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1. THE INSTITUTE'S MAIN OBJECTIVES

The Valencian Institute of Economic Research (Instituto Valenciano de Investigaciones Económicas, **Ivie**) works to promote, conduct and disseminate economic research both in Spain and abroad.

The **Ivie**, created in 1990 by the Department of Economy and Finance of the Generalitat Valenciana (Valencian Regional Government), is supported by CaixaBank, Ford Spain, BBVA Foundation, Mediterráneo Foundation, Cañada Blanch Foundation and Ceca Foundation of Commercial and Savings Banks (FUNCAS).

The **Ivie** has two main objectives: to establish stable teams of experts capable of generating consistent output of research in certain areas of public interest; and to help build bridges between research and decisions made by economic agents. Many of which require careful analysis of the available options, taking into account research findings, statistical data and the expertise of specialists. Therefore, the **Ivie** also provides technical support in economic matters to institutions and companies that request it.

To achieve its goals, the **lvie** organizes its activities in theoretical and applied research lines, along with the support of various shared services. The research activity is carried out by the Institute's research associates, who have vast economic background, and its staff of economists and subject experts.

To carry out its activities and projects, the **lvie** has established connections with a large number of researchers and has entered into collaboration agreements with various universities. It supports economic research groups in carrying out and disseminating their activities and promotes the exploitation of their research efforts for the benefit of society.

The **Ivie** began its activities in November 1990. During this time, it has been sponsored by the Ministry of Finance of the Valencian Regional Government, which has allowed it to foster economic research. The rest of its activities are financed through partnership agreements and contracts with various public and private sector institutions in Spain, Europe and the Americas.

Francisco Alcalá (Center for Economic Policy Research)


Ángel Soler (Universitat de València)



The **Ivie** has had the institutional structure of a public limited company since it was established. Although considered a public firm during its first few years, the **Ivie** has been a mercantile company subject to private law following the incorporation of its shareholders in 1995.

Throughout the years, the **Ivie** has always complied with current legislation so as to ensure the good of the public and private resources entrusted by different institutions for the development of its activities. In addition, the **Ivie** provides the required accounting information in the Mercantile Register.

The **Ivie** is annually controlled by independent auditors with the aim of receiving opinions regarding the quality of the financial data which the Board of Administration develops.

In 2011, the **Ivie** created the **Ivie** Foundation of the Valencian Community to increase the development of economic research and education activities of general interest and to strengthen the collaboration with other institutions in this area. Since 2013, the **Ivie** is a research center associated to the Universitat de València, registered in the Spanish Registry of Universities, Centres and Qualifications (RUCT).



INFORME DE AUDITORÍA DE CUENTAS ANUALES ABREVIADAS EMITIDO POR UN AUDITOR INDEPENDIENTE

Opinión

Hemos auditado las cuentas anuales abreviadas del Instituto Valenciano de Investigaciones Económicas, S.A. (la Sociedad), que comprenden el balance abreviado a 31 de diciembre de 2023, la cuenta de pérdidas y ganancias abreviada, el estado abreviado de cambios en el patrimonio neto y la memoria abreviada correspondientes al ejercicio terminado en dicha fecha.

Reconocimiento de ingresos

Descripción El importe de la cifra de negocios corresponde a los ingresos por prestaciones de servicios en concepto de proyectos de investigación económica a escala nacional e internacional, cuya duración, en determinados casos, puede ser superior al ejercicio. El reconocimiento de ingresos y los resultados de estos proyectos requiere, por tanto, un elevado grado de control de las estimaciones realizadas y de las desviaciones que se pudieran producir a lo largo de la duración de los mismos. Las estimaciones tienen en cuenta todos los ingresos y costes relacionados con los proyectos. Debido a la complejidad de gestión asociada a las citadas estimaciones y a que cambios en las mismas podrían dar lugar a diferencias en los ingresos y resultados de los proyectos, se ha considerado este asunto como un aspecto relevante de la auditoría.

Nuestra respuesta

Nuestros procedimientos de auditoría han consistido en evaluar los procedimientos y criterios empleados por la Sociedad para el reconocimiento de los ingresos y costes asociados a los proyectos. Seleccionamos una muestra representativa de los proyectos para evaluar las estimaciones más significativas llevadas a cabo en el reconocimiento de ingresos y costes. Asimismo, hemos obtenido confirmaciones externas para una muestra de clientes pendientes de cobro y realizando, en su caso, procedimientos de comprobación alternativos mediante justificantes de cobro posteriores o documentación soporte justificativa de la prestación del servicio. Por último, hemos evaluado la idoneidad de la información revelada en las cuentas anuales abreviadas de acuerdo con los requerimientos del marco normativo de información financiera.

Responsabilidad de los administradores en relación con las cuentas anuales abreviadas



The AD series focuses on theoretical research, while the EC series includes papers of a more applied character.






The **Ivie** seeks to encourage the diffusion of research activity, the final aim being their publication in scientific journals, and especially values the work of its researchers and technicians. 

Investment and productive capital stock in Spain and its regions and provinces (1964-2023) (2022-2023)

After the update and revision of the methodology carried out in 2020 and 2021, the work program for 2022 on investment and capital stock will consider the changes in the composition of investment and stock -by assets,

sectors and territories- that have taken place during the last two decades, covering the years of expansion that took place at the beginning of the 21st century, the Great Recession, the years of recovery, the COVID-19 crisis, as well as the first effects of the Russia-Ukraine war.

An update of the regional capital endowments will also be carried out, which includes other economic indicators of interest for the analysis of each region.

U-Ranking 2023. Synthetic Indicators of the Spanish University System (2023)

The aim of the ISSUE (acronym for Indicadores Sintéticos del Sistema Universitario Español, in English Synthetic Indicators of the Spanish University System), jointly developed by the Ivie and the BBVA Foundation, is to analyze the performance of Spanish universities and offer comparable and synthetic images of these higher education institutions. As a result of this work, each year U-Ranking is published, based on the study of the teaching, research and innovation and technological development activities of the universities. The 2023 edition also includes an analysis of the labor market results of graduates by studies and universities.

Productivity performance in Spain 1995-2022. 2023 OPCE Report (2022-2023)

This report offers an overview of the annual figures and main novelties of the new database on the System of Indicators of National and International Productivity, and will provide a specific analysis of the evolution of productivity in Spain before and after COVID-19.

Compared to other countries, the trajectory of Spain's productivity during most of the 21st century is a matter of concern. This is reflected both in the irregular and weak progress of its labor productivity -per employee or per hour worked- and, even more so, in the decline of its total factor productivity, which indicates a negative evolution

of efficiency and a poor use of the economy's capitalization effort. The result is a weakening of Spain's international competitiveness and capacity to generate value and sustain the relative welfare of its inhabitants in comparison with other countries. Although the problem has been known for years and noted by specialists, the attention paid to it in the design of public and private policies is inadequate.

For this reason, the BBVA Foundation and the Ivie have envisaged the construction of a productivity observatory in Spain to generate data on a regular basis and carry out detailed analyses of the problem in the current circumstances. Through a rigorous selection of indicators, the Productivity and Competitiveness Observatory (Observatorio PROCOMP FBBVA-Ivie) will generate systematic information on the productivity and competitiveness of the Spanish economy. The Observatory will have an international perspective and will provide an updated monitoring of these problems in Spain, reinforced by an in-depth analysis of different topics.

The aim of this study is to analyze the role of human resources in the digitalization of companies and institutions, focusing on the transformation of tasks, activities, processes and jobs, and their redefinition. With this in mind, the report will discuss issues raised by the identification and development of digital competencies in the digitization processes of organizations, as well as the role of human resources management and development, and occupational health and safety.

The adaptation of the Spanish industry to the energy scenario and digital transition (2022-2023)

This report aims to carry out a diagnosis of the Spanish industry to identify strengths and weaknesses, as well as threats and opportunities for industrial sectors in the face of a future framed by three vectors: the risks posed by accelerated globalization; the need to address digital transformation as a lever to gain competitiveness; and the reinforcement of respect for the environment, which requires improving energy efficiency and at the same time provides an opportunity for Spain to invest advantageously in sectors producing renewable energies with new technologies.

Within the framework of the opportunity provided by the European recovery funds associated with the NextGenerationEU, this diagnosis should identify the industrial productive branches in which Spain has competitive advantages in the current international context, the factors that limit its productivity gains and those that can contribute to defining a new growth model which is more typical of an advanced society, in which knowledge-based activities increase in importance.

The project aims to consider, in the case of Spain, the role of training in reducing the impact of aging on the population, particularly on the possibilities to continue working, the quality of life of the older population and the good use of opportunities. It will also consider how public policies, including those related to education (OECD 2017; UNECE 2021), can influence such effects.

The project will address the following questions: How much training do people over the age of 55 receive in Spain? How much of the demand of educational facilities is currently being met by the elderly? What effect will aging have on the labor market in Spain? What effects does digitalization have on the need for the elderly to update their skills? What sets Spain apart from other European countries? What policies can the administrations apply to support the training of the elderly, promote the continuation of their working life, boost their productivity and encourage them to lead a more active and healthy lifestyle?

Corporate sustainability and social responsibility: situation and challenges for the implementation of ESG policies in unlisted companies (2023-)

This project analyzes the position of Spanish unlisted companies in connection to the adoption of business models aimed at sustainability and long-term competitiveness. The goal is to study, from an empirical perspective, the practices and principles related to ESG (Environmental, Social and Governance) criteria found in Spanish SMEs and to assess them in terms of the characteristics of their strategic leadership and corporate governance. The study will focus on mapping the current situation in ESG policy adoption in unlisted companies and identifying the elements that determine the adoption of these management strategies. This will require a significant amount of work to generate new microeconomic information, including data collection techniques on company websites.

High-resolution (100m x 100m) population grid for Spain (2023-)

Given that the National Statistics Institute (INE) has already completed the georeferencing procedure for the Electoral Census (INE 2022) in Spain, the 2021 census grid is anticipated to have highly accurate data. Based on this information, the project will disaggregate the census grid into $100m \times 100m$ cells with a precision of one hectare. This means that spatial information provided by the new INE census grid is multiplied by 100 to obtain a cell resolution of $100m \times 100m$.

The statistical and data processing techniques currently in use must be updated in order to meet this goal. Additionally, the existing auxiliary data must be fully utilized in order to perform the spatial disaggregation process. To develop this process, population data is combined with land use, population (building sector) and building height data using appropriate statistical methods, which has proven to be very useful for this type of exercise (Goerlich 2016) but is not generally available. However, thanks to the National Plan for Aerial Orthography, it is now available for Spain.

Spain in the face of recent impacts on global value chains (2022-2023)

The aim of this report is to empirically analyze from the Spanish perspective, three issues related to the functioning of global value chains and their disruptions:

- 1. The development of these chains over the last two decades and the position Spain's economy occupies in them
- 2. The evolution of the degree of international connection between economies as a result of these chains, and the intensity and geographical bias of Spanish connections.

