.2). As in the previous area for investment, the information is presented in current (A.2.1) and constant 2010 terms (A.2.2), and with the same temporal and territorial coverage and detail by type of durable goods.

8.2. Human capital and human development

Human capital in Spain and its regional distribution

The results obtained from the Human Capital Project undertaken by the **Ivie** in collaboration with the Bancaja Foundation improve the statistical information already available on human capital and have enabled the **Ivie** to create a database that contains abundant information on the evolution of the Spanish population's educational levels.

The period covered in the database is from 1964 until 2013. The series are structured by educational levels, population groups, regions, provinces and sectors and can be accessed through **Ivie's** website: www.ivie.es.

Human development in Spain

The Human Development Index is an indicator that measures a country's degree of economic development and combines health, education and income measures. It was first published in 1990, as part of the United Nations Development Program, and quickly became more popular than the simple comparison by per capita income, it being a more informative indicator.

Within the Human Capital research framework developed by Bancaja and the **Ivie** since 2000, a data series on human development for Spain and its autonomous communities has been built according to the methodology proposed by the UN. Furthermore, an alternative methodology is proposed to correct the major deficiencies of the UN index. The data currently covers the period 1980-2010.

The database contains the Human Development Index and the New Human Development Index, which both have health, education and income components.

Data concerning all these indexes are available on **Ivie's** website: www.ivie.es.

Observatory of young people's transition to the labor market

The *Observatory of the Transition of Young People to the labor market* is a data bank developed through the Human Capital Project sponsored by the Bancaja Foundation, which was updated every three years. The data from the Observatory's six surveys, 1996, 1999, 2002, 2005, 2008 and 2011 have been homogenized and categorized, the following factors being taken into account:

- Basic data on survey participants: age, level of education, gender, work experience, employment situation, nationality; motive for job search, employment search methods; information on academic history.
- Data on family background (education level of parents, socio-professional position of parents, household income).
- Psychosocial data which include attitudes, behavior and experiences of young people in the labor market: initiative, passivity, self-effectiveness, different elements of employment stress, centrality, satisfaction with life, one's economic situation and employment, extrinsic, intrinsic and social aspects of employment, and "justice at work".
- Data on the educational background, work and life experience of those polled, time spent studying, at what age they begin looking for work, left the house, formed their first relationship and had their first child.
- Employment: duration, type of contract, commitment, salary, type of employer and sector, reasons for leaving the job and contractual flexibility.
- Aspects related to the health and the general well-being of the young people.

Economic value of human capital

This database, which accompanies the book "El valor económico del capital humano en España y sus regiones" (The economic value of human capital in Spain and its regions), allows to expand on the limited information existing on this subject for Spain. The territorial analysis it provides on the value of human resources in Spain from 2000 to 2018 can serve as a useful complement to the already accurate picture offered by the series of capital stock in Spain and its regions on the process of non-human capital accumulation for over two decades and is a result of the collaboration between the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**.

The database is structured in four areas:

- A1: Estimation of the economic value of human capital in current terms (millions of euros).
- A2: Estimation of the economic value of human capital in constant terms (millions of euros in 2010).
- A3: Estimate of the economic value of human capital per capita in current terms (euros per capita)

- A4: Estimation of the economic value of human capital per capita in constant terms (2010 euros per capita).

To develop these series and to ensure they are consistent with National Accounts, a broad set of information on wages, job performance, demographic characteristics and educational patterns has been used differentiating for every region up to 1,360 different types of jobs.

8.3. Socio-economic regional differences

Access to services

This new database substitutes the “Access to banking services” database, which only provided information on banking services, by expanding the data available to include access to health services (hospitals and primary care centers), educational services (primary, secondary and post-secondary) and banking services (offices). In order to obtain this information, the number of centers/offices available for each of these services, as well as the number of municipalities that do not have such services and the population residing in these localities are provided.

The analysis, with data from 2019, is performed for all the regions of Spain (disaggregated at municipal level), so as to obtain a comparative picture of the accessibility to these services in the provinces and regions. The database on access to banking services also includes information from 2008 showing the evolution with the current situation.

The contents of this database have been used to prepare the report on the distribution of the population and its access to services in Spain (*Distribución de la población y accesibilidad a los servicios en España*), developed by the **Ivie** for the Ramón Areces Foundation. The database can be accessed directly from **Ivie**'s website.

Social capital

Social capital is a concept that for over a decade has attracted the attention of all social sciences and international institutions because of its outstanding potential in the processes of development. The term social capital highlights the role of cooperation and trust in achieving collective or economic results. The **Ivie** carries out a joint project with the BBVA Foundation for the study of social capital. During 2013, the social capital database, built within the framework of this project, was updated. The international database, which includes OECD countries, covers from 1970 until 2011, and the series for Spain (with territorial breakdown by regions and provinces) until the year 2013.

The database was published by the BBVA Foundation on 11 November 2015. Information and/or data series to date can be requested to publicaciones@lvie.es.

Education accounts

The BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**, within its cooperation framework program, have developed several studies on important topics such as educational training, employment and innovation. From this collaboration arises the database Spanish Education Accounts (*Cuentas de la Educación en España*) which addresses several key issues related to the Spanish educational system: What is its size and how is it structured? How much is spent on education? Who are the producers of educational services and who are the beneficiaries?

The education accounts (EA) database 2000-2016 is structured into six large areas. The first (A.1) and second (A.2) areas are devoted to public and private education accounts, respectively. The third (A.3) offers information on total spending on education, while the fourth (A.4) and fifth (A.5) contain data on public and household expenditure on education. Finally, the sixth area (A.6) contains the student series.