3. The extent of recent shocks on value chains and the degree of connection, as well as the capacity to adapt to shocks, with special reference to the EU and Spain.

The analysis will be carried out at national and international level, with special emphasis on the Spanish economy and its competitive situation in international trade networks, its evolution in recent years and the degree to which it has been affected by recent shocks, such as the pandemic and the war in Ukraine. Attention will also be paid to the differences between trade in goods and services, both affected differently by the pandemic and the war, as well as to some sectoral differences between sectors in which global value chains have had different levels of development.

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IVIELAB (LABORATORY FOR THE ANALYSIS AND EVALUATION OF PUBLIC POLICY) RESEARCH PROGRAM

In 2018, the **Ivie**, in collaboration with the Valencian Regional Government, started the Laboratory for the Analysis and Evaluation of Public Policy (IvieLAB) to study the action of governments and government agencies in different areas. IvieLAB serves to promote a debate, design of new methodologies and development of tools (such as databases and indicators) to foster knowledge and awareness of the state of public policy in Spain. In 2023, through the IvieLAB program, the third and last session of the 5th Valencian Economic Congress was organized to analyze the transformation of the Valencian economy since the pandemic and its future challenges. On this occasion, it was held at the Universitat Jaume I (UJI) in Castellón. In addition, the conference Deuda y sostenibilidad de las finanzas autonómicas (Debt and sustainability of regional finances), which analyzed the financial situation of the Valencian Region and the causes of its high indebtedness, was also held. As a result of the IvieLAB program, 12 reports were published in 2023 on issues such as the use of Next Generation Funds, regional funding and income inequality in the region. In 2023, the activity of the Price-Monitoring Observatory of the Valencian Region, in which the Ivie collaborates, also continued.

Analysis of the evolution of the financing of the Regional Funding System between 2013-2023 (2023)

The aim of this project is to analyze the evolution of the Valencian Community's income over the last decade (2013-2023) from the regional funding system, as well as of other funding sources that have been important in recent years as a response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The analysis of the evolution during the period 2013–2022 is completed in two aspects: with the assessment of the situation anticipated for 2023, in light of the image aleady available, and with the comparison of the Valencian situation to that of other communities in some basic indicators throughout the period analyzed and, especially, at the end of it.

Analysis of the evolution of the Valencian economy after the start of COVID (2023)

The aim of this project is to analyze the evolution of the Valencian economy in the national context since the outbreak of the COVID-19 crisis. The objective is to make an assessment of the period from the fourth quarter of 2019 to the last quarter of 2022, covering a three- year span. In addition, it seeks to compare the evolution of the economy in the three years following COVID-19 with the economic situation that existed during the 2008 financial crisis. The main topics to be addressed in this report are the evolution of economic activity, the evolution of the labor market and business demographics.

Indicators of price effects in the Valencian economy. Price-monitoring Observatory of the Valencian Community (2022-)

The Ivie has developed through the IvieLAB project, a Price-monitoring Observatory of the Valencian Community, an initiative promoted by the Valencian Regional Government, whose objective is to monitor the effects of the evolution of prices in the economy of the Valencian Community in comparison with Spain and other Spanish regions.

The Observatory aims to provide the tools to build a public system of information and provide a continuous price monitoring of products, goods and services that affect consumer impact the most.

The project includes a database with a system of indicators based on the detailed information of the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which is completed with other price indexes in different areas such as industrial, housing, urban land, trade and tourism. It contains data which is updated on a monthly basis for the Valencian Community, the rest of the Spanish regions and Spain.

Data from Spanish official statistical sources will be used, especially the monthly data provided by Spain's National Statistics Institute (INE). Special attention will be placed on price indicators for products, with a detailed analysis of those that may be increasing excessively and of the underlying inflation that will reveal in greater detail the situation of the Valencian economy.

In addition to the database, the project will include a set of monthly reports showing a quantitative and qualitative analysis of the monthly price evolution in the Valencian Community.

Evaluation of the participation of Valencian companies in Next Generation European Union funds (2023)

The objective of this study is to provide an update of the previous reports that quantify and analyze the participation of Valencian companies in Next Generation European Union (NGEU) funds, comparing the funding obtained up to June 2023 with that obtained by companies from other regions. The analysis distinguishes between the funds raised through tenders and those received through grants and public aid, as well as according to the level of the public sector (state, regional or local). For this purpose, information provided by the Public Sector Procurement Platform (for tenders) and the National Database of Public Grants has been processed, identifying all the calls for proposals financed by NGEU funds (MRR and REACT-EU). In the framework of the 2023 work, a first report was made with the analysis of the data recorded up to December 2022, which is updated in this new document.

The issues analyzed are the following: the weight of companies from the Valencian Region in the awards made in the public procurement of Spanish public administrations (including tenders in funds managed by the General State Administration, autonomous communities and local entities), in terms of number of tenders and amount of the contract; disaggregated information by size of the company, branches of activity and provinces; type of contract; characteristics of the awarded companies; comparison of the weight of Valencian companies with the rest of the Spanish regions in national tenders , etc.

Access by census tract to financial services (bank branches) in the Valencia Region (2023)

The sharp reduction in the number of bank branches (62%) that has taken place in Spain since 2008, year which marked the maximum reached, is a matter of concern due to the problems it generates in terms of access to banking services and, therefore, affects the financial inclusion of the population. This concern has forced the three banking associations, Spanish Banking Association (AEB), CECA and the National Union of Credit Cooperatives (UNACC), to design a roadmap to reduce financial exclusion, with very specific measures depending on the size of the municipality affected.

Thus, an observatory on financial inclusion in Spain was previously drawn up, which has given rise to two reports developed by the Ivie. The first contains information as of December 2021 and the other from December 2022. In addition, this report takes a step forward in the analysis of accessibility to banking services in the specific case of the Valencian Community, descending below the municipality as far as the geographical focus is concerned. This is possible by working with data at census level, which is a much smaller geographical scope. Thus, if there are 542 municipalities in the Valencian Community, the number of census sections in 2022 is much higher (3,484).

Analysis of the distribution of the population by income level at municipal level in the Valencian Community: prosperity, inequality and poverty (2023)

In this report we have exploited data from the Household Income Distribution Atlas (ADRH) spanning between 2015 and 2021 to analyze the situation and evolution in the Valencian Community's municipalities with respect to three key aspects: prosperity, inequality and poverty. The indicators selected for each of the aspects allow us to offer a thorough understanding of the evolution and relative situation of the territories in each case and for every chosen aspects. We analyze prosperity by means of a synthetic indicator (per capita income) and another novel indicator (relative prosperity), which compares income opportunities in the territories considered. The Gini index and the P80/P20 ratio are two indicators used to measure inequality.

Finally, we measure the incidence of relative poverty (those whose income is below 60% of the territory's average income), as well as the incidence of extreme poverty (percentage of people whose income is below 40% of the average).

We can also compare the relative situation of men and women and examine the opportunities available to different age groups. The analysis focuses on three points in time: 2015 (onset), 2019 (intermediate year) and 2021 (initial impact of the COVID-19 pandemic).

Resiliency and equal educational opportunities at regional level (2022-)

The project aims to identify factors that improve equal educational opportunities at regional level and the policies needed to achieve it. The term "resiliency" is relatively new in this area but has recently gained popularity. Based on this approach, a student is considered resilient if, despite growing up in an unfavorable socioeconomic environment, he or she has overcome obstacles to achieve above average educational results. The socioeconomic environment of origin is formed by the social, economic and cultural context in which each student has developed. Since the socioeconomic environment of origin is less of a determining factor in the educational performance of a student, the greater the percentage of these types of students, the greater the equality of opportunities in the educational system and the more inclusive the system will be.

The use of the concept of resiliency to measure equality of opportunity has the advantage of focusing on those who need it most and, thus, giving greater importance of equal educational opportunities. The PISA survey will be used in all its available waves, which could be used to exploit the variations equality of opportunity among Spanish regions and even across countries.

The purpose of the project is to develop a report that describes the activities carried out by the universities and their greatest contribution to the economic and social fields. In order to achieve this, a methodology combining elements of academic, professional and technical assistance with specific knowledge in the analysis of financing in various areas and the evaluation of public finances, knowledge about the specialization of the Valencian economy, the economic-financial characteristics and the investment patterns of the productive fabric, as well as the functioning of the university system from several perspectives, is essential to meet the intended objectives.

After four reports that were presented in 2009, 2012, 2016 and 2019 on the socio-economic contribution of the Valencian public university system (SUPV), this fifth report has been developed with seven specific objectives in mind:

- To provide updated information on the size, organizational structure and educational program of the Valencian public university system, as well as the changes it has undergone in recent years.
- To evaluate the outcome of its activities in areas such as educational training, research, technological advancement and knowledge transfer through a comparative perspective with the use of different indicators.

- To estimate the long-term economic impact on factors such as human and technological capital, tax revenue, economic growth and public profitability of the investments undertaken.
- To examine the impact of university education on the quality of employment in the Valencian Region, considering, among others, aspects such as employment stability, correspondence between the preferences of individuals and their educational training and the type of job or salary.

Talent attraction and retention capacity of Spanish autonomous communities. Third Report (2022-2023)

This study has two main objectives. First, it proposes to draw up the 2022 Talent Ranking Map of Spain, as a continuation of the previous editions (2019, 2021) prepared jointly by the Cotec Foundation and Ivie. This index follows the methodology used by INSEAD in the Global Talent Competitiveness Index (GTCI), a report that is already in its eighth edition and is currently available for more than 130 countries (134 in the 2021 edition), covering around 701 variables related to the ability to attract and retain talent. In its latest edition, several changes have been made adapting it to the times of COVID-19.

This first objective involves updating the existing database, based on available information from different institutions that produce data on a regular basis (such as Eurostat, Spanish Statistics Institute [INE], European Commission, among others), always assuming they are available at regional level. The availability of this information will allow to analyze the impact of talent attraction and retention capability on growth in Spain and its 17 regions. Additionally, it will help identify strengths and areas in which to improve, and analyze changes in the ranking with respect to the previous study.

The second objective of the proposal refers to the construction of a revised, or more complete, version of the Talent Map of Spain, including aspects that have not been covered in the INSEAD Index, such as the availability of airport connections, hotel infrastructure development, healthcare management quality, cultural offers, existing multinational companies or even the weather or climate, among others, which are undoubtedly of particular relevance in the ability of the regions to attract or retain talent, and also in a time marked by the impact of COVID-19. It will also make it possible to place Spanish regions in an international context, comparing them with other developed countries (mainly in Europe).

A feasibility study of the economic impact of traditional festivities in the Valencian Community (2022-2023)

The celebration of traditional holidays in the Valencian Community involves a great rise in demand in various current expenditures and investments that are made by several agents involved in organizing and sharing in these holidays, including visitors, organizers, media, sponsors, etc. The Valencian Community experiences an economic impact in income generation and job creation as a consequence of this rise in demand.

However, the visitor's net impact on the Valencian economy only takes into account spending incurred by non-residents, since in the case of residents it is assumed that they would have made the same expenditure regardless of whether the celebration took place or not. As a result, the economic impact of many popular holidays that are of local nature and whose participants are locals or residents of nearby municipalities, would be null because they involve a transfer of costs within the Valencian Community.

Therefore, the aim of this study is to collect information to determine which traditional holidays are relevant to carry out an economic impact report. This analysis is done for both the internationally significant traditional festivals observed within the Valencian Community and those that have been designated as National Tourist Attractions, such as, Fallas, Sant Joan Bonfires, Magdalena, Misteri d'Elx, Moors and Christians, Tomatina of Buñol or Bous a la Mar of Dénia. The list is made up of 14 international holidays and 25 national ones.

Evaluation of the application of the golden rule to investment: human capital vs. infrastructure (2023)

According to the golden rule, the sustainability of public accounts is not endangered if financed expenditures are productive and an increase in GDP results in fiscal resources that allow debt amortization. In this regard, it is important to consider which public investments are productive, i.e., those that meet this sustainability criterion.

In the past, public investments in physical assets have been excluded from the deficit under consideration by the fiscal rules because they are viewed as expenditures that will have a positive impact on GDP in the medium and long term, allowing to recover the initial investment. The Spanish Ministry of Inclusion and Social Security wants to consider whether certain social expenditures, especially some in education, can also offer returns that justify the same exclusion by contributing to human capital and, through this asset, to employment and productivity improvement.

The lvie will be in charge of developing a research study that analyzes these issues and can support the Spanish Government's proposal that certain expenditures on human capital should be considered similar to investments in tangible assets.

Analysis and monitoring of the objectives for the Observatory on Financial Inclusion (2023)

In July 2022, the three banking associations, Spanish Banking Association (AEB), CECA and the National Union of Credit Cooperatives (UNACC), presented the report developed by Ivie on financial inclusion in Spain. The aim of this report was to study the access to banking services in Spain at municipal level. With this report, a map of financial inclusion in Spain was obtained identifying the municipalities with no physical access to banking services, either in the form of offices (including mobile ones), ATM machines (both in offices and on the move), financial agents or cashpoints in post offices. Once identified, and within the framework of the Observatory on Financial Inclusion, the three banking associations have designed a roadmap with different solutions to achieve their commitment to strengthen financial inclusion in Spain.

According to the Report on Financial Inclusion in Spain released in July 2022, as of 31 December 2021, 243 municipalities with over 500 inhabitants were identified that had no in-person access to banking services, i.e., a total of 211,550 people who reside in them (0.45% of the national total). In order to monitor the degree of compliance with the commitment of the banking associations, this new project carried out jointly with the lvie includes the development of quarterly reports to regularly monitor the measures adopted, with the double objective of readjusting the roadmap if necessary and identifying alternatives that will enable a better compliance with the objectives pursued. In addition, an annual report will also be carried out to review the access to banking services, with the most up-to-date information.

Both the annual and quarterly reports will be based on information sent by the banking entities on the municipalities initially included in the scope of the Protocol, indicating, if applicable, the variations in the points of in-person access to banking services in each of them and detailing their typology.

2023 System of indicators on the Valencian economy (2023)

The objective of this proposal is to continue the work plan defined in the 2022 project developed for AVE to design and create a system of indicators to regularly monitor the activity of the Valencian economy. The system, which was proposed in 2021, is made up of 61 indicators grouped into different fields.

The criterion used for the selection of the indicators is based on data that is available at least quarterly (with some exceptions) and that allows us to place the Valencian Region in the national context, although some indicators also allow a European comparison. Based on the broad group of indicators proposed, two objectives are achieved:

- 1. Information on the key areas that allow monitoring the Valencian Community in the national/European context
- 2. A summary table of the economic situation, with a selection of indicators from the total that summarize the evolution of the economy of the Valencian Community.

In sum, the objective is to have regularly updated and detailed information of the main economic changes reflected by the indicators.

Technology as a driver of growth: the position of the Valencian Region (2023)

The objective of the LAB Mediterráneo Foundation research program is to promote the balanced growth of the Valencian Region, taking into account the new paradigm in which the knowledge economy is framed. This objective is structured around four main pillars:

Economic impact of REDIT: Technological Institutes of the Valencian Community and its contribution to the development of the productive fabric of the Valencian Community (2023)

The proposal has two objectives: first, to assess the economic impact of the activities of REDIT (Technological Institutes of the Valencian Community) in terms of production, income, employment

In the second objective, given that its results depend on the information to be obtained from the field work (survey to a sample of companies to which REDIT provide services), the analysis will refer to 2022, year of reference of the survey questions.

NETWORKS

The **Ivie** participates in eight international networks, Competitiveness, ICTNET, World KLEMS, LA KLEMS, EU KLEMS, Wolpertinger, INDICSER and PREDICT, and two other national ones: REDEV and the network established University Carlos III of Madrid (UC3M), through the Research Institute for Higher Education and Science (INAECU).

The objective of the Network for Good Practices in Evaluation (REDEV), in which AFI, **Ivie** and KSNET participate, is to promote public and private policy evaluation in Spain. This alliance is working on joint projects such as the Evaluation Study on Active Employment Policies in Castilla y León or offering technical assistance to AIReF for the study of active employment policies in Extremadura and the study to evaluate the efficiency of educational spending in the Balearic Islands.

RedEV promotes a comprehensive approach to evaluation that encompasses all the essential phases to contribute to informed and evidence-based decision making, starting from the soundness of the diagnosis and reaching the final phase of evaluation of results and impacts.

The second national collaboration network is the one established, since 2013, with the Carlos III University of Madrid (UC3M), Research Institute for Higher Education and Science (INAECU), for the study and evaluation of the production and use of information in science and technology by scientific communities. UC3M is a competent contact to provide bibliometric information on the scientific activity of Spanish universities that the **Ivie** uses in its projects on the Spanish university system such as U-Ranking.

International networks

One of the networks, SPINTAN, is a project coordinated by **Ivie**, with support of 12 research institutes and European universities. Promoted and financed by the 7th Framework Programme of the European Commission, this project aims to analyze the impact of public sector intangibles on innovation, well-being and "smart" growth (including the role of education, R&D and innovation, and the construction of a digital society).

The **Ivie** participates in the European project in charge of conducting studies that lay the basis for the Annual European Report on Competitiveness. Promoting public debate on aspects related to competitiveness and making recommendations related to the Lisbon strategy and future business policies are some of the objectives of this report. Some of the projects developed by the **Ivie** along this line of collaboration are *Competitiveness of the European cement and lime sectors* and *Study on total factor productivity growth: drivers, components and frontiers firms*.

The **Ivie** is also one of the 31 European institutes that participated in the ICTNET project (European Network for the Research on the Economic Impact of ICTs), a research funded by the European Commission through DG CONNECT (Directorate General for Communications Networks, Content & Technology) which aim was to coordinate research in ICT economics in Europe increasing the relevance of the research on this topic.

The KLEMS (Kapital Labour Energy Material Services) international network aims to promote and facilitate the analysis of growth patterns and the evolution of productivity around the world, based

on a growth accounting framework. At the heart of the initiative is the creation of new databases with the necessary variables to carry out these analyses. Through harmonizing concepts, common standards and classifications, the data is comparable across countries. **Ivie** has participated in this project since its beginning, with the setting up of EU KLEMS, which gathers information about the EU countries, the United States and Japan. The Conference Board was responsible, until 2018, for coordinating the work of all consortium members to keep the database up to date. Subsequently, this responsibility was taken over by the Vienna Institute for International Economic Studies (WIIW). Since 2021, the research center Luiss Lab of European Economics (LLE) has taken over and the database is now called EU KLEMS & INTANPROD.

The Institute has developed a collaborative network in the field of ICT through its participation over ten years in the PREDICT (Prospective Insights on R&D in ICT) project, jointly funded by the European Commission's DG Communications Networks, Content and Technology (DG CONNECT) and the Joint Research Center (JRC). The objective of this project is to analyze the importance of ICT, its productivity and R&D spending in the European Union (EU) and 12 relevant countries within the global ICT market. Another one of the objectives has been the development of a database on the state of the sectors of ICT and audiovisual content, which the European Commission uses to monitor the progress of the Digital Single Market, one of its main strategic areas. In addition, in 2023 the database has been extended to provide information on the scope achieved in the digital and green transition by the European Union countries, especially after the boost of the EU Next Generation funds.

8. DATABASES AND INDICATOR SYSTEMS²

Numerous **Ivie** projects have generated databases or indicator systems of interest to economic research that also facilitates decision making based on objective and up-to-date information. The **Ivie** website provides easy access to the Institute's 32 databases and indicator systems that are classified into eight areas: growth and capitalization, human capital and human development, socio-economic, globalization, international, public sector, universities, and knowledge economy. In 2023, two new databases have been incorporated from the collaboration with the BBVA Foundation Spain's stock of natural capital and Observatory of Productivity and Competitiveness in Spain (OPCE). In addition, the PREDICT project database was expanded in 2023 giving rise to the Twin Transition database, which includes digital transformation indicators, as well as environmental protection and resource management activities not only for ICT related sectors, but for all industries in the economy. Finally, information on intangible assets developed for the COTEC Foundation is now included in two separate databases: one with an international comparison and the other with regional data.

8.1. Growth and capitalization

Capital stock in housing in Spain and its territorial distribution (1990-2010)

The database *Capital stock in housing in Spain and its territorial distribution (1990-2010)* offers data on the capital stock in housing series from 1990 until 2010, land value included. Information is also provided on the changes of total stock in housing and its prices.

Data is broken down by autonomous community, province and population status, distinguishing between municipalities according to the number of inhabitants and whether they are on the coast or inland.

Among the results provided are house prices and total land area of the housing stock, as well as their changes over time. Data are also included on the value of housing stock and land capital stock. The results are classified by industry and region, with the latest information published in 2015.

Stock and capital services in Spain and its territorial distribution (1964-2023)

Since 1995, the **Ivie** and the BBVA Foundation have developed a data base on capital stock since 1995 which includes information on capital accumulation in Spain over the last five decades. A new feature presented in last year's edition was the use of nowcasting techniques to estimate investment and capital stock by sectors and assets for most recent years, thus reaching the analysis of 2023, both in the national and regional cases.

This database allows to consult the national series from 1964 to 2023, as well as by region and provinces. It updates the contribution of productive capital and offers information of the assets invested in, including R&D expenditure. For this purpose, net capital stock (wealth) and capital services (productive capital) are measured.

At national level, the 34 industries considered are disaggregated into 19 types of assets, according to the NACE Rev. 2 classification. The BBVA Foundation-Ivie series are adapted to the 2010 European System of Accounts (ESA) which considers R&D expenditure as investment (Gross Fixed Capital Formation). The classification distinguishes between tangible and intangible assets, within this second group, R&D expenditure is included. In addition, it offers disaggregated information on public infrastructure which is a distinctive characteristic of the BBVA Foundation-Ivie series and includes three new information and communication technology (ICT): software, hardware and communications.