Inequality in Spain, its regions and its provinces

Sponsored by Caixa Galicia Foundation, the aim of this study is to analyze the evolution of household consumption and income distribution in Spain from both a territorial and temporal perspective.

The database covers the period 1973/74-2005, with annual intervals from 1998 to 2005. Among the data provided is in-depth information on autonomous communities regarding their total expenditure per person and per household, according to the social class or studies of the main breadwinner. The expenditure is detailed in a total of twelve groups (education, housing, health, and leisure, among others).

Basic data were used from the Household Budget Surveys for the periods 1973/74, 1980/81 and 1990/91, and the Continuous Household Budget Surveys, published by the INE, for the period 1998 to 2005, with autonomous community disaggregation.

The data are available on **Ivie's** website (https://www.ivie.es/es_ES/bases-de-datos/diferencias-economicas-y-sociales-de-los-territorios/desigualdad/) and are also incorporated in the World Bank and United Nations University (WIDER) databases.

Inequality based on individual consumption

The BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**, as part of their collaboration program, have developed the study *Consumption and social well-being: Lessons from the crisis*, which measures household consumption and individual consumption according to the socio-demographic profile of the household. The social welfare resulting from consumption is then obtained, serving as the foundation for assessing inequality (following the methodology developed by Jorgenson and Schreyer). The study examines

the impact of the Great Recession on consumption, social welfare and inequality from a national and regional perspective.

The information in the database *La medición de la desigualdad en España y sus CC. AA. a partir del consumo individual (2006-2017)* that accompanies the document allows us to address several key questions about the impact of the Great Recession and the subsequent recovery on Spanish household consumption, as well as its effect on social welfare and inequality. This analysis covers all of Spain and its regions, and is broken down by household type and the demographic profile of the primary breadwinner.

The database is structured in four large areas, based on household and individual consumption, social welfare and inequality series.

The first two parts (A.1 and A.2) are dedicated to household and individual consumption, respectively. Each of these two areas is divided into two categories: the first, the series calculated from total consumption (Consumption) and the second, those calculated from monetary expenditure (Expenditure). This subdivision is maintained for the remaining areas.

The third area (A.3) offers information on social welfare measured from individual consumption (A.3.1) and from individual expenditure (A.3.2); while the fourth (A.4) includes the Inequality series obtained from individual consumption (A.4.1) and from individual expenditure (A.4.2).

Migration in the Valencia region

The Examination of Migration in the Valencia Region, is undertaken by the **Ivie** for the Bancaja Foundation (previously included in the Observatory on Immigration in the Valencian Region of the CeiMigra Foundation, sponsored by Bancaja). Its objective is two-fold: first, to provide a comprehensive view of the immigration phenomenon with its many social and economic profiles, through the compilation and systematization of available information, while also detecting gaps in this information. Second, to provide access to adequate statistical material for subsequent detailed analysis of the various aspects of immigration.

The last edition, dated December 2011, includes comparative data on the situation of emigration and immigration in OECD countries, and also information on the remittances sent and received from the immigrants of nationalities most represented in Spain, the employment situation of immigrants in their country of origin or the reason for their moving to Spain.

The data of Migration in the Valencia Region are available on **Ivie's** website: www.ivie.es.

Life tables for Spain and its regions

Life tables are fundamental in providing a numerical representation of the status changes occurring within a population over time. **Ivie** Researcher Francisco J. Goerlich and Rafael Pinilla have calculated the classic biometric functions of the Life Tables for Spain and its regions, covering the period 1975-

2018. The data bank also contains four demographic indicators for each year and geographic area: average age of population, average-age life expectancy, life potential and life potential per capita.

The database contains period life tables with annual periods for Spain (complete and abridged by five-year groups up to a final open interval of 110 and over), its autonomous communities (abridged to a final open interval of 100 and over), and provinces (abridged to a final open interval of 85 years and older).

For the population data tables, information from the Spanish National Statistics Institute is used. Data on deaths are from the Vital Statistics on the natural movement of population (MNP). The microdata can be downloaded from INE's website, and is classified by age, period, generation (Lexis triangles) and groups of cause-of-death. The latest available figures correspond to 2018.

Three aspects distinguish **lvie's** Life Table database from INE's: data is homogenous since 1975; it is disaggregated by large groups of cause-of-death; and includes an additional demographic indicator: life potential.

The data is available to researchers and interested public via the **lvie** website (www.lvie.es), with the possibility of obtaining the information in map format.

Homogeneous population series

For over a decade already, the BBVA Foundation and the **lvie**, under their cooperation framework agreement, have put the focus on demographic analysis, from a more aggregate level to municipal or lower scale. The information offered by the population censuses available and comparable since the end of the 19th century has made it possible to build the Homogenous population series.

The homogenization process of the de jure resident population, taking into account the changes in municipalities' borders for more than one century, has been very strenuous. The disappearance of municipalities, their creation, division, merging or changes of name have been tracked for each one of the more than 8,000 municipalities during the eleven censuses taken.

This Spanish population database is based on the municipal structure of the 2011 Census. Reference data is the de jure population and is dated for each one of the twelve censuses prepared by INE since the beginning of the 20th century, allowing a detailed analysis of the changes in location of population patterns during the period 1900-2011.