Also, data by autonomous communities and provinces are disaggregated into 19 types of assets, and 25 and 15 industries, respectively. This classification by asset and industry became available for the first time in the 2012 update.

The methodology for estimating the capital series follows the latest OECD recommendations of 2009, which have the advantage of converging with the procedure followed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the EU KLEMS project. The new estimates replace the former lines of research based on the previous OECD methodological recommendations of 2001 and 1992.

The extensive database, that **Ivie** and BBVA Foundation have made public, is accompanied by numerous dynamic graphs, which are now dynamic and interactive, that facilitate the analysis of the evolution and composition of capital endowments in Spain and its regions. As of January 2023, over 1,000 published specialized works have been written based on this information.

Spain's stock of natural capital (1995-2018)

The BBVA Foundation and the lvie are among the many organizations who share an interest in providing a new perspective to economic analysis —that of the environment and the effects that the functioning of the productive system has on it. From this viewpoint, not only is economic growth or progress important, but its sustainability also becomes vital.

The database, which accompanies the book Economía y Medio Ambiente en España: Análisis del Flujo de Materiales y Capital Natural, addresses this concern by providing an estimate of the

country's stock of natural capital. This data supplements that found in other databases on the stock of human and physical capital also developed jointly by both institutions. The data provides a measure of the wealth represented by environmental assets, beyond those usually considered in economic analyses.

The data shows the value of natural capital in Spain (in current and real terms) for the period 1995-2018, distinguishing among nine individual natural assets (timber forest resources, non-timber forest resources, cropland, pasture land, protected areas, oil, natural gas, coal and metallic minerals). The information also includes the territorialization of these series by regions, which is one of the main contributions of the database, as it allows to evaluate the composition and changes of the natural capital of each region over time.

Historical series on public capital in Spain and its territorial distribution (1900-2012)

Since 1995, the **Ivie** and BBVA Foundation have developed a broad research program on Spanish economic growth. One of the fundamental parts of the program is the development of databases on capital stock in Spain which are updated regularly. One of the main characteristics of this series is the importance given to public capital endowments. The continuous analysis of public sector investment carried out by the **Ivie** and BBVA Foundation has enabled the development of this database covering more than a century.

The study measures investment in the public sector from a long-term perspective with a detailed look at distribution by autonomous communities and provinces, thus allowing the territorial evolution of public capital to be analyzed for more than a century. In addition, the study facilitates both a better evaluation of public policies, as well as an analysis of the impact of public capital on regional or provincial growth and convergence.

The database spans more than a century of Spain's history and is detailed according to autonomous community and province, thus facilitating the analysis of the impact of public capital on growth and convergence among regions. Detailed information is also provided on the public sector's investment strategy in areas key to growth and welfare, such as infrastructures, health, and education.

Intangible assets

The database *Inversión en activos intangibles más allá del PIB en España y sus regiones*, developed by the **Ivie** in collaboration with the Cotec Foundation for Innovation, offers information on the gross fixed capital formation (GFCF) in intangible assets in Spain and its autonomous communities by sectors. Data is available for the period 1995-2020, in both current and constant euros for 2015.

The database offers a sectoral breakdown of 27 sectors according to the NACE 2009. The intangible assets are organized into two main groups: those already included in GDP (considered investment by the European System of Accounts, ESA, 2010), referred to as AIPIB, and those not yet included

in the national accounts which are grouped under the name AIMAPIB (intangible assets "beyond GDP"). These two major groups are classified in nine individual intangible assets.

In 2023 this database is now included in two separate databases: one with an international comparison and the other with regional data.

Previous to this work collaboration with COTEC, the Telefónica Foundation and Ivie developed the report *Activos intangibles: una inversión necesaria para el crecimiento económico en España* (Intangible assets: a necessary investment for Spain's economic growth). This was the first database with an annual series of the value of investment in intangible assets and their capitalization for the Spanish economy as a whole. The period covers the years from 1995 to 2011 and can also be found, in PcAxis format, on Ivie's website, www.ivie.es.

Household investment and capital endowments in durable assets

The book "El equipamiento de los hogares y las dotaciones de capital de las familias en el siglo XXI" (Household equipment and capital stock in the 21st century), developed by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** within their economic research collaboration program, offers an in-depth look at household capitalization. This work makes an economic assessment, from a national and regional perspective, of consumer durables accumulated by Spanish families over time, thus, providing a broad view of the level of household equipment and its composition. As a result of this research, the database Household investment and capital endowments in durable assets (2000-2017) has been developed.

The database is structured in two main areas:

A1. Household investment in equipment. The first area provides information on household investment in durable goods. The series of investment at current prices (A.1.1) and investment at constant 2010 prices (A.1.2) are presented, covering the period 2000-2017 for Spain and its autonomous communities. Greater detail is provided at national level for investment, which comprises a total of 33 individual goods, grouped into four broad categories: furniture and goods, appliances, vehicles and other means of personal transport, and digital equipment. At regional level, series are available for 11 consumer durables grouped in the same four broad categories as the national breakdown

A2. Household capital in equipment. The second area includes the main series of net capital stock in durable goods of households (A.2). As in the previous area for investment, the information is presented in current (A.2.1) and constant 2010 terms (A.2.2), and with the same temporal and territorial coverage and detail by type of durable goods.

Observatory of Productivity and Competitiveness in Spain (OPCE)

Continuing with its focus on the productivity and competitiveness deficits of the Spanish economy, the BBVA Foundation and Ivie have launched a new project, the Observatory of Productivity and Competitiveness in Spain (OPCE, in its Spanish initials), whose aims are to generate systematic data and carry out international, sectoral and regional analyses and comparisons on productivity and competitiveness in Spain.

The first edition of the OPCE database has two sections, one with national information and the other with a regional perspective. The variables included in both are the same (productivity of labor, capital, total factor productivity [TFP], contributions of labor and capital to the growth of value added and labor productivity, etc.). The difference between the two is found, first, in the sectoral detail of the information, since, for Spain, it is possible to distinguish among 33 individual sectors of activity, while for the Spanish regions, the first edition of the database only offers information for the economy as a whole. Secondly, the period covered is also different: 1995-2022 for the national comparison and 1995-2021 for the regional.

Given that the official figures of the Observatory's main variables have a time lag of one or two years, and the importance of obtaining advance indicators of the most recent evolution of productivity in our country, the OPCE will soon include a productivity tracker, which will offer half-yearly information on the evolution of labor productivity, capital productivity and TFP for the national total and by sector of activity.

8.2. Human capital and human development

Human capital in Spain and its regional distribution

The results obtained from the Human Capital Project undertaken by the **Ivie** in collaboration with the Bancaja Foundation improve the statistical information already available on human capital and have enabled the **Ivie** to create a database that contains abundant information on the evolution of the Spanish population's educational levels.

The period covered in the database is from 1964 until 2013. The series are structured by educational levels, population groups, regions, provinces and sectors and can be accessed through **lvie**'s website: www.ivie.es.

Human development in Spain

The Human Development Index is an indicator that measures a country's degree of economic development and combines health, education and income measures. It was first published in 1990, as part of the United Nations Development Program, and quickly became more popular than the simple comparison by per capita income, it being a more informative indicator.

Within the Human Capital research framework developed by Bancaja and the **lvie** since 2000, a data series on human development for Spain and its autonomous communities has been built according to the methodology proposed by the UN. Furthermore, an alternative methodology is proposed to correct the major deficiencies of the UN index. The data currently covers the period 1980-2010.

The database contains the Human Development Index and the New Human Development Index, which both have health, education and income components.

Observatory of young people's transition to the labor market

The Observatory of the Transition of Young People to the labor market is a data bank developed through the Human Capital Project sponsored by the Bancaja Foundation, which was updated every three years. The data from the Observatory's six surveys, 1996, 1999, 2002, 2005, 2008 and 2011 have been homogenized and categorized, the following factors being taken into account:

- Basic data on survey participants: age, level of education, gender, work experience, employment situation, nationality; motive for job search, employment search methods; information on academic history.
- Data on family background (education level of parents, socio-professional position of parents, household income).
- Psychosocial data which include attitudes, behavior and experiences of young people in the labor market: initiative, passivity, self-effectiveness, different elements of employment stress, centrality, satisfaction with life, one's economic situation and employment, extrinsic, intrinsic and social aspects of employment, and "justice at work".
- Data on the educational background, work and life experience of those polled, time spent studying, at what age they begin looking for work, left the house, formed their first relationship and had their first child.
- Employment: duration, type of contract, commitment, salary, type of employer and sector, reasons for leaving the job and contractual flexibility.
- Aspects related to the health and the general well-being of the young people.

Economic value of human capital

This database, which accompanies the book "El valor económico del capital humano en España y sus regions" (The economic value of human capital in Spain and its regions), allows to expand on the limited information existing on this subject for Spain. The territorial analysis it provides on the value of human resources in Spain from 2000 to 2018 can serve as a useful complement to the already accurate picture offered by the series of capital stock in Spain and its regions on the

process of non-human capital accumulation for over two decades and is a result of the collaboration between the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**.

The database is structured in four areas:

- A1: Estimation of the economic value of human capital in current terms (millions of euros).
- A2: Estimation of the economic value of human capital in constant terms (millions of euros in 2010).
- A3: Estimate of the economic value of human capital per capita in current terms (euros per capita)
- A4: Estimation of the economic value of human capital per capita in constant terms (2010 euros per capita).

To develop these series and to ensure they are consistent with National Accounts, a broad set of information on wages, job performance, demographic characteristics and educational patterns has been used differentiating for every region up to 1,360 different types of jobs.

8.3. Socio-economic regional differences

Access to services

This new database substitutes the "Access to banking services" database, which only provided information on banking services, by expanding the data available to include access to health services (hospitals and primary care centers), educational services (primary, secondary and post-secondary) and banking services (offices). In order to obtain this information, the number of centers/offices available for each of these services, as well as the number of municipalities that do not have such services and the population residing in these localities are provided.

The analysis, with data from 2019, is performed for all the regions of Spain (disaggregated at municipal level), so as to obtain a comparative picture of the accessibility to these services in the provinces and regions. The database on access to banking services also includes information from 2008 showing the evolution with the current situation.

The contents of this database have been used to prepare the report on the distribution of the population and its access to services in Spain (*Distribución de la población y accesibilidad a los servicios en España*), developed by the **Ivie** for the Ramón Areces Foundation. The database can be accessed directly from **Ivie**'s website.

Social capital

Social capital is a concept that for over a decade has attracted the attention of all social sciences and international institutions because of its outstanding potential in the processes of development.

The term social capital highlights the role of cooperation and trust in achieving collective or economic results. The **Ivie** carries out a joint project with the BBVA Foundation for the study of social capital. During 2013, the social capital database, built within the framework of this project, was updated. The international database, which includes OECD countries, covers from 1970 until 2011, and the series for Spain (with territorial breakdown by regions and provinces) until the year 2013.

The database was published by the BBVA Foundation on 11 November 2015. Information and/or data series to date can be requested to publicaciones@lvie.es.