The database is accessible on the BBVA Foundation website, www.fbbva.es, and contains information for the 8,116 Spanish municipalities existing in 2011. The series are classified in accordance with the code associated with each municipal area and grouped by the 52 Spanish provinces, also offering the area in square miles of each municipality.

8.4. Knowledge economy

ABACO

ABACO (Observatory of Knowledge-Based Activities) rises as a joint project of the **lvie**, the Universitat de València and the Universitat Politècnica de València with the aim of measuring and analyzing the knowledge-based activities.

One of the pillars of ABACO is the generation of its own information system, available on the ABACO website, which facilitates the analysis and diagnosis of the current situation and recent evolution of knowledge-based activities in Spain, as well as comparison with other countries.

ABACO offers the user a powerful database which is regularly updated with over 200 indicators structured in five areas: New technologies, Human capital, Innovation system, Business environment, and Socio-economic impact.

ABACO also offers extensive detailed information on knowledge intensive GDP. The database contains information about the weight that knowledge-based factors have in the gross value added (GVA) of each of the eighteen countries studied (Australia, Austria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Netherlands, Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, South Korea, Sweden, United Kingdom, and USA). The results are also presented by sector of activity (according to the NACE Rev. 1 classification).

Value of knowledge-based economic activities

The aim of this database, developed by the **lvie** in collaboration with the Ramon Areces Foundation, is to quantify the value of knowledge-based economic activities in Spain and its autonomous communities. With this purpose, the database assesses the market value of the contributions of productive factors that add more knowledge to the production system (skilled work, ICT, intangible assets and machinery and equipment), an exercise based on the methodology of growth accounting. The database follows the methodology found in the report and provides information on the total and regional GVA in Spain, as well as its disaggregation into two parts: GVA based on knowledge (knowledge-based activities) and GVA with no knowledge-based activities or based on productivity factors with low knowledge content.

The database, which covers the period 2000-2014 (2013 for regional data), presents a high industry-level breakdown: 27 sectors at national level and 21 at regional level, defined according to the CNAE 2009/NACE Rev. 2 classification.

The database is available since 2017 on **lvie's** website.

The Size of Cultural, Creative and ICT Activities in Spain

The book *La dimensión de las actividades culturales, creativas y TIC en España* (The Size of Cultural, Creative and ICT Activities in Spain), prepared by the BBVA Foundation and the **lvie** as part of their joint Economic Research Program, analyzes the main economic macro-magnitudes generated by cultural, creative and technological (ACCT, for their initials in Spanish) activities, as well as the penetration of cultural, creative and ICT occupations (OCCT, Spanish initials) in the economy, and the rate of investment in intangible assets directly related to these activities, from a national and international perspective, thus providing a global vision of the impact of culture, creativity and technology on the economy.

The publication is accompanied by a database with information structured in two different blocks. The first block (A.1) offers information on the main macro-magnitudes of National Accounts from the perspective of the sectors of activity, through the classification of economic activities by cultural domains. While, the second block (A.2) gathers the employment series from the perspective of occupations.

8.5. Globalization

INTEGRA

The INTEGRA data bank is framed within **lvie**'s research program with the BBVA Foundation and under the International economic integration research area, and consists of a wide range of indicators to measure the evolution of economies' integration on a worldwide scale.

The INTEGRA database has three different indicators (degree of openness, connection and integration) which have been developed with a broad level of geographical and temporal disaggregation. A total of eighty-five countries are covered (representing 97% of world GDP in 2007), spanning the period 1985-2007. It also provides indicators of total trade in goods, indicators corrected by the distance between countries and indicators disaggregated by industries according to the ISIC-3 classification (Revision 2), with a distinction between the two directions of trade flows: exports and imports.

8.6. International

EU KLEMS

KLEMS (Kapital Labour Energy Material Services) international network aims to promote and facilitate the analysis of growth patterns and the evolution of productivity around the world, based on a growth accounting framework. At the heart of the initiative is the creation of new databases with the necessary variables to carry out these analyses. Through harmonizing concepts, common

standards and classifications, the data is comparable across countries. Some of the variables included are value added, capital stock, employment and human capital.

The **Ivie** has participated in this project since its beginning, with the setting up of EU KLEMS, which gathers information about the EU countries, the United States, Canada, South Korea, Australia and Japan. The Conference Board is responsible for coordinating the work of the consortium and updating the database.

The **Ivie** has also supported the creation and development of LA KLEMS, which is the extension of this study of productivity to several Latin American countries. The latest initiative of this global network is ASIA KLEMS, which includes the Asian countries. In the same way, the **Ivie** participates actively in the development of World KLEMS that frames the rest of projects and regional KLEMS databases.

In addition to the **Ivie**, more than 40 research centers and institutions from around the world participate in the KLEMS consortium. Information is available at www.euklems.net and can be accessed through **Ivie's** website.

SPINTAN

The SPINTAN Project (Smart Public Intangibles), directed by the **Ivie** for the European Commission, aims to define the theoretical and empirical characteristics of public intangible policies. The project is carried out by academic researchers from diverse European institutes and universities.

The database contains information on public intangible assets for 22 EU countries, United States, China and Brazil covering the period 1995-2015. It provides information on the investment and the capital stock in intangible assets such as brands, design, entertainment and artistic originals, organizational capital, employer-provided training, as well as expenditure on R&D and software which are now included in the national accounts of each country.

The database, which is available on the SPINTAN website (www.spintan.net), includes information on the following industries: scientific research and development; public administration and defense; compulsory social security; education; human health and social work activities; and arts, entertainment and recreation.