Education accounts

The BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**, within its cooperation framework program, have developed several studies on important topics such as educational training, employment and innovation. From this collaboration arises the database Spanish Education Accounts (*Cuentas de la Educación en España*) which addresses several key issues related to the Spanish educational system: What is its size and how is it structured? How much is spent on education? Who are the producers of educational services and who are the beneficiaries?

The education accounts (EA) database 2000-2016 is structured into six large areas. The first (A.1) and second (A.2) areas are devoted to public and private education accounts, respectively. The third (A.3) offers information on total spending on education, while the fourth (A.4) and fifth (A.5) contain data on public and household expenditure on education. Finally, the sixth area (A.6) contains the student series.

The database is available for download in Excel format on the BBVA Foundation website: www.fbbva.es/

Inequality in Spain, its regions and its provinces

Sponsored by Caixa Galicia Foundation, the aim of this study is to analyze the evolution of household consumption and income distribution in Spain from both a territorial and temporal perspective.

The database covers the period 1973/74-2005, with annual intervals from 1998 to 2005. Among the data provided is in-depth information on autonomous communities regarding their total expenditure per person and per household, according to the social class or studies of the main breadwinner. The expenditure is detailed in a total of twelve groups (education, housing, health, and leisure, among others).

Basic data were used from the Household Budget Surveys for the periods 1973/74, 1980/81 and 1990/91, and the Continuous Household Budget Surveys, published by the INE, for the period 1998 to 2005, with autonomous community disaggregation.

The data are available on **Ivie**'s website (https://www.ivie.es/es_ES/bases-de-datos/diferencias-economicas-y-sociales-de-los-territorios/desigualdad/) and are also incorporated in the World Bank and United Nations University (WIDER) databases.

Inequality based on individual consumption

The BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie**, as part of their collaboration program, have developed the study *Consumption and social well-being: Lessons from the crisis*, which measures household consumption and individual consumption according to the socio-demographic profile of the household. The social welfare resulting from consumption is then obtained, serving as the foundation for assessing inequality (following the methodology developed by Jorgenson and Schreyer). The study examines the impact of the Great Recession on consumption, social welfare and inequality from a national and regional perspective.

The information in the database *La medición de la desigualdad en España y sus CC. AA. a partir del consumo individual (2006-2017)* that accompanies the document allows us to address several key questions about the impact of the Great Recession and the subsequent recovery on Spanish household consumption, as well as its effect on social welfare and inequality. This analysis covers all of Spain and its regions, and is broken down by household type and the demographic profile of the primary breadwinner.

The database is structured in four large areas, based on household and individual consumption, social welfare and inequality series.

The first two parts (A.1 and A.2) are dedicated to household and individual consumption, respectively. Each of these two areas is divided into two categories: the first, the series calculated from total consumption (Consumption) and the second, those calculated from monetary expenditure (Expenditure). This subdivision is maintained for the remaining areas.

The third area (A.3) offers information on social welfare measured from individual consumption (A.3.1) and from individual expenditure (A.3.2); while the fourth (A.4) includes the Inequality series obtained from individual consumption (A.4.1) and from individual expenditure (A.4.2).

Migration in the Valencia region

The Examination of Migration in the Valencia Region, is undertaken by the **Ivie** for the Bancaja Foundation (previously included in the Observatory on Immigration in the Valencian Region of the CeiMigra Foundation, sponsored by Bancaja). Its objective is two-fold: first, to provide a comprehensive view of the immigration phenomenon with its many social and economic profiles, through the compilation and systematization of available information, while also detecting gaps in this information. Second, to provide access to adequate statistical material for subsequent detailed analysis of the various aspects of immigration.

The last edition, dated December 2011, includes comparative data on the situation of emigration and immigration in OECD countries, and also information on the remittances sent and received from the immigrants of nationalities most represented in Spain, the employment situation of immigrants in their country of origin or the reason for their moving to Spain.

The data of Migration in the Valencia Region are available on lvie's website: www.ivie.es.

Life tables for Spain and its regions

Life tables are fundamental in providing a numerical representation of the status changes occurring within a population over time. **Ivie** Researcher Francisco J. Goerlich and Rafael Pinilla have calculated the classic biometric functions of the Life Tables for Spain and its regions, covering the period 1975-2018. The data bank also contains four demographic indicators for each year and geographic area: average age of population, average-age life expectancy, life potential and life potential per capita.

The database contains period life tables with annual periods for Spain (complete and abridged by five-year groups up to a final open interval of 110 and over), its autonomous communities (abridged to a final open interval of 100 and over), and provinces (abridged to a final open interval of 85 years and older).

For the population data tables, information from the Spanish National Statistics Institute is used. Data on deaths are from the Vital Statistics on the natural movement of population (MNP). The microdata can be downloaded from INE's website, and is classified by age, period, generation (Lexis triangles) and groups of cause-of-death. The latest available figures correspond to 2018.

Three aspects distinguish **lvie**'s Life Table database from INE's: data is homogenous since 1975; it is disaggregated by large groups of cause-of-death; and includes an additional demographic indicator: life potential.

The data is available to researchers and interested public via the **lvie** website (www.ivie.es), with the possibility of obtaining the information in map format.

Homogeneous population series

For over a decade already, the BBVA Foundation and the **lvie**, under their cooperation framework agreement, have put the focus on demographic analysis, from a more aggregate level to municipal or lower scale. The information offered by the population censuses available and comparable since the end of the 19th century has made it possible to build the Homogenous population series.

The homogenization process of the de jure resident population, taking into account the changes in municipalities' borders for more than one century, has been very strenuous. The disappearance of municipalities, their creation, division, merging or changes of name have been tracked for each one of the more than 8,000 municipalities during the eleven censuses taken.

This Spanish population database is based on the municipal structure of the 2011 Census. Reference data is the de jure population and is dated for each one of the twelve censuses prepared by INE since the beginning of the 20th century, allowing a detailed analysis of the changes in location of population patterns during the period 1900-2011.

The database is accessible on the BBVA Foundation website, www.fbbva.es, and contains information for the 8,116 Spanish municipalities existing in 2011. The series are classified in

accordance with the code associated with each municipal area and grouped by the 52 Spanish provinces, also offering the area in square miles of each municipality.

8.4. Globalization

INTEGRA

The INTEGRA data bank is framed within **lvie**'s research program with the BBVA Foundation and under the International economic integration research area, and consists of a wide range of indicators to measure the evolution of economies' integration on a worldwide scale.

The INTEGRA database has three different indicators (degree of openness, connection and integration) which have been developed with a broad level of geographical and temporal disaggregation. A total of eighty-five countries are covered (representing 97% of world GDP in 2007), spanning the period 1985-2007. It also provides indicators of total trade in goods, indicators corrected by the distance between countries and indicators disaggregated by industries according to the ISIC-3 classification (Revision 2), with a distinction between the two directions of trade flows: exports and imports.

8.5. International

EU KLEMS

KLEMS (Kapital Labour Energy Material Services) international network aims to promote and facilitate the analysis of growth patterns and the evolution of productivity around the world, based on a growth accounting framework. At the heart of the initiative is the creation of new databases with the necessary variables to carry out these analyses. Through harmonizing concepts, common standards and classifications, the data is comparable across countries. Some of the variables included are value added, capital stock, employment and human capital.

The **Ivie** has participated in this project since its beginning, with the setting up of EU KLEMS, which gathers information about the EU countries, the United States, Canada, South Korea, Australia and Japan. The Conference Board is responsible for coordinating the work of the consortium and updating the database.

The **Ivie** has also supported the creation and development of LA KLEMS, which is the extension of this study of productivity to several Latin American countries. The latest initiative of this global network is ASIA KLEMS, which includes the Asian countries. In the same way, the **Ivie** participates actively in the development of World KLEMS that frames the rest of projects and regional KLEMS databases.

In addition to the **Ivie**, more than 40 research centers and institutions from around the world participate in the KLEMS consortium. Information is available at <u>www.euklems.net</u> and can be accessed through **Ivie's** website.

SPINTAN

The SPINTAN Project (Smart Public Intangibles), directed by the **lvie** for the European Commission, aims to define the theoretical and empirical characteristics of public intangible policies. The project is carried out by academic researchers from diverse European institutes and universities.

The database contains information on public intangible assets for 22 EU countries, United States, China and Brazil covering the period 1995-2015. It provides information on the investment and the capital stock in intangible assets such as brands, design, entertainment and artistic originals, organizational capital, employer-provided training, as well as expenditure on R&D and software which are now included in the national accounts of each country.

The database, which is available on the SPINTAN website (www.spintan.net), includes information on the following industries: scientific research and development; public administration and defense; compulsory social security; education; human health and social work activities; and arts, entertainment and recreation.

This information allows us to analyze the impact of public sector intangibles on innovation, well-being and smart growth (including education, R&D and the construction of a digital society).

ICT sector and its R&D (PREDICT)

The **Ivie** has developed for the European Commission a wide database on the Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) and Audiovisual Content sectors, within the framework of the Prospective Insights on (R&D) in ICT (PREDICT) Project. The PREDICT project, jointly funded by the European Commission's DG Communications Networks, Content and Technology (DG CONNECT) and the Joint Research Center (JRC-UnitB6), analyzes the importance of ICT, its productivity and R&D spending in the European Union (EU) and 12 relevant countries within the global ICT market.

The traditional PREDICT database offers information for 12 variables; value added, employment (hours worked and number of employed persons), productivity, labor productivity, Business Enterprise R&D expenditures (BERD), number of personnel and of researchers, ICT R&D public funding, as well as its deflators, PPP and currency exchange rates. The data is available for the ICT sector, following the OECD classification (2007) of ICT industries, which comprises 12 ICT manufacturing and services subsectors and some selected non-ICT producing high-tech sectors.

This database is one of the tools used by the European Commission to monitor the progress of the Digital Single Market, one of its key strategic areas. In addition, in 2023 the database has been extended to provide information on the scope achieved in the digital and green transition by European Union countries, especially after the boost of the EU Next Generation funds.

This expansion has resulted in a second database, the Twin Transition database, which includes indicators of digital transformation as well as environmental protection and resource management activities not only for the ICT and related sectors, but also for all industries in the economy.

Currently, the database, regularly updated by the **Ivie**, covers the period 1995 to 2020 (last year with official data). Provisional estimates on the evolution of the main ICT sectors and the Media and content and Retail sale via mail order houses or via internet sectors are available for 2021 and 2022.

The PREDICT initiative aims to compare the evolution of the EU ICT sector with its R&D and its major competitors as well as the progress of the digital and green transition in the EU and its Member States.

8.6. Public sector

COVID-19 Severity and Impact Indicators (ISIC-19)

The COVID-19 pandemic has put every country in the world on high alert. The rapid spread of the pandemic, its consequences on the health system and the strict confinement measures that have disrupted economic activities have put at risk the globalized world as we know it. To assess the effects of the pandemic on population health and to try to control the negative economic effects associated with it, tools are needed to monitor its evolution in different territories. To accomplish this, the **lvie** has developed three synthetic indicators, known as COVID-19 Severity and Impact Indicators (ISIC-19), that focus on the severe cases and allow to assess the severity and impact of the pandemic and to study its evolution, giving a regional comparison of the situation.

The *scope* index measures the amount of severely affected people over total population, which can be expressed as a gross index (ratio between the cumulative number of severely affected people and the total population) and as a net index (ratio between the number of severely affected people minus recovered patients and total population). The *severity* index measures to what degree this part of the population is seriously affected based on the Balanced Worth methodology developed by Herrero and Villar (2013, 2018). The *impact* index is the result of these two components, scope and severity, which measures how many people are severely affected and to what degree, in relation to the total population.

The methodology used to construct the indicators is detailed on the **Ivie** website, along with the algorithm developed by Rodrigo Aragón and Héctor García (**Ivie**) that facilitates the calculation of the Balanced Worth.

This index is based on data provided daily by the Spanish Ministry of Health on the number of deaths, and hospitalized and recovered patients, for Spain as a whole and for each of the Spanish regions. The data is available from 19 March 2020 onwards.

Basic public services expenditure in Spain and its regions

Education, health and social protection, known as basic public services (BPS), are particularly relevant activities of the public sector: due to the importance of the resources allocated to them and the activities carried out. In fact, they represent more than half of public spending and are needed to reach the equity goals pursued by public interventions, especially the principle of equal opportunities.

This database includes information on public sector activities related to the provision and management of services: health (primary, specialist and hospital care, public health, clinical research); education (pre-school, primary, secondary, post-secondary and higher, scholarships, education services); and social services (retirements, disease and disability, advanced age, family protection, unemployment, housing, social exclusion).

The study examines the trajectory of BPS expenditure in Spain and its autonomous communities over the course of the 21st century in order to provide objective data which can be referred to in assessments and decision making. The period covered allows to distinguish differences across regions before and during the crisis.

Regional differences in the Spanish public sector

The database *Regional differences in the Spanish public sector* is part of a research project carried out by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** with a double objective. First, to generate new fresh information on public-sector performance in Spain and its regions. Second, to analyze the data obtained to gain a more detailed picture of the extent of its performance, the reasons underlying regional differences and their effect on inter-territorial solidarity and economic efficiency.

The database, available at the BBVA Foundation website (www.fbbva.es), contains regionalized data for the period 2000-2008 and covers information on the size of the public sector in each region and its territorial distribution by levels of government, by functions and by revenue and expenditure items.

Public health expenditure in Spain

The *Public Health Expenditure in Spain* database contains statistical information on public health spending in Spain by regions for the 1991-2010 period.

It is a homogeneous territorial database that supplements those offered by the Public Healthcare Expenditure Statistics (EGSP), which are produced by the Spanish Ministry of Health in collaboration with the autonomous communities. In addition to starting in 1991, this database offers more detailed regional information than the EGSP, reaches 94% of total public health spending and provides information by public stakeholders. Also, a homogeneous series for the whole period has been constructed.

The databank, which is available on the BBVA Foundation website, www.fbbva.es, contains information on public health expenditure by region covering the period 1991-2010 in Spain, with specific data on the autonomous communities. Supplementary tables are also provided on GDP

deflators and prices, population projections by region and age, health expenditure profiles and health expenditure evolution.

8.7. Universities

U-Ranking

U-Ranking is a set of Synthetic Indicators of the Spanish University System (ISSUE), available at www.u-ranking.es, which offers the user two products. First, it provides a set of synthetic indicators on public and private universities in Spain, allowing them to be ranked according to their performance (U-Ranking) and their volume of results (U-Ranking Volume). U-Ranking takes into account the three missions of university activity (teaching, research, and innovation and technological development). The website offers the global synthetic indicators obtained by each university, as well as the indicators in each activity and area, thus allowing each institution to be compared from different points of view.

Furthermore, the U-Ranking website provides an accurate and easy-to-use tool, allowing the user to build their own personalized ranking with their chosen degree and make a comparison of what each university has to offer, expressing their preferences about what to study and where, as well as the importance given to different university activities. Along with the personalized listing, other information of interest is provided, such as the last cut-off mark, the price of credits and details about the university surroundings.

The 9th edition of U-Ranking, developed by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** analyzes a total of 72 Spanish universities, 48 public and 24 private, by monitoring different indicators and constructing various synthetic indexes. U-Ranking 2023 also includes a specific analysis on the evolution of postgraduate education (Master's and Doctoral degree) over the last decade.

SIUVP

SIUVP (Valencian Public University System of Information) is a project born in 2012 from the collaboration of the five Valencian public universities – University of Valencia, Alicante University, Polytechnic University of Valencia, Jaume I University and Miguel Hernández University at Elchewith the aim of offering a complete set of indicators on their activity and results.

SIUVP is a window to the Valencian university activity, a tool by which universities account in a transparent manner to society, for the effectiveness and efficiency achieved in their performance. Through the website, users have access to a comprehensive information system that consists of more than 60 indicators.

The information in this platform allows the user to know the situation and development of the five universities in areas related to the supply and demand of degrees, the academic performance of

their students, internationalization, research activity, knowledge transfer to society and economic results of its activity.

The SIUVP database provides information on 60 indicators that are structured in seven different areas: Admission, Students, Academic results, Internationalization, Human resources, Research and tech transfer and Economic data.

The SIUVP website (www.siuvp.es) is updated twice a year to offer the latest data available.

8.8. Knowledge economy

ABACO

ABACO (Observatory of Knowledge-Based Activities) rises as a joint project of the **lvie**, the Universitat de València and the Universitat Politècnica de València with the aim of measuring and analyzing the knowledge-based activities.

One of the pillars of ABACO is the generation of its own information system, available on the ABACO website, which facilitates the analysis and diagnosis of the current situation and recent evolution of knowledge-based activities in Spain, as well as comparison with other countries.

ABACO offers the user a powerful database which is regularly updated with over 200 indicators structured in five areas: New technologies, Human capital, Innovation system, Business environment, and Socio-economic impact.

ABACO also offers extensive detailed information on knowledge intensive GDP. The database contains information about the weight that knowledge-based factors have in the gross value added (GVA) of each of the eighteen countries studied (Australia, Austria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Netherlands, Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, South Korea, Sweden, United Kingdom, and USA). The results are also presented by sector of activity (according to the NACE Rev. 1 classification).

Value of knowledge-based economic activities

The aim of this database, developed by the **Ivie** in collaboration with the Ramon Areces Foundation, is to quantify the value of knowledge-based economic activities in Spain and its autonomous communities. With this purpose, the database assesses the market value of the contributions of productive factors that add more knowledge to the production system (skilled work, ICT, intangible assets and machinery and equipment), an exercise based on the methodology of growth accounting. The database follows the methodology found in the report and provides information on the total and regional GVA in Spain, as well as its disaggregation into two parts: GVA based on knowledge (knowledge-based activities) and GVA with no knowledge-based activities or based on productivity factors with low knowledge content.

The database, which covers the period 2000-2014 (2013 for regional data), presents a high industry-level breakdown: 27 sectors at national level and 21 at regional level, defined according to the CNAE 2009/NACE Rev. 2 classification.

The database is available since 2017 on Ivie's website.

The Size of Cultural, Creative and ICT Activities in Spain

The book La dimensión de las actividades culturales, creativas y TIC en España (The Size of Cultural, Creative and ICT Activities in Spain), prepared by the BBVA Foundation and the **Ivie** as part of their joint Economic Research Program, analyzes the main economic macro-magnitudes generated by cultural, creative and technological (ACCT, for their initials in Spanish) activities, as well as the penetration of cultural, creative and ICT occupations (OCCT, Spanish initials) in the economy, and the rate of investment in intangible assets directly related to these activities, from a national and international perspective, thus providing a global vision of the impact of culture, creativity and technology on the economy.

The publication is accompanied by a database with information structured in two different blocks. The first block (A.1) offers information on the main macro-magnitudes of National Accounts from the perspective of the sectors of activity, through the classification of economic activities by cultural domains. While, the second block (A.2) gathers the employment series from the perspective of occupations.

9. SCIENTIFIC MEETINGS³

The Institute has taken an active part in promoting and supporting the participation of its associates in national and international meetings, and also by organizing seminars, workshops and courses in different places. Through these activities, the **lvie** hopes to make its head office, and the university departments and institutions with which it collaborates, a regular meeting point for researchers, other specialists and social institutions. As a result of the pandemic, the **lvie** reinforced the remote organization and participation in activities through digital connection platforms and live broadcasting, making it possible to reach more people by eliminated the geographic barrier.

9.1. Organized by the **Ivie**

The pandemic affected and transformed **lvie**'s agenda both in 2020 and 2021 as restrictions were imposed to safeguard the health of others. However, these limitations have helped to progress in digitalization and the use of new cutting-edge technologies that make it possible to participate in activities without the need to attend in person. In 2022, the **lvie** increased its audience as a result of hybrid activities that allowed both in-person and online participation.

By means of these technologies, the **Ivie** has been able to organize seminars, dialogues, workshops and conferences in collaboration with other entities and also individually combining face-to-face and online participation.

Ernest Lluch Foundation-Ivie Dialogues: Socioeconomic challenges of demographic change

The Ernest Lluch Foundation and the **Ivie** began their collaboration in 2018 with the organization of the series of dialogues on INEQUALITY AND DEMOCRACY, which continued in 2019 with another series of dialogues entitled THE QUEST FOR PROSPERITY: CHALLENGES OF MIGRATION. Despite the restrictions imposed by the pandemic, the dialogues continued in 2020 with the title SPORTS, ECONOMY AND HEALTH: CHANGING THE RULES OF THE GAME, in which five dialogues were held with the participation of ten experts, although some had to participate remotely, via video conference, while the in-person audience capacity was reduced to one-third. All the dialogues were streamed live on Ivie's YouTube channel. In 2021, the series of dialogues entitled "CRISIS Y CATARSIS: LECCIONES DEL COVID-19" (CRISIS AND CATHARSIS: LESSONS LEARNED FROM COVID-19) were organized with a dual format (in-person and online). In 2022 and 2023, the public could decide whether to attend in person or choose the online option via **Ivie**'s YouTube channel, thus, allowing the audience access to **Ivie**'s activities regardless of their location.

IvieLAB Conferences and Seminars

The IvieLAB (Laboratory for the Analysis and Evaluation of Public Policy) is an initiative of the **Ivie**, in collaboration with the Valencian Regional Government that began in 2018, with the objective to promote ideas, design methodologies and elaborate information to analyze, evaluate and improve public policies.

It also contributes to the dissemination of knowledge through public outreach activities. In this sense, in 2023, the last session of the **5th Valencian Economic Congress** and an IvieLAB conference were organized to analyze the debt of the Spanish regions and its relationship with regional funding.

On 1 March, the conference *Deuda y sostenibilidad de las finanzas autonómicas* (Debt and sustainability of regional finances) took place, the purpose to inform on issues related to this topic, focusing on the two issues highlighted in the title of the conference: debt and sustainability of regional finances. The basis of the conference was the valuable set of data available, thanks to the contributions of the institutions and the analysis made by the speakers in their recent work.