This information allows us to analyze the impact of public sector intangibles on innovation, well-being and smart growth (including education, R&D and the construction of a digital society).

ICT sector and its R&D (PREDICT)

The **Ivie** has developed for the European Commission a wide database on the Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) and Audiovisual Content sectors, within the framework of the Prospective Insights on (R&D) in ICT (PREDICT) Project. The PREDICT project, jointly funded by the European Commission's DG Communications Networks, Content and Technology (DG CONNECT) and the Joint Research Center (JRC-UnitB6), analyzes the importance of ICT, its productivity and R&D spending in the European Union (EU) and 12 relevant countries within the global ICT market.

This database is one of the tools used by the European Commission to monitor the progress of the Digital Single Market, one of its key strategic areas.

The databank offers information for 12 variables; value added, employment (hours worked and number of employed persons), productivity, labor productivity, Business Enterprise R&D expenditures (BERD), number of personnel and of researchers, ICT R&D public funding, as well as its deflators, PPP and currency exchange rates. The data is available for the ICT sector, following the OECD classification (2007) of ICT industries, which comprises 12 ICT manufacturing and services subsectors and some selected non-ICT producing high-tech sectors.

The data is available for the EU and all its member states, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, India, United States, South Korea, Japan, Norway, Russia, Switzerland and Taiwan. Data on ICT R&D public funding is offered at the aggregate level, by NABS (NABS – Nomenclature for the Analysis and Comparison of Scientific Programmes and Budgets) and by industry sector (NACE Rev. 2) for the EU, United States and Japan. In addition to ICT sector data, the PREDICT 2017 database includes information from official sources (Eurostat, OECD, and National Statistics Institutes, among others) on the following sectors: Media and content (publishing of books and journals, audiovisual and broadcasting activities and news agency activities) and Retail sale via mail order houses or via internet.

Currently, the database, regularly updated by the **Ivie**, covers the period 1995 to 2017 (last year with official data). Provisional estimates on the evolution of the main ICT sectors and the Media and content and Retail sale via mail order houses or via internet sectors are available for 2018 and 2019. The PREDICT initiative aims to compare the evolution of the EU ICT sector with its R&D and its major competitors. To this end, in addition to the database, annual reports are drawn up that analyze the available information and synthesize the main trends in the ICT sector of the countries included in the database.

The database is available on **Ivie's** website: www.ivie.es.

8.7. Public sector

COVID-19 Severity and Impact Indicators (ISIC-19)

The COVID-19 pandemic has put every country in the world on high alert. The rapid spread of the pandemic, its consequences on the health system and the strict confinement measures that have disrupted economic activities have put at risk the globalized world as we know it. To assess the effects of the pandemic on population health and to try to control the negative economic effects associated with it, tools are needed to monitor its evolution in different territories. To accomplish this, the **Ivie** has developed three synthetic indicators, known as COVID-19 Severity and Impact Indicators (ISIC-19), that focus on the severe cases and allow to assess the severity and impact of the pandemic and to study its evolution, giving a regional comparison of the situation.

The *scope* index measures the amount of severely affected people over total population, which can be expressed as a gross index (ratio between the cumulative number of severely affected people and the total population) and as a net index (ratio between the number of severely affected people

minus recovered patients and total population). The *severity* index measures to what degree this part of the population is seriously affected based on the Balanced Worth methodology developed by Herrero and Villar (2013, 2018). The *impact* index is the result of these two components, scope and severity, which measures how many people are severely affected and to what degree, in relation to the total population.

The methodology used to construct the indicators is detailed on the **Ivie** website, along with the algorithm developed by Rodrigo Aragón and Héctor García (**Ivie**) that facilitates the calculation of the Balanced Worth.

This index is based on data provided daily by the Spanish Ministry of Health on the number of deaths, and hospitalized and recovered patients, for Spain as a whole and for each of the Spanish regions. The data is available from 19 March 2020 onwards.

Basic public services expenditure in Spain and its regions

Education, health and social protection, known as basic public services (BPS), are particularly relevant activities of the public sector: due to the importance of the resources allocated to them and the activities carried out. In fact, they represent more than half of public spending and are needed to reach the equity goals pursued by public interventions, especially the principle of equal opportunities.

This database includes information on public sector activities related to the provision and management of services: health (primary, specialist and hospital care, public health, clinical research); education (pre-school, primary, secondary, post-secondary and higher, scholarships, education services); and social services (retirements, disease and disability, advanced age, family protection, unemployment, housing, social exclusion).

The study examines the trajectory of BPS expenditure in Spain and its autonomous communities over the course of the 21st century in order to provide objective data which can be referred to in assessments and decision making. The period covered allows to distinguish differences across regions before and during the crisis.

Regional differences in the Spanish public sector

The database *Regional differences in the Spanish public sector* is part of a research project carried out by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** with a double objective. First, to generate new fresh information on public-sector performance in Spain and its regions. Second, to analyze the data obtained to gain a more detailed picture of the extent of its performance, the reasons underlying regional differences and their effect on inter-territorial solidarity and economic efficiency.

The database, available at the BBVA Foundation website (www.fbbva.es), contains regionalized data for the period 2000-2008 and covers information on the size of the public sector in each region and its territorial distribution by levels of government, by functions and by revenue and expenditure items.

Public health expenditure in Spain

The *Public Health Expenditure in Spain* database contains statistical information on public health spending in Spain by regions for the 1991-2010 period.