The **5th Valencian Economic Congress** came to an end on October 27 in Castelló de la Plana, after those held in Alicante and Valencia in 2022. Thus ending an event whose objective has been to create common visions of the situation and strategies that the economy of the Valencian Community will face in the future. The first two meetings addressed the evolution of the Valencian economy since the Statute of Autonomy, and the main challenges at present, while this last session focused on analyzing the transformation of the Valencian economy since the pandemic and future challenges.

Within these challenges, the congress focused mainly on energy transition, since it poses a significant challenge for the Spanish industry, and in particular for the ceramic cluster, which energy consumption is high. In a world increasingly focused on sustainability, companies face pressure to reduce their carbon footprint and adopt renewable energy sources. This involves substantial investments in cleaner technology and production processes, as well as the cost of adapting to new rules and regulations. However, this transition offers opportunities for innovation and competitiveness, as well as a greener image that can attract environmentally conscious investors and consumers.

This third and final session, organized by the Generalitat Valenciana and the Ivie, was attended by experts in the implications of the energy transition and the sustainability of the industry, as well as professionals from the ceramics sector, located in Castellón. In addition, Ivie's Research Deputy Director, Joaquín Maudos, presented the report *Evolución de la economía valenciana desde la COVID-19* (Evolution of the Valencian economy since COVID-19). GECE Conferences

The Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory in the Valencian Community (GECE) was created in 2017 by Bankia and has continued its activity throughout 2023, after CaixaBank renewed its participation in 2022 To continue with the objective of studying the levels of competitiveness of Valencian firms, as well as the factors and internal causes that contribute to making businesses more competitive, GECE organized two conferences which brought together representatives of Valencian firms, along with academics and Public Administration.

10. DISSEMINATION

10.1. Presentation of studies

The dissemination activities carried out by the Institute and the entities with which it collaborates have led to a record number of media coverage in 2023, with more than 4,500 impacts. The dissemination of reports, studies and other lyie research has been carried out this year, both through press conferences, congresses, dialogue sessions, seminars or through direct notes sent to the media. In total, 39 press releases were produced in 2023, including the series of *Esenciales* documents, for the dissemination of studies carried out by Ivie researchers and technicians:

- On 27 January 2023, the GECE Observatory presented the report 04/2022, on the position of women in the ownership and governance of Valencian companies, at CaixaBank's headquarters in Valencia. The GECE Observatory is an initiative of the Ivie and CaixaBank.
- On March 1, the conference *Deuda y sostenibilidad de las finanzas autonómicas* was organized within the framework of the IvieLAB project. The session, held at the ADEIT University-Business Foundation, brought together experts from AFI, Fedea, AIReF, Funcas and the Ivie.
- The day after, on March 2, a press conference was organized at the Ivie headquarters to pre-launch the Valencia Marathon 2022 impact report. A project carried out for the Trinidad Alfonso Foundation.
- On March 6, a press release was disseminated to the media summarizing the main results of the IvieLAB report entitled, *Diagnóstico de la situación de las mujeres en la propiedad y el gobierno corporativo de las empresas valencianas*.
- On Women's Day, March 8, the SIUVP platform data was updated and a press release was sent to
 the media highlighting the increase in the presence of women in the university. The SIUVP platform
 is an initiative that arises from Ivie's collaboration with Valencian public universities.
- Once again this year, the update of the capital stock database and the publication of the annual report that accompanies it were presented to the media through a press release. The data, which analyzes the trajectory of investment and public and private capital endowments in Spain and its territories, was released on March 13.
- The Ivie presented the main conclusions of the del Análisis económico y financiero del sector aeronáutico y aeroespacial en Galicia y España y su sistema de valor, led by José Manuel Pastor, during the V International Aeronautical and Space Congress (CIAG), held in Lugo on February 14. The report, developed by José Manuel Pastor, Manuela Pardo and Carlos Albert, studies the evolution and current situation of the aeronautical and aerospace sector strictly (ANAE), but also extended to other companies that, although not belonging to the ANAE sector, dedicate all or most of their activity to the sector, participating in its value system (SVANAE).

- On March 14, the supermarket chain Mercadona held its annual press conference to present its results. Among the information provided by its president, Juan Roig, were the data from the economic impact report for 2023, developed by the Ivie.
- The Ministry of Finance, in collaboration with the Ivie, organized a conference on expenditure management in which the experiences of the Basque Government and the Generalitat de Catalunya were explained, as well as AIReF's vision. The conference La Evaluación de Políticas Públicas y la mejora en la eficiencia de la Administración, held on March 28, was attended by Ivie economist Juan Pérez, who presented the main results of the study developed by the Ivie to guide the implementation of a continuous evaluation system for public spending policies, economic control and assessment of results within the framework of budget planning in the Valencian public sector.
- Also on March 28, the Ministry of Universities and Crue Spanish Universities announced the signing of an agreement to analyze the instruments of programming and multiannual financing by objectives of the universities. The press release also highlighted Ivie's participation in the project, which collaborates with Crue to elaborate a study to create a new model of university governance that is more strategic and with a follow-up that allows for better accountability. Within the framework of this project, the Minister of Universities, Joan Subirats, visited the Ivie on May 8.
- On May 15, the BBVA Foundation and the Ivie presented a tool to compare the labor market outcomes of different studies and universities, which is included in the U-Ranking 2023 project, but whose results anticipate the presentation of the full report. In 2023, two media impacts were generated: the first with the labor market insertion results and the second to disseminate the complete analysis of universities in 2023.
- On May 25, IVF and the Ivie organized the XI Conference on the Spanish Banking Sector in Valencia, which included a conference by the President of the European Banking Authority, José Manuel Campa.
- Five days later, on May 30, Grupo Cooperativo Cajamar published a press release with the results
 of the economic impact report of the financial institution, developed by the Ivie.
- On June 6, the second U-Ranking 2023 press release was issued to publicize the overall performance results of Spanish universities.
- On June 12, a press release highlights the evolution of NGEU funds in companies in the Valencian Region and the rest of the regions. An analysis included in the IvieLAB project and developed by Ivie's Research Deputy Director, Joaquín Maudos, together with the Institute's economists, Silvia Mollá and Juan Pérez.
- On June 13, the Fundación LAB Mediterráneo, a project promoted by the Valencian Association of Entrepreneurs (AVE), presented the report *La tecnología como motor de crecimiento* in Alicante, included in the research program it is developing together with the Ivie and whose objective is to promote the knowledge economy in the Valencian Region. The event was attended by the authors of the study: Matilde Mas, Javier Quesada and Consuelo Mínguez.
- On June 22, Joaquín Maudos was in charge of presenting the 2022 Report of the Observatory on the Spanish agri-food sector in the European context, prepared for the Cajamar Cooperative Group.

- On June 30, the Ministry of Inclusion visited the Ivie and subsequently announced, through a press release, the collaboration agreement for the preparation of a report on the return on social investment in human capital. Milagros Paniagua, Secretary General for Social Inclusion and Social Welfare Objectives and Policies, traveled to Valencia to hold a meeting with the Ivie team in charge of this project, led by Francisco Pérez and Matilde Mas.
- On July 4, a new GECE Observatory meeting was held, which on this occasion served to present the Analysis 1/2023, which focuses its analysis on the international profile of companies in the Valencian Region and the rest of Spain between 2019 and 2021. Alejandro Escribá, coordinator of the Observatory, was in charge of presenting the report, in an event organized by CaixaBank at its headquarters in Valencia.
- The financial institution Eurocaja Rural disseminated the results of their Economic Impact report in 2022, carried out by the Ivie, on July 18.
- On September 12, the Valencian Association of Entrepreneurs (AVE) presented the 1st Barometer of the Valuation of Entrepreneurship, with the results of a survey of 2,500 people from all over Spain to find out the public's perception of entrepreneurs. The event included the participation of Ivie's Research Deputy Director, Joaquín Maudos, who showed some of the main data confirming the important contribution of companies to Spanish society.
- On September 13, the COTEC Foundation presented in Malaga the report The Digital Economy in Spain, developed by the Ivie to quantify the value of the economy that relies on digitalization. Two of the authors of the document, researcher Juan Fernández de Guevara and technician Eva Benages, traveled to Malaga to explain the main conclusions of their work.
- Eight days later, on September 21, the COTEC Foundation, this time through a press release, also made public the results of another Ivie study *Fondos Next Generation European Union destinados a actuaciones de I+D+I y digitalización (Monitor NextGEN)*
- On October 11, the BBVA Foundation and the Ivie released a press release with a new monograph and database that quantifies the value of natural capital in Spain and its regions. To estimate the stock of natural capital, the study, prepared by Ivie researchers Ernest Reig and Ezequiel Uriel, Ivie technicians Eva Benages and Juan Carlos Robledo, and the head of the Studies and Statistics Service of the Department of Agriculture of the Generalitat Valenciana, José Antonio Franco, values available natural resources according to the income they generate annually or according to their market prices when these are established.
- On October 18, a press release was issued to announce that a new edition of the Fundació Ernest Lluch and Ivie dialogues was going to be organized. The five dialogues scheduled in 2023 have analyzed the socioeconomic challenges of demographic changes in Spain and globally. The dialogues were held between October 19 and November 21.
- The third session of the 5th Valencian Economic Congress was held on October 27, following the two sessions organized in 2022. This third meeting took place in Castellón at the Universitat Jaume I, at which the report *La evolución de la economía valenciana desde la COVID-19* was presented.

10.2. Brief dissemination documents

10.2.1. Esenciales

Esenciales [Essentials] is a series of periodicals designed to disseminate the main results of the Research Program carried out by the BBVA Foundation and the Ivie for over the last twenty years.

Brief, accessible and updated with the latest data available, these periodicals examine the issues dealt with in the main areas of research conducted by the BBVA Foundation and the Ivie: Growth and Competitiveness; Human Capital and Knowledge; the Productive Structure; Welfare and Social Capital, and Regional Development and Demographics.

In 2023, 9 documents were published:

- N.º 01/2023. El 20,7% de las personas con estudios básicos cuyo empleo les permitiría teletrabajar tiene problemas para hacerlo porque su domicilio no está adecuado, el doble que quienes cuentan con titulación superior (9,4%)
- N.º 02/2023. El consumo individual se recupera de la caída sufrida por la COVID-19 al crecer un 3,5% en 2021, pero sigue siendo un 25% inferior al de 2007
- N.º 03/2023. El bienestar material de los españoles cayó menos que el PIB durante la gran recesión y la pandemia, gracias al importante valor del trabajo doméstico y el tiempo de ocio
- N.º 04/2023. El capital humano es el principal factor productivo de España, pero su valor per cápita ha caído un 19,1% desde principios de siglo
- N.º 05/2023. El empleo en los medios de comunicación ha caído un 11% en los últimos 15 años, pese a la recuperación experimentada tras el COVID-19
- N.º 06/2023. La inversión pública sigue en 2022 un 55% por debajo del máximo de 2009 pese al impulso de los fondos NGEU
- N.º 07/2023. El envejecimiento de la población elevará la tasa de dependencia demográfica hasta el 53,7% en 2050 y harían falta más de 6 millones de afiliados adicionales para lograr el déficit cero en el sistema de pensiones contributivas
- N.º 08/2023. El 30% de las personas en paro soporta el 90% del coste social del desempleo medido como la pérdida de bienestar que genera la falta de trabajo en el conjunto de la población
- N.º 09/2023. El valor del capital humano que pierde España por el efecto de la emigración supera los 150.000 millones de euros en 2022, un 40% más que antes de la COVID-19

10.2.2. GECE Analysis

The Corporate Governance, Strategy and Competitiveness Observatory (GECE Observatory) is a project launched by Bankia and the **lvie** in 2017 with the goal of analyzing the competitiveness of Valencian firms over time and its relationship with internal competitiveness drivers.