It is a homogeneous territorial database that supplements those offered by the Public Healthcare Expenditure Statistics (EGSP), which are produced by the Spanish Ministry of Health in collaboration with the autonomous communities. In addition to starting in 1991, this database offers more detailed regional information than the EGSP, reaches 94% of total public health spending and provides information by public stakeholders. Also, a homogeneous series for the whole period has been constructed.

The databank, which is available on the BBVA Foundation website, www.fbbva.es, contains information on public health expenditure by region covering the period 1991-2010 in Spain, with specific data on the autonomous communities. Supplementary tables are also provided on GDP deflators and prices, population projections by region and age, health expenditure profiles and health expenditure evolution.

8.8. Universities

U-Ranking

U-Ranking is a set of Synthetic Indicators of the Spanish University System (ISSUE), available at www.u-ranking.es, which offers the user two products. First, it provides a set of synthetic indicators on public and private universities in Spain, allowing them to be ranked according to their performance (U-Ranking) and their volume of results (U-Ranking Volume). U-Ranking takes into account the three missions of university activity (teaching, research, and innovation and technological development). The website offers the global synthetic indicators obtained by each university, as well as the indicators in each activity and area, thus allowing each institution to be compared from different points of view.

Furthermore, the U-Ranking website provides an accurate and easy-to-use tool, allowing the user to build their own personalized ranking with their chosen degree and make a comparison of what each university has to offer, expressing their preferences about what to study and where, as well as the importance given to different university activities. Along with the personalized listing, other information of interest is provided, such as the last cut-off mark, the price of credits and details about the university surroundings.

The 9th edition of U-Ranking, developed by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** analyzes a total of 72 Spanish universities, 48 public and 24 private, by monitoring different indicators and constructing various synthetic indexes. U-Ranking 2022 also includes a specific analysis on the evolution of postgraduate education (Master's and Doctoral degree) over the last decade.

This information is available on the U-Ranking project's website: www.u-ranking.es/.

SIUVP

SIUVP (Valencian Public University System of Information) is a project born in 2012 from the collaboration of the five Valencian public universities – University of Valencia, Alicante University, Polytechnic University of Valencia, Jaume I University and Miguel Hernández University at Elche– with the aim of offering a complete set of indicators on their activity and results.

SIUVP is a window to the Valencian university activity, a tool by which universities account in a transparent manner to society, for the effectiveness and efficiency achieved in their performance. Through the website, users have access to a comprehensive information system that consists of more than 60 indicators.

The information in this platform allows the user to know the situation and development of the five universities in areas related to the supply and demand of degrees, the academic performance of their students, internationalization, research activity, knowledge transfer to society and economic results of its activity.

The SIUVP database provides information on 60 indicators that are structured in seven different areas: Admission, Students, Academic results, Internationalization, Human resources, Research and tech transfer and Economic data.

The SIUVP website (www.siuvp.es) is updated twice a year to offer the latest data available.

9. SCIENTIFIC MEETINGS³

The Institute has taken an active part in promoting and supporting the participation of its associates in national and international meetings, and also by organizing seminars, workshops and courses in different places. Through these activities, the **Ivie** hopes to make its head office, and the university departments and institutions with which it collaborates, a regular meeting point for researchers, other specialists and social institutions. As a result of the pandemic, the **Ivie** reinforced the remote organization and participation in activities through digital connection platforms and live broadcasting, making it possible to reach more people by eliminating the geographic barrier.

9.1. Organized by the **Ivie**

The pandemic affected and transformed **Ivie's** agenda both in 2020 and 2021 as restrictions were imposed to safeguard the health of others. However, these limitations have helped to progress in digitalization and the use of new cutting-edge technologies that make it possible to participate in activities without the need to attend in person. In 2022, the **Ivie** increased its audience as a result of hybrid activities that allowed both in-person and online participation.

By means of these technologies, the **Ivie** has been able to organize seminars, dialogues, workshops and conferences in collaboration with other entities and also individually combining face-to-face and online participation.

Ernest Lluch Foundation-Ivie Dialogues: Innovation as Creative Destruction

The Ernest Lluch Foundation and the **Ivie** began their collaboration in 2018 with the organization of the series of dialogues on INEQUALITY AND DEMOCRACY, which continued in 2019 with another series of dialogues entitled THE QUEST FOR PROSPERITY: CHALLENGES OF MIGRATION. Despite the restrictions imposed by the pandemic, the dialogues continued in 2020 with the title SPORTS, ECONOMY AND HEALTH: CHANGING THE RULES OF THE GAME, in which five dialogues were held with the participation of ten experts, although some had to participate remotely, via video conference, while the in-person audience capacity was reduced to one-third. All the dialogues were streamed live on the **Ivie's** YouTube channel.

In 2021, the series of dialogues entitled "CRISIS Y CATARSIS: LECCIONES DEL COVID-19" (CRISIS AND CATHARSIS: LESSONS LEARNED FROM COVID-19) were organized with a dual format (in-person and online). In 2022, the public could decide whether to attend in person or choose the online option via **Ivie's** YouTube channel, thus, allowing the audience access to **Ivie's** activities regardless of their location.



IvieLAB Conferences and Seminars

The IvieLAB (Laboratory for the Analysis and Evaluation of Public Policy) is an initiative of the **Ivie**, in collaboration with the Valencian Regional Government that began in 2018, with the objective to promote ideas, design methodologies and elaborate information to analyze, evaluate and improve public policies.

In addition, it contributes to the dissemination of knowledge through public outreach activities.

In this regard, two sessions of the 5th Valencian Economic Congress were organized in 2022.

The **5th Valencian Economic Congress** started in June with a first session, held in Alicante, which focused on the analysis of the transformation of the Valencian economy forty years after the approval of the Statute of Autonomy in 1982. A second session was held in November, to illustrate the present situation of the Valencian economy, as well as the challenges it faces from very different perspectives.

During the two sessions of the congress, two IvieLAB reports were presented and several conferences and round tables were held:

The Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory in the Valencian Community (GECE) was created in 2017 by Bankia and has continued its activity throughout 2022, after CaixaBank renewed its participation in 2021. To continue with the objective of studying the

levels of competitiveness of Valencian firms, as well as the factors and internal causes that contribute to making businesses more competitive, GECE organized two conferences which brought together representatives of Valencian firms and the Public Administration, along with experts and academics.

10. DISSEMINATION

10.1. Presentation of studies

The dissemination activities developed by the Institute and the entities with which it collaborates have been able to recover almost full normality in 2022, after the measures imposed to protect people's health in 2020 and 2021. However, the retransmission through YouTube of some activities has been maintained, because it offers the possibility of accessing the **lvie**'s activities from anywhere. In 2022, the activities have been offered in hybrid format, i.e., the public has been able to choose to attend in person or through an online connection. The dissemination of reports, studies and other **lvie** research has been carried out this year, both through press conferences and through direct notes sent to the media. In total, 25 press releases were prepared in 2022 for the dissemination of studies produced by **lvie** researchers and technicians:

- On January 10, a new press release was issued with updated data from the SIUVP website, which includes information on the five Valencian public universities. On this occasion, it analyzed the success rate of university students in a course marked by COVID-19.
- The publication of the report *El stock de capital en España y sus comunidades autónomas* and database on capital stock was published on February 17. A press release was sent out to disseminate the contents of the document which focused on public and private investment data.
- On March 1, the GECE Observatory, an initiative between the **lvie** and CaixaBank, presented at the ADEIT University-Enterprise Foundation the report 01/2022 dedicated to businesses that can serve as engines of economic recovery after COVID-19.
- The supermarket chain Mercadona presented its annual results at a press conference on March 15, along with data from the 2021 Economic Impact report prepared by the **lvie**.
- In 2022, the U-Ranking project presented a guide for guidance counselors and families to help students make decisions about their future at university. On March 28, this guide was distributed by e-mail to over 8,000 secondary schools. A press release was also sent to the media.
- On April 28, Grupo Cooperativo Cajamar released the main results of its economic impact report, developed by the **lvie**, during the intervention of its Chairman, Luis Rodríguez, at the General Shareholders' Meeting.
- On May 31, the GECE Observatory organized a new conference to disseminate 2/2022 issue. The document explained the influence that a professional management of companies, through boards of directors, has on the results of a business in terms of competitiveness, wages and internationalization to give visibility to the work of entrepreneurs, workers and self-employees during the crisis.
- On June 16, the Grupo Cajamar and the **lvie** presented "The Spanish agri-food sector in the context of the Spanish regions. 2021 Report", with information on the entire value chain of the sector, which includes primary sector, processing industry and distribution. Joaquín Maudos was in charge of explaining the main conclusions of the document.

- On June 22, the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** presented the results of U-Ranking in a press release to the different national and regional media.
- Six days later, on June 28, the **Ivie**, along with the Generalitat Valenciana and the social agents (CC. OO. UGT and CEV) organized in Alicante the first part of the 5th Valencian Economy Congress. Although the event was attended by press from Valencia, the press release was distributed to all the media of the Valencian Community.
- On July 12, the Spanish Banking Association (AEB), CECA and the National Union of Credit Cooperatives (UNACC) presented the Report on Financial Inclusion in Spain, developed by the **Ivie**, with updated information on the concentration of the population in Spain with no physical access to banking services. Joaquín Maudos, **Ivie** Deputy Director and director of the study, explained the main conclusions.
- On July 20, LAB Mediterráneo Foundation, an initiative of AVE, presented a report prepared by the **Ivie** to the media which examined private investment in R&D&i and ICT in the Valencian Region and also proposed a series of ideas to boost it. Javier Quesada and Consuelo Mínguez were in charge of explaining the contents of the study to the media.
- The signing of a new agreement between CaixaBank and the **Ivie** to promote the competitiveness of Valencian firms through the GECE Observatory was announced in a press release July 26.
- On September 7, a new Analysis of the GECE Observatory issue (3/2022) was presented. On this occasion, only a press release was sent to the media.
- Seven days later, on September 14, a new update of the SIUVP database was presented with a press release that focused on the demand to study at the Valencian public universities.
- On October 17, a new edition of the Ernest Lluch Foundation Dialogues was announced to the media in Valencia. The press release explained the objective of the series, which is to analyze the value of innovation to boost growth and welfare, but also the inequalities it can generate.
- Cajamar presented the latest report of the Observatory on the agri-food sector in Spanish regions on November 4 in Valencia, focusing on the sector in the Valencian Community, with similar presentations in Barcelona and Zaragoza.
- On November 28 and 29, the second part of the 5th Valencian Economy Congress was held. On this occasion, the programmed conferences and roundtable discussions took place in Valencia. The report on the situation and challenges of the Valencian economy prepared within the framework of the IvieLAB project was presented.
- On December 9, a press release was issued with the main conclusions of the report “De los estudios a las competencias: Condicionantes y resultados del capital humano en España”, developed for the BBVA Foundation.