Following Bankia's merge with CaixaBank, the commitment to the GECE Observatory has been extended, therefore, continuing during 2023 the work of analyzing the competitiveness of Valencian and Spanish companies. Specifically, the following two brief documents that focus on the effects of covid-19:

- Análisis 01/2023. Cambios en el posicionamiento internacional de las empresas valencianas durante y tras el COVID-19.
- Análisis 02/2023. Evolución de los niveles de competitividad en las empresas de la Comunitat Valenciana (2014-2021). La presentación del documento se hizo en enero de 2024.

10.2.3. Monthly price evolution reports on the Valencian Community

The database of the Price-Monitoring Observatory of the Valencian, promoted by the Valencian Regional Government in which the **Ivie** collaborates, includes a series of monthly reports that offer a quantitative and qualitative analysis of the evolution of prices in the Valencian Community.

From January to December 2023, 11⁴ monthly reports were published.

10.2.4. GVANEXT monthly periodical

Ivie collaborates with AFI in the development of the GVANEXT periodical, which will contain useful information on the Next Generation European Funds (NGEF) in the Valencian Region. In 2023, ten issues were published.

10.2.5. Valencia Monitor, in El Confidencial

The **Ivie**, through its Foundation, was granted the initiative of the Agència Valenciana de la Innovació (AVI), *Acciones complementarias de impulso y fortalecimiento de la innovación*, which was presented with the title *Visiones de la Innovación*, along with El Confidencial and in collaboration with the Faculty of Economics of the Universitat de València. The digital newspaper serves as a platform to disseminate opinion articles developed by the **Ivie** through the new section it has created on its website, Valencia Monitor. In 2023, a total of 24 articles were published between January and December.

10.3. Websites⁵

The **Ivie** website has continued to increase its content during 2023, as it contains information on all the news related to the publication and dissemination of Ivie's research work and activities. This year, the content generated by the model of hybrid activities has been maintained, i.e., combining online and in-person events, such as the Dialogues of the Ernest Lluch Foundation and the Ivie, the celebration of the third session of the 5th Valencian Economic Congress, which took place in Castelló de la Plana.

Regarding the rest of the structure of the website, the "Research" tab shows the publications: books, reports, notebooks, research articles or working papers, both those developed directly at the Institute and those generated by researchers who are part of the Ivie team. This section includes the series of informative documents Esenciales, produced for the BBVA Foundation; the Boletín de precios de la Comunitat Valenciana, for the Generalitat Valenciana; Papeles de Financiación Autonómica; the series Foco AVE, created in collaboration with the Asociación Valenciana de Empresarios (AVE); and Claves GECE, the informative documents from the Observatorio sobre Gobierno, Estrategia y Competitividad de las Empresas (Observatorio GECE) or the documents COVID-19: IvieExpress, created in 2020.

The third section of the web menu contains information and links to access the 32 databases created by the Ivie and available for consultation. Two new databases were created in 2023: El stock de capital natural en España (1995-2018) and Observatorio de la productividad y la competitividad en España (OPCE), based on studies carried out for the BBVA Foundation. In addition, the PREDICT database, on the ICT sector and its R&D, was expanded to give rise to Digital Economy (Twin Transition Dataset), which includes indicators of digital transformation, as well as environmental protection and resource management activities not only for the ICT and related sectors, but also for all industries in the economy. In total the databases available on the Institute's website are organized into 8 research areas: Growth and capitalization, Human capital and human development, Socioeconomic regional differences, Knowledge economy, Globalization, International, Public sector and Universities.

The "News" section, in "News & Events", includes 93 news items on information regarding new developments, publications, recognitions and activities carried out by the **Ivie**. Included in the section "Opinion Articles", are the links to 56 op-ed articles written by **Ivie** members in the national and regional media. These opinion articles also include the 24 published in the Valencia Monitor section of *El Confidencial*.

The **Ivie** website reached **72,343** visits. Of these, 67,72% are users living in Spain, while the remaining 32,28% were from 139 countries, including Mexico, United States, Peru and Colombia. It is worth noting that the percentage of visitors to the website from outside Spain is almost equal to that of local visitors.

The **Ivie** also manages and maintains the following websites: U-Ranking, www.u-ranking.es, and SIUVP (Valencian Public University System of Information) at www.siuvp.es, which offers a complete information system with more than 60 indicators for the five Valencian public universities. The **Ivie** has also collaborated in updating the GECE Observatory and the Network for Good Practices in Evaluation (REDEV) websites.

10.4. Circulation in press and online⁶

The **Ivie** maintains a regular presence in the media, as a result of the attention given to publicizing its work. This year, there have been 4,603 news items in the press on the research conducted at the Institute. This represents an increase of 50% over the previous year. This increase is due to the greater dissemination of studies produced by the Ivie, especially due to the continuation of the program to disseminate the work carried out for the BBVA Foundation.

The number of articles published in the media by **Ivie** Researchers and Technicians has increased. While in 2021 and 2022, 48 and 45 articles were published, respectively, in 2023, up to 56 articles were published. The agreement with El Confidencial for the dissemination of the op-eds on innovation in the Valencia Monitor has influenced this increase.

In 2023, the **Ivie** responded to 188 requests from the media, which rely on the Institute and its researchers and economists as a source of information to confirm or supplement their news stories for print, radio, television or digital media. This figure, which signifies a request every two days, shows the journalists' continuous trust in the data, reflections and opinions provided by the **Ivie**.

The research concluded in 2023 and its activities undertaken were publicized through 39 press releases, 2 *GECE Observatory Analysis* documents and 11 *Monthly price evolution reports on the Valencian Community.* In addition, during 2023, 193 activities and news events by the **Ivie** Researchers were reported in the agenda and news section of the Institute's website, including the publication of articles by researchers and technicians in scientific journals, and the presentation of papers at different congresses.

Among the topics that have had the most impact in the media in 2023, U-Ranking once again stood out with 943 news items, which was divided between the impact of the annual report and Análisis de la inserción laboral de los titulados universitarios (Analysis of the labor market insertion of university graduates). From the Esenciales series, resumed in 2023, 451 news items have been published, and from the rest of the studies carried out in collaboration with the BBVA Foundation, more than 139 news items in the media have been added.

In addition, the number of media reports on **Ivie** studies for Cajamar Group stood out with a total of 254. In 2023, two reports were presented by the **Ivie** for Cajamar: the Observatory of the agrifood sector in the Spanish regions and Observatory of the Spanish agrifood sector in the European context.

However, the two reports that have had the greatest impact in the media were the *Impacto* económico-social de Eurocaja Rural en 2022 with 162 news items and Evaluación de la ejecución de

los Fondos Next Generation European Union (NGEU) en la Comunitat Valenciana, carried out for Generalitat Valenciana with 123 references in the media.


The reports prepared for the Observatory of Financial Inclusion in Spain, by AEB, CECA and UNACC, totaled 279 news items.

Meanwhile, news related to the collaboration between the **Ivie** and the Generalitat Valenciana, both in regional funding and through the various IvieLAB reports, reached 671 press clippings. Other reports on economic impact are: the Report on programming instruments and multi-year funding of universities for the CRUE (with 112 news items) or the Impact of the Trinidad Alfonso 2022 Marathon (102 references). Also noteworthy is the media impact of the different studies carried out for the COTEC Foundation for Innovation, which account for 156 news items.

Forty-seven percent of the information disseminated about the Ivie in 2023 was published in the regional press (Valencia Region and other autonomous regions); 9.8% in the national press, 9.5% each in the digital and economic press, 5% on Internet portals, as well as on radio and television, 3% in the international media and 2.9% in news agencies. The remaining 8.3% is made up of news appearing on university internet portals, specialized press, press and portals specialized in agrifood, websites of institutions and associations, sports press, forums and blogs, and other public administrations.

The newspaper *La Vanguardia*, with 180 entries, is the one that published most news items in which the **Ivie** is mentioned, followed by *Levante*, with 153 reports, and *Valencia Plaza* which mentioned the **Ivie** on 88 occasions. The rest of the fifteen media outlets that mentioned the **Ivie** were the digital newspaper Alicante *Información* (85), *Europa Press* (84), *Las Provincias* (83), *El País* (77), *El Mundo* (61), *Cinco Días* (60), *Cadena Ser* and *El Periódico de España* (with 50 each), *El Confidencial* (con 46), *El Economista* (45) y, finally, *El Español* and ABC, with 44 news ítems.

Social networks have also served as a platform to publicize **lvie**'s activity. With almost 900 published tweets, the Institute's Twitter profile has over 4,200 followers, increasing 2,5% in 2023. The U-Ranking Twitter account increased its followers by 2%. As for the most recently created profiles, the GECE Observatory, which is managed through the Chair of Family Business, has 150 followers, while REDEV, which the **lvie** periodically monitors together with the other entities in the alliance, has over 350 followers


The Ivie's YouTube channel received 17,979 views in 2023, a figure similar to that recorded the previous year. The activities broadcast live through the YouTube channel have been consolidated as a continuity option. This practice, initiated in 2020 as a reaction to the pandemic, has been maintained this year with the broadcasting of face-to-face activities such as the Dialogues of the Ernest Lluch Foundation, the V Valencian Economy Congress, the IvieLAB conference on debt, the XI Banking Conference or the session on Public Policy Evaluation and the improvement in the efficiency of the Administration, organized together with the Ministry of Finance. In addition, new videos from the Ivie Interviews series were also broadcast, as well as four videos from the Valencia

Monitor project, an Ivie initiative in collaboration with the AVI (Valencian Innovation Agency) and the newspaper El Confidencial.

Regarding the presentations shared on Slide Share were viewed 13,613 times over the course of 2023. Ivie's profile on the LinkedIn professional networking service, which is intended to strengthen relations with the academic and research world, continues increasing, with a total of 2,051 as of 31 December 2023, an increase of 26% over the last year.


The **lvie** Newsletter, each issue of which includes the Institute's main news, the latest research, researchers' opinion articles and the events calendar, continued to be issued at monthly intervals. During 2023 this monthly digital newsletter was emailed to **lvie**'s 3,246 contacts, with more than 150 new subscribers.