10.2. Brief dissemination documents

10.2.1. GECE Analysis

The Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory (GECE Observatory) is a project launched by Bankia and the **Ivie** in 2017 with the goal of analyzing the competitiveness of Valencian firms over time and its relationship with internal competitiveness drivers.

Following Bankia's merge with CaixaBank, the commitment to the GECE Observatory has been extended, therefore, continuing during 2022 the work of analyzing the competitiveness of Valencian and Spanish companies. Specifically, the following four brief documents that focus on the economic recovery, resiliency, strategy and position of women:

- *Análisis 01/2022. Motores de la recuperación: caracterización y rasgos de las empresas valencianas de alta competitividad y crecimiento*
- *Análisis 02/2022. Competitividad y resiliencia empresarial: relación con las estructuras de propiedad y gobierno en las empresas valencianas*
- *Análisis 03/2022. La reacción estratégica ante entornos hostiles: el perfil de las empresas ágiles y altamente competitivas*
- *Análisis 04/2022. Análisis de la posición de las mujeres en la propiedad y en el gobierno de las empresas valencianas*

10.2.2. Monthly price evolution reports on the Valencian Community

The database of the Price-Monitoring Observatory of the Valencian Community launched in 2022, promoted by the Valencian Regional Government in which the **Ivie** collaborates, includes a series of monthly reports that offer a quantitative and qualitative analysis of the evolution of prices in the Valencian Community.

From May to December 2022, 8 monthly reports were published.

10.2.3. GVANEXT monthly periodical

Ivie collaborates with AFI in the development of the GVANEXT periodical, which will contain useful information on the Next Generation European Funds (NGEF) in the Valencian Region. In 2022, four issues were published corresponding to the months of September, October, November and December.

10.2.4. Valencia Monitor, in *El Confidencial*

The **Ivie**, through its Foundation, was granted the initiative of the Agència Valenciana de la Innovació (AVI), *Acciones complementarias de impulso y fortalecimiento de la innovación*, which was presented with the title *Visiones de la Innovación*, along with *El Confidencial* and in collaboration with the Faculty of Economics of the Universitat de València. The digital newspaper serves as a platform to

disseminate opinion articles written by **Ivie** researchers and other researchers from the Valencian innovation system, through the new section it has created on its website, Valencia Monitor. In 2022, a total of 8 articles were published between September and December.

10.3. Websites⁴

The **Ivie** website has continued to increase its content during 2022, as it contains information on all the news related to the publication and dissemination of the **Ivie**'s research work and activities. This year we have maintained the content generated by online activities, such as the Webinars, but in-person events have also been included because they contribute to enhancing the dissemination of knowledge, such as the celebration of two editions of the 5th Valencian Economic Congress held in Alicante and Valencia.

In 2022, the **Ivie** series of Webinars **2030 Challenges for the Spanish economy and society** had a total of 4 new online webinars, which could be followed on Zoom and YouTube, with the participation of **Ivie** researchers and external experts on topics such as debt, climate change, regulation of competition and quality.

The "Research" section includes publications, books, reports, dissemination documents, research articles and working papers, as well as documents developed directly in the Institute, such as those generated by **Ivie**'s team. This year, the section included the *Monthly price evolution reports on the Valencian Community*, with 8 published issues. The following documents are also included in this section: the series of informative documents titled *Essentials*, prepared for the BBVA Foundation; *Regional Funding Papers*; *AVE Focus*, developed in collaboration with the Valencian Association of Entrepreneurs (AVE); and *Keys to Competitiveness*, which are informative documents produced by the Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory (GECE Observatory) and the COVID-19: IvieExpress documents developed in 2020.

The "Database" section of the website contains information and links to over 30 databases created by the **Ivie** that are available for consultation. This section provides access to a large amount of statistical information prepared by the Institute in the form of databases, namely, *Capital Stock*, *Human Capital*, *Regional Differences in the Public Sector*, *Basic Public Services*, *Public Health Expenditure*, *Intangible Assets: national databases (1995-2011)*, *EU KLEMS*, *ICT R&D Macro data*, *Access to services (which replaces Access to banking services, and now includes information on education and health services)*, *Social Capital*, *Human Development*, *Transition to the Labor Market*, *Inequality*, *Education Accounts in Spain*, *Homogenous Population Series*, *Life Tables*, *Trade Integration and Migrations*, *Intangible assets: national and regional database (1995-2014)* and *Economic value of knowledge*. Four new databases were published in 2022, based on studies carried out for the BBVA Foundation: Inequality based on individual consumption, Household investment and capital

endowments in durable assets, Economic value of human capital and The Size of Cultural, Creative and ICT Activities in Spain..

The "News" section, in "News & Events", includes 110 news items on information regarding new developments, publications, recognitions and activities carried out by the **Ivie**. Included in the section "Opinion Articles", are the links to 45 op-ed articles written by **Ivie** members in the national and regional media. These opinion articles also include those published in the Valencia Monitor section of *El Confidencial*.

The **Ivie** website reached **89,030** visits in 2022. Of these, 50.3% are users living in Spain, while the remaining 49.7% were from 157 countries, including Mexico, United States, Peru and Colombia. It is worth noting that the percentage of visitors to the website from outside Spain is almost equal to that of local visitors.

The **Ivie** also manages and maintains the following websites: U-Ranking (www.u-ranking.es), which has been completely redesigned in 2022 making it more visually appealing, practical and easier to operate, and SIUVP (Valencian Public University System of Information) at www.siuvp.es, which offers a complete information system with more than 60 indicators for the five Valencian public universities. The **Ivie** has also collaborated in updating the GECE Observatory and the Network for Good Practices in Evaluation (REDEV) websites.

10.4. Circulation in press and online⁵

The **Ivie** maintains a regular presence in the media, as a result of the attention given to publicizing its work. This year, there have been 3,048 news items in the press on the research conducted at the Institute. This represents an increase of 1.5% over the previous year. The number of press coverages has remained constant, even though the dissemination of BBVA Foundation materials this year has been limited to the release of U-Ranking and Capital Stock. The dissemination of work or activities of other clients has compensated this decrease.

The number of articles published in the media by **Ivie** Researchers and Technicians has decreased slightly from 48 in 2021 to 45 in 2022. Although, the figure is 14% higher than in 2019.

In 2022, the **Ivie** responded to 173 requests from the media, which rely on the Institute and its researchers and economists as a source of information to confirm or supplement their news stories for print, radio, television or digital media. This figure, which signifies a request every two days, shows the journalists' continuous trust in the data, reflections and opinions provided by the **Ivie**.

The research concluded in 2022 and its activities undertaken were publicized through 25 press releases, 4 *GECE Observatory Analysis* documents⁶ and 8 *Monthly price evolution reports on the Valencian Community*. In addition, during 2022, 110 activities and news events by the **Ivie** Researchers were reported in the agenda and news section of the Institute's website, including the

publication of articles by researchers and technicians in scientific journals, and the presentation of papers at different congresses.

Among the topics that have had the most impact in the media in 2022, U-Ranking once again stood out with 387 news items not only on the annual document but also on the presentation of the Guide for guidance counselors and future university students. Other studies, reports and documents carried out in collaboration with the BBVA Foundation add up to more than 130 news items in the media.

In addition, the number of media reports on **Ivie** studies for Cajamar Group stood out with a total of 240. In 2022, three reports were presented by the **Ivie** for Cajamar: the Observatory of the agri-food sector in the Spanish regions, the Spanish agri-food sector in the European context and a third report on the Economic impact of Grupo Cooperativo Cajamar.

However, the two reports that have had the greatest impact in the media were the *Report on financial inclusion in Spain*, developed for the Spanish Banking Association (AEB), CECA and the National Union of Credit Cooperatives (UNACC), with 359 news items and *The Valencian economy... 40 years after the 1982 Statute of Autonomy was approved*, carried out for Generalitat Valenciana with 106 references in the media.

Meanwhile, news related to the collaboration between the **Ivie** and the Generalitat Valenciana, both in regional funding and through the various IviELAB reports, reached 347 press clippings. Other reports on economic impact, including that of University of Castilla-La Mancha, Pabellón Roig Arena and Air Nostrum, accounted for 167 news items.

Over 39% of the news items issued by the **Ivie** in 2022 were published in the regional press (Valencian Community and other autonomous communities); 20.5% in the digital press, 10.5% in national press, 9.4% in Internet, 7.8% in economy related newspapers and 2.9 in news agencies. The remaining 9.4% consists of news items broadcast on radio and television, specialized and sports press, international media, blogs and internet portals and other public administrations.



The newspaper Levante, with 139 entries, is the one that published most news items in which the **Ivie** is mentioned, followed by *Las Provincias*, with 109 reports, and *La Vanguardia*, which mentioned the **Ivie** on 108 occasions. The rest of the fifteen media outlets that mentioned the **Ivie** were the digital newspaper *Valencia Plaza* (79), Europa Press (70), El País (69), *Información* (64), *El Economista* (54), *Cinco Días* (53), *El Periòdic y El Periòdic Mediterráneo* (52 each), *65 y más* and *ABC* (an average of 43), *El Español* (40) and, finally, *Finanzas* with 39 news items.


Social networks have also served as a platform to publicize **Ivie**'s activity. With almost 900 published tweets, the Institute's Twitter profile has over 4,100 followers, increasing 6% in 2022. The U-Ranking Twitter account increased its followers by 2%. As for the most recently created profiles, the GECE Observatory, which is managed through the Chair of Family Business, has 150 followers, while REDEV, which the **Ivie** periodically monitors together with the other entities in the alliance, has over 300 followers.

For its part, **Ivie**'s YouTube channel received 17,995 views in 2022, 8.8% less than the previous year, but still a very noticeable increase compared to the 11,400 views in 2020. The irruption of the pandemic and the limitation to physical meetings boosted remote activities, which were transmitted through the **Ivie**'s YouTube channel. This practice, initiated in 2020, has been maintained this year with the dissemination of 21 new videos, including the recording of activities related to IviELAB, two sessions of the 5th Valencian Economic Congress, the Webinar series and the Dialogues of the Ernest Lluch Foundation and the **Ivie**. Also, the **Ivie** Interviews series, with brief interventions by renowned experts in areas of general interest and two new entries in the **Ivie**'s Videoblog section.

Meanwhile, the presentations shared on Slide Share were viewed 16,454 times over the course of 2022. The **Ivie**'s profile on the LinkedIn professional networking service, which is intended to strengthen relations with the academic and research world, continues increasing, with a total of 1,631 as of 31 December 2022, an increase of 36% over the last year.


The **Ivie** Newsletter, each issue of which includes the Institute's main news, the latest research, researchers' opinion articles and the events calendar, continued to be issued at monthly intervals. During 2022 this monthly digital newsletter was emailed to **Ivie**'s 3,095 contacts, with more than 303 new subscribers.
